member of many educational and social, cultural institutions of Madhya Pradesh. This information was given by Ashish Rajoria, the elder son of



Immigration and Foreigners Bill introduced in Lok Sabha, Opposition seeks select panel scrutiny

Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, despite the Opposition raising objections to

its intent and seeking its review by sending it to a Parliamentary select committee.

Congress MP Manish Tewari objected to the introduction of the Bill adhering to constitutional provisions. He pointed out that the Bill fails to provide an appeal mechanism against decisions taken by immigration

The Chandigarh MP held these to be violating the "fundamental cannon of justice and jurisprudence"

Further, he placed his concerns about the government barring movement of people with views in variance of the dispensation. The Congress leader emphasised the Bill must adhere to constitutional provisions. Tewari suggested that the Bill be sent to a Parliamentary select

Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, rose 0.01 per cent to \$69.29 per barrel in futures trade.

In the domestic equity market, the 30-share BSE Sensex was trading 424.36 points, or 0.57 per cent, lower at 73,690.81 points, while the Nifty was down 117.90 points, or 0.52 per cent, at 22,342.40 points.

SEBI tightens rules for SME IPO

According to this, the operating profit of the companies bringing the issue should be around Rs 1 crore in two out of the last three financial years. Also, promoters cannot sell more than 20 percent stake under the offer for sale. SEBI said in the circular that the minimum application size for SME IPO has been increased to two lots. Selling shareholders will not be allowed to sell more than 50 percent of their existing stake. The purpose of tightening the rules is to give an opportunity to SMEs with good track record to raise funds while protecting

Sensex sinks 380 points in early trade as Wall Street bleeds, global markets spiral



New Delhi (Agency): The Indian stock markets opened lower Tuesday morning, reflecting a broad sell-off across Asian markets after Wall Street tumbled overnight over fears that US President Donald Trump's tariffs threat could push the United States into recession.

The 30-share BSE Sensex plunged 346.23 points or 0.47 per cent to 73,768.94 in the morning trade. The Nifty of NSE declined 124.80 points or 0.56 per cent to 22,335.50. Earlier, the US benchmark indices fell sharply Monday following Trump's statements that the economy is in a "period of transition" amid escalating trade tensions.

From the 30 Sensex companies, IndusInd, Infosys, Mahindra & Mahindra, Zomato, Bajaj Finserv, UltraTech Cement, Tech Mahindra, Adani Ports, Tata Steel, Kotak Mahindra Bank and HDFC Bank were among the major laggards. Sun Pharmaceuticals, ICICI Bank, Nestle India, Bharti Airtel, NTPC and Titan were the gainers.

The GIFT Nifty futures were trading at 22,430.5 as of 07:53 a.m. IST, indicating that the blue-chip Nifty 50 will likely open below Monday's close of 22,460.3. In Monday's morning trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 324.67 points or 0.44 per cent to 74,657.25.

Investors' concerns about global economic instability shot up after Trump refused to predict whether the US could face a recession amid worries over his tariff policies. In the US market, technology stocks were hit hardest with the Nasdaq Composite suffering its worst day since 2022, tumbling 4%. Tesla shares plummeted 15.4%, while AI chip giant Nvidia lost over 5%.

Asian markets were on a downward spiral on Monday, with Japan's Nikkei 225 sliding 2.7% and MSCI Asia ex-Japan falling 1.6%. Foreign portfolio investors (FPI) sold Indian shares worth 4.85 billion rupees (\$55.5 million), taking the total outflows to about \$28 billion since September-end when markets traded at their peaks.

Nifty 50 is trading about 14.5% below the all-time high hit in September 2024, hurt by slowing earnings growth, US tariff uncertainty and relentless foreign selling.

On March 5, Indian markets defied expectations by rebounding strongly despite Trump's announcement of reciprocal tariffs on India. The Sensex and Nifty jumped over one per cent to 73,730.23 and 22,337.30 respectively. This was considered to be a surprising move given the 16 per cent decline over the last five months.

An American recession: Donald Trump's tariffs have rekindled possibilities of a US economic downturn

New Delhi (Agency): Shares on Wall Street slumped on Monday to record one of the worst trading days since 2022, driven by concerns about the impact of President Donald Trump's trade policies on the US economy. Investors are now worried that a trade war could push the world's biggest economy into a possible recession, with Trump appearing not to rule out that possibility. Speaking to Fox News on Sunday, Trump parried a question on whether the US is headed into recession with an uncharacteristically ambivalent response: "I hate to predict things like that. There is a period of transition, because what we're doing is very big. We're bringing wealth back to America, that's a big thing. And there are always periods (where) it takes a little time." This came days after Trump said his measures could lead to some pain in the "short term". This seems to be a markedly different outlook from Trump

in his first term, where he was much more responsive to market patterns. Incidentally, in Monday's selloff, while the tech-heavy NASDAQ was down over 4 cent, Elon Muskpromoted Tesla was one of the stocks that fell the most, down more than 10 per cent and sharply lower than its peak back in December.

There are three issues that analysts are pointing to amid the renewed "recession" talk. One, that Wall Street is perhaps now overreacting to the fact that it did not really believe Trump would follow through on this threat of tariffs that he made throughout his election campaign. So, when last week, the tariffs came into effect on Canada, Mexico and China, and more tariffs are likely on steel and aluminum products, the stock markets are perhaps responding to the fact that Trump is now walking his talk. There is also the broader uncertainty that

this rapid back-and-forth on

tariffs by his administration has triggered

Secondly, bond yields - or the return a bond investor expects to receive each year over its term to maturity – are perhaps a better indicator of whether a recession is in the making. The American 10-year bond yield eased by 11 basis points Monday as demand for safehaven assets increased after Trump declined to rule out a recession as a result of his tariff policies. When bond yields are going down, it means that the return an investor can expect from holding a bond is decreasing, which is typically caused by the price of the bond rising in the market (yields and prices of bonds have an inverse relationship). Lower yields potentially indicates a shift towards a more risk-averse sentiment among investors, associated

Comments from businesses across the country focus on the uncertainty surrounding tariffs and the potential negative impact on orders, adding to the pessimism. But Trump has, so far, shown that his administration is willing to tolerate this to achieve his broader ambitions, including rebalancing trade, his plans for deregulation, including promised tax cuts later in the year. And while Trump appears to be equivocal on the commerce secretary Howard Lutnick, and the main cheerleader of reciprocal tariffs within the new administration, was a lot less ambivalent at a press briefing. "There's going to be no recession in America. What there's going to be is global tariffs are going to come down because President Trump has said, you want to charge us 100 per cent, we're going to charge you 100 per cent! You know what they say? They say, No, no... don't charge us 100 per cent, we'll bring ours down... We'll unleash America out to the world, grow our economy in a way we've never grown before. You are going to see, over the next two years, the greatest set of growth coming from America... I would never bet on recession. No chance." Lutnick's bluster aside, there

is a reason why the high tariff threats by the US are not likely to sustain. The structural issues with the

American economy is one key reason. The US economy relies heavily on trade, and that's part of its structural construct in the post-World War-II era. This is because the American economy consumes more goods than it produces domestically at full employment. As a result, its imports are almost always higher than its exports, resulting in a trade deficit. This trade deficit is a point of contention for Trump, which he's used as the trigger for the imposition of tariffs on countries around the world. But what this simplistic assumption glosses over is the fact that till the time America consumes more than it produces, it will have a deficit with a lot of countries. This is also triggered by the fact that the labour costs in America are high, and so it does not merit economic logic for US workers to be producing this efficiently in the country, like say garments or low-end consumer goods.

Market Reckoning

The Indian middle class has witnessed a financial revolution in recent years. Encouraged by a booming stock market low-cost digital platforms, and aggressive financial influencers millions of households have moved their savings from traditional bank deposits to equities. But the recent stock market downturn ~ wiping out nearly a trillion dollars in investor value ~ has exposed the risks of this shift. For many first-time investors, the dream of high returns has turned into an uneasy reality of losses and uncertainty. This market correction is not just a temporary dip; it reflects deeper structural issues. Foreign investors have pulled back, valuations have been stretched, and corporate earnings have been weaker than expected. The shifting global economic climate ~ marked by geopolitical instabil-



ity, shifting trade policies, and capital outflows ~ has only compounded the problem. Unlike previous market crashes that had clear recovery paths, today's uncertainty makes the middleclass investor particularly vulnerable. At the heart of the

crisis is a fundamental misunderstanding of risk. India's middle class has historically relied on conserva - tive savings methods ~ fixed deposits, provident funds, and gold. The rapid adoption of stock market investments, driven by the rise of Systematic Investment Plans (SIPs) and social media influencers, has exposed many investors to volatility without adequate knowledge of how markets function. For years, stocks delivered strong returns, reinforcing the belief that equities were a guaranteed path to wealth.

But markets do not move in a straight line. Many new investors, lured by the excitement of financial influencers and WhatsApp stock tips, entered the market without fully understanding the risks involved. Some even borrowed money to invest, chasing short-term gains. Now, as stocks decline, they face painful choices ~ either exit at a loss or wait in hope of recovery that may take years. For those who have staked their retirement savings or their children's education funds on the market, this downturn has been a rude shock. India's economic challenges have further aggravated the impact of this correction. Middle-class incomes have been under pressure due to slow wage growth and rising inflation. White-collar job opportunities are not expanding fast enough and private investment remains sluggish. In such a scenario, stock market losses are harder to absorb. Unlike wealthier investors who can ride out the volatility, the middle class does not have a financial cushion. This crisis should serve as a lesson in financial literacy. Stock markets are not a shortcut to riches; they require longterm discipline and risk management. Investors must understand that equity investments should only involve surplus funds that are not needed in the short term. Regulatory bodies must step up efforts to curb reckless financial advice on digital platforms that promote high-risk investments to inexperienced investors. Despite the turmoil, there is hope. Market cycles are natural and corrections eventually give way to recoveries. But for India's middle-class investors, this moment should prompt a more cautious and informed approach to wealth-building. The focus must shift from speculation to security.



(They are illiterate village women who understand nothing) This condescending approach turns capacity building efforts into mere tokenism and a major roadblock to real empowerment. At the same time, regions where women leaders have thrived have seen proactive support from family members and local officials. I recall our block-level development officer ensuring that male relatives stepped out of meetings so that elected women could speak for themselves. This simple but crucial intervention gave women the confidence to engage in governance. What is needed is capacity building through high-quality training programmes like the one I

Tariff Chaos

The recent back-and-forth on tariffs imposed by the US on Canadian and Mexican goods underscores the unpredictability of President Donald Trump's trade policies. Within days of enforcing sweeping duties, the administration has rolled back significant | brought power back into the portions, offering targeted exemptions. While this move provides temporary relief for businesses struggling with supply chain disruptions, the strategy remains chaotic, raising concerns about longterm economic stability. At the heart of the issue is Mr Trump's belief that tariffs serve as a tool to protect American industries and bolster domestic manufacturing. However, history has shown that

protectionist policies rarely produce intended results. Instead of revitalising local production, tariffs often lead to higher costs for businesses and consumers alike. With complex supply chains crisscrossing North America, duties on raw materials and finished goods inevitably raise prices, making American industries less competitive rather than more resilient. The exemptions granted under the US-Mexico-



Canada Agreement (USMCA) reflect an implicit acknowledgment of this economic reality. Critical imports such as automobiles, agricultural products, and potash have been spared from the harshest tariff measures, likely in response to lobbying from industry leaders. Yet, this selective approach does little to dispel the uncertainty surrounding US trade policy. If businesses cannot predict whether tariffs will be imposed or lifted at a moment's notice, planning for the future becomes nearly impossible. Canada and Mexico have responded differently to Mr Trump's maneuvering. Canadian leaders have signaled frustration, with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau warning of a prolonged trade conflict.

Mexico, under President Sheinbaum, has taken a more diplomatic stance, opting to engage in negotiations while addressing shared security concerns. These contrasting approaches reveal how Mr Trump's tariff policies are reshaping diplomatic relations in North America. While the US retains economic leverage, its erratic decision-making weakens trust and could push its neighbours to seek alternative trade alliances. The economic consequences of these policies are already visible. Trade volumes between the three nations remain high, but businesses are adjusting their strategies to minimise exposure to sudden tariff hikes. Some firms are accelerating import shipments ahead of anticipated restrictions, while others are exploring ways to claim duty-free exemptions under USMCA. In the long run, these disruptions could incentivise companies to diversify supply chains away from the US, reducing American economic influence rather than strengthening it. Beyond North America, Mr Trump's tariff strategy signals a broader return to economic nationalism. His administration has hinted at expanding trade barriers beyond Canada and Mexico, with promises of "reciprocal" duties on other nations. If this pattern continues, it risks triggering wider retaliatory measures, ultimately harming the very industries tariffs are meant to protect. In the short term, businesses may welcome the recent exemptions as a reprieve from economic turmoil. However, the fundamental problem remains ~ trade policy driven by political calculation rather than economic logic creates instability. As the US moves ahead with its agenda, it must recognise global economic leadership is built on trust and consistency.

Some tech mega brands that dominate the market coast comfortably every quarter more on the class consciousness of their loyal users rather than genuine upgrades of their products over time. Even revolutionary technology like the large language models of AI was deeply influenced by mar-

A small cartel controlled the research which was as expensive as it was exclusive. It took a small start-up from China to shake things up. By providing a version that was a fraction of the cost and freely available to everyone, they totally changed the narrative. Capitalism justifies its own ideas and actions, while blaming others: The key ingredient to a fruitful business idea, as many executives will say, is 'solving a common problem.'

Capitalism some times can create a problem, partially solve it to feign progress, and generate a new problem along the way. We notice how big firms in developed nations outsource production to third world countries. of regular, hard-working people. availing cheap labour rates and thus increasing their profits. They are welcomed by the officialdom in these countries on the premise that jobs are being created locally. However, these jobs are

quite basic and often exploitative (underage workers, unsatisfactory working conditions etc.). Ironically, these profit hungry megaliths are not accused of taking away valuable jobs from their own country by outsourcing. Rather, the spotlight falls on foreign immigrants to their country ~ these are blamed for usurping local jobs. In fact, much of the employment taken up by these immigrants is that which local people shy away from doing. The lenses and metrics capitalism chooses to view overall economic progress ignores imp - ortant nuances

One would think, rationally, that the indicator of a strong economy is the ability of the common man to sustain himself financially. When we look at India's economic prosperity through the lens of GDP growth. it is easy to think that we are doing extremely well ~ due to the huge turnover of corporate powerhouses. However, this measuring tool masks the pitiable living circumstances for the myriad poor and thus is not very reliable. Capitalism has somehow normalised the discrepancy between senior managers of companies on business trips being put up at five-star hotels after journeying by business class and masons and bricklayers not getting even a decent dormitory to sleep in when they cross state boundaries to work. The narratives spawned by the big fish

portray themselves in glowing

terms while being a little derogatory about the smaller players.

Robust small size enterprises are pejoratively termed 'mom and pop' shops. On the other hand, big conglomerates confer on themselves epithets like 'unilabelled 'King Kong' enterprises (that destroy others in their path) for example. Likewise,



NGOs sourcing funds (to help others) are dismissively deemed to be 'begging' for funds yet regular business companies pitching for funds (for their personal growth and profits) are painted as brave warriors who tamed the 'sharks.' Capitalism weaves itself into processes and subverts healthy trends: Capitalism is slowly seeping into various professional ecosystems and modifying them in ways that could be unsuitable. Take the world of medicine for example

Rather than concentrating mainly on professional excellence and service with a smile, corporate hospitals are increasingly focusing on going deluxe. The outcome of hospitals simulating destination res or – ts comes at the cost of raised tariffs, out of the reach of many. The content of medical literature is also changing, with the incorporation of heavy amounts of (to my mind) unnecessary economic data. below corporate targets. Clearly, capitalism has managed to trick us into believing that a rich slave is somehow freer than a poor one. Gullible executives grossly neglect their personal life and family chasing higher packages and designations in the corporate world. This often does not end well; the executives discover they are professionally dispensable when the company happens to downsize and the people who they have neglected at home for years are not exactly waiting for them with open arms. Capitalism persuades you that you must keep putting the details of your life out there on social media, to build your personal brand. The bigger the 'in fluencer' you become, the more wealth you could

Slowly and surely, rather than products, it is humans who have become the advertisement. We have been persuaded to change our perspective from 'I think, therefore I am' (cogito ergo sum) ~ to 'I influence therefore I am.' Focus on money/profits contributes to severe lapses of judgement: Recent news carried stories of immigrants from third world countries deported back from the US. Amongst these were fellow Indians who sold valuable land, gave staggering sums of money to unscrupulous agents, got into debt, risked getting arrested or killed ~ all in the belief that it would improve their monetary prospects in the future in the US. Such is the illusion of success created by capitalism that it makes people leave the priceless comfort of home, family, and friends, and take a difficult

gamble on making it big in a foreign land ~ likely after years of more sacrifice and struggle.

What is not clearly thought in some form or another, while simultaneously being on more predictable and familiar territory along with the benefit of familial support. It is a similar desperation for profit that has often brought out the inhumane side of supervisors in charge of factory or agricultural workers. In Beed, Maharashtra, for example, you may have read of the harrowing tales of women workers forced by their contractors to undergo hysterectomies (often in unhygienic, unsafe conditions) just so that they do not have to take a day or two off from work during their periods. Rather than promote true merit as envisioned, capitalism has instead somehow spawned an environment where the act of generating profits (by hook or by crook) is itself deemed excellence. There seems to be no end goal

with capitalism. Considering the failings of capitalism, it is important to question some of its entrenched narratives. At an individual level, we can surely try and lead our lives on a much broader scale than that envisioned through the narrow pecuniary confines of Capitalism. As far as governments are concerned, they must put humans before banknotes. Much like the land ceilings which got rid of the Zamindari system, regulatory adjustments can put healthy limits on mega capitalism (e.g. no single entity can own more than 10 per cent market share) to encourage other players and strictly monitor monopolies and restrictive trade practices. Not getting unduly influenced by the profit-oriented outlook of capitalism is what will truly enrich mankind.

Gabbard to visit India, likely to address Raisina dialogue on March 18

New Delhi (Agency): US Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard on Tuesday said she will visit India as part of a multi-nation trip to the Indo-Pacific, in furtherance of US President Donald Trump's objectives of peace and freedom. This will be Gabbard's first India visit since her US Senate confirmation as the Director of National Intelligence. When Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited the US in February, Gabbard was the first high-level Trump administration official to call on the Prime Minister at Blair House on February 12.

In India, Gabbard will address the Raisina dialogue on March 18, where she has been invited by Prime Minister Modi, The New York Times said today. Trust managing Mumbai's Lilavati Hospital says Rs 1,500 crore misappropriated by ex-trustees

It claims black magic was performed on the hospital premises by erstwhile trustees and related individuals

Mumbai (Agency): The haritable trust that runs Mumbai's well-known Lilavati Hospital on Tuesday alleged that funds of over Rs 1,500 crore were misappropriated by its former trustees and other related individuals. The Lilavati Kirtilal Mehta Medical Trust (LKMMT) has lodged separate complaints with the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and at the Bandra police station. It has also claimed that black magic was performed on the hospital premises by erstwhile trustees and related individuals. The complaints allege the misappropriation, uncovered during a forensic audit of Lilavati Hospital's financial records, has impacted the trust's operations and health care services provided by the leading

private medical facility located in upscale Bandra area. "We filed complaints which translated into FIRs due to the orders of the Bandra Magistrate Court. Three FIRs have been filed against the former trustees and other related individuals. A fourth proceeding against these individuals is now pending before the magistrate, which is based on our complaint filed in the Bandra police station for black magic and occult practices," LKMMT Permanent Resident Trustee Prashant Mehta told reporters.

The Bandra Magistrate Court has ordered an inquiry against these very individuals, he added. "We are committed to upholding the integrity of the Lilavati Kirtilal Mehta Medical Trust and ensuring that funds

are used solely for the benefit of patients who rely on us daily.

"The gross misconduct and



covered during forensic audit is not just a betrayal of the trust placed in the alleged and fraudulent former trustees, but a direct threat to the very mission of our hospital," Mehta maintained.

He said LKMMT will ensure

these illegal activities is held accountable.

"We request the Enforcement Directorate to take swift

> and decisive action investigating financial crimes under the provisions of the PMLA (Prevention Money Laundering Act)," he stated.

Parliamentary panel seeks action to boost women's representation in CAPFs

Chandigarh (Agency): Almost a decade after the central government reserved up to 33 per cent vacancies in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) A maximum of Rs. 5 lakh is for women, the representation of women personnel in these forces remain way below target, prompting a key parliamentary panel to urge the government for taking remedial steps. As of January 2025, women personnel comprised just 4.48 per cent of the posted strength in the six CAPFs that function under the administrative control of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). In January 2016, the government had implemented a policy reserving 33 per cent of constable positions in the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and Central Industrial Security Force (CISF),

and 14 to 15 percent in Border Security Force (BSF), Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), and Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP), specifically for women.

"The committee notes that actual representation remains below target. Therefore, it recommends targeted recruitment drives for women, particularly in CRPF and CISF," Parliament's Standing Committee on Home Affairs said in its report tabled on March 10. The committee also emphasised uniform access to support facilities across all units and the importance of robust mechanisms to address workplace issues, including zero tolerance policy against sexual harassment. "To further improve women's progression, the committee recommends creating mentorship programmes and leadership development initiatives. It also suggests exploring flexible deployment options or soft postings during specific life stages to enhance retention," the report said, while noting the government's positive steps to enhance women's representation in CAPFs, including reservations and supportive initiatives like fee exemptions and

childcare facilities. The CAPFs comprise three border guarding forces - BSF, SSB and ITBP, and two non-border guarding forces - CRPF and CISF, besides the Assam Rifles, which functions under the operational control of the Army and has a dual role of internal security in the north-east and guarding the India-Myanmar border.

Sports ministry revokes Wrestling Federation of India suspension after 15 months

New Delhi (Agency): The Sports Ministry has revoked the suspension imposed on the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI), ending the months of uncertainty surrounding the sport and paving the way for resumption of activities, including selection trials for the upcoming Asian Championship in Amman.

The ministry had suspended the WFI on December 24, 2023 for lapses in governance and procedural integrity by the new body, which was elected on December 21. It had asked IOA to form an ad-hoc panel to run the affairs of the Federation.

The Sanjay Singh-led body had announced the conduct of Under-15 and Under-20 National Championships in Nandini Nagar, Gonda - the stronghold of former WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh - and the choice of venue irked the government since the former BJP MP was facing charges of sexual harass-

The ministry, in its order issued on Monday, said that the WFI has taken compliant measures, so in larger interest of the sport and athletes, the ministry has decided to lift the suspen-

There were complaints that the WFI was still operating from the residence of Brij Bhushan, prompting the ministry to form a verification committee, which performed a spot inspection and found that the Federation had shifted its office to East Vinod Nagar in New Delhi.

The ministry was satisfied it ended the suspension.

he dearth of superstars in the Hindi film industry in the current generation is evident to both audiences and filmmakers. In a recent interaction, prolific filmmaker Subhash Ghai spoke about this issue and explained how excessive analysis and the growing emphasis on the business aspect of filmmaking have brainwashed actors. He pointed out that instead of focusing on their craft, actors today are more concerned with making money, building their brand, and other financial factors. Speaking on the YouTube channel Game Changers, Ghai explained that in the past, all actors regardless of their star power—were addressed by their character's name on set. The filmmaker emphasized how important this was for performances. He shared, "We never used to call actors by their name on the set. We would call them by their character's name. We would call Anil Kapoor 'Lakhan' and Jackie Shroff 'Ram' on the sets of Ram Lakhan. We do this because when they shoot for the film for a year or 9 months, they get into that character, and the whole film's team knows them by their character's name. Characters are the most important thing in making a good story because they are telling the story."

Ghai also pointed out how today's actors are more focused on brand-building, which, in his opinion, is affecting their performances. "I am very particular about actors, and these days actors think of themselves as a brand. The actor would be surrounded by talent managers who would read the script. How will you understand how the character will look on the screen by reading the script? They should ask the actors to pick a scene and act and judge whether they can do it or not." He further stated that the presence of talent managers has worsened the situation. "The actors make their talent managers sit in these meetings, and it is because those talent managers will bring in money, deciding what all brands fit into that project.



Government files will not be lost, there will be no delay

Other municipal corporations of MP will be digital like **Indore**



Bhopal (Agency): Now there will be freedom from the manipulation of government contract files and important documents in the state's largest municipal corporation Indore. Actually, Indore Municipal Corporation has started the work of preserving all the files and important documents under it in digital format, this is the first time when all the files of Indore Municipal Corporation are being prepared in digital form. Like Indore, other municipal corporations of the state will also be digitalized. The big reason behind this is the disappearance of documents and files from the records of the Municipal Corporation. In the recent payment scam of about Rs 90 crore here, the original copy of 174 files is not available even with the Municipal Corporation. At present, Indore Police is investigating only the scam of Rs 31 crore recorded in 48 files. Actually, Indore is the first municipal corporation of Madhya Pradesh, which is working to digitize all its documents. These days, the main documents of all the departments of the Municipal Corporation are being called and prepared in digital format. Therefore, the Municipal Corporation administration has instructed all the departments to digitize the necessary

1 crore documents will be digitally recorded

Under the digitization of the Municipal Corporation, about one crore documents of the Municipal Corporation will be scanned and saved in digital format. This will not only protect the documents, but will also help people to get the documents easily. People will not have to visit the Municipal Corporation to get the documents. They will be able to get the documents with a single click without applying.

That is why digitization is happening

It is worth noting that there were allegations of fraud in the water works department in Indore Municipal Corporation. Here, five contract firms had got illegal payments through fake contracts. These contractors not only created fake files but also took payment of crores of rupees from the Municipal Corporation through fake signatures of officials in the fake file, the investigation of which is still going

The name of this stadium of Delhi will be changed

Delhi (Agency): Like UP, MP, Uttarakhand, Maharashtra, now the BJP government in Delhi has indicated to change the names of famous places, stadiums and other institutions. Delhi government minister and NDMC member Pravesh Verma has said that he will bring a proposal to change the name of Talkatora Stadium in the next meeting of the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC). This statement of BJP MLA and minister Pravesh Verma has come after taking oath as a member of the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) on Tuesday. During this, BJP MP Bansuri Swaraj and NDMC Vice-Chairman Kuljit Singh Chahal were present. Immediately after the swearing-in, Pravesh Verma attended the NDMC meeting. It is believed that he can propose to change the name of Talkatora Stadium in this meeting. He had also raised this issue during the Delhi Assembly elections and is now preparing to put it on the table of NDMC. Earlier, on the last day of the Delhi Assembly election campaign, while campaigning against AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal, he had promised the people of New Delhi to change the name of the stadium. BJP had fielded Pravesh Verma from the New Delhi seat. Pravesh Verma had told the people that if his party came to power, the Talkatora Stadium would be renamed after Maharishi Valmiki. Pravesh Verma had said that in the first meeting of NDMC after February 8, we will change the name of Talkatora Stadium to Lord Maharishi Valmiki Stadium. He had also said that every airport, stadium and major building should be named after a 'god or martyr' who sacrificed for the country. Talkatora Stadium is a major sports complex of Delhi. National and international level competitions are organized here. Pravesh Verma has been demanding to change the name of this stadium for a long time. He believes that it should be named after some historical or patriotic personality, so that the youth get inspiration. This is not the first case of changing the names of symbols coming under the jurisdiction of NDMC. Even before this, the names of many roads have been changed. These include Aurangzeb Road being renamed as Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Road, Dalhousie Road being renamed as Deendayal Upadhyay Marg and Ross Road being renamed as Rajendra Prasad Road.

Do these things before renting property to foreign nationals in Delhi

Delhi (Agency): Delhi Police has issued an important directive urging property owners, hotel operators and administrators to ensure compliance with legal procedures before renting property to foreign nationals. Some necessary rules have been made in this regard, non-compliance of which can lead to legal action. Delhi Police ADCP PRO Sanjay Tyagi said that property owners have to follow some rules. Such as informing FRRO- If a property owner rents his property to a foreign national, he has to inform the Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO). Preparing guest register- Property and hotel owners have to maintain a guest register, which contains complete information of the foreign national. This register should be available at all times for inspection by the police or registration officer. Giving information to local police- Before giving rent, the information of the foreign national has to be submitted to the concerned local police station, so that his background can be checked. Under Section 7 of the Foreigners (Amendment) Order, 2016 and the Foreigners Act, the property owner has to submit information online on the FRRO portal by filling Form 'C' within 24 hours. This includes nationality, contact number, purpose of visit, duration of stay, visa details. Apart from this, it will also be mandatory to prepare a guest register under Form-B. Delhi Police clarified that if any hotel owner, property owner or administrator does not follow these rules, strict legal action will be taken against him.

Delhi's new government brings new EV policy



Delhi (Agency): The Delhi government has recently released its new EV policy 2.0, which aims to make 95 percent of new vehicles electric by 2027. It has a provision to replace CNG autos, taxis and light commercial vehicles with EVs. The government will increase the charging infrastructure, provide subsidy on purchase and run skill development programs. It is believed that this policy can be implemented from April 1. Many big decisions are being taken since the formation of the Bharatiya Janata Party government in Delhi. The Delhi government recently released its new EV Policy 2.0. Its target is to make 95 percent of new vehicles electric by 2027. In the proposed Delhi EV Policy 2.0, all CNG auto-rickshaws, taxis and light commercial vehicles will be converted into EVs (electric vehicles) in a phased manner. This new policy of the Delhi government can come into effect from April 1. After its implementation, CNG vehicles will start being phased out. Transport Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh had recently held a review meeting regarding the new policy. In this meeting, the minister emphasized on increasing electric mobility in the city to the officials. Along with this, he also explained the entire policy outline. Under the new EV policy of the Delhi government, all CNG autorickshaws, taxis and light vehicles will be converted into electric vehicles (EVs) in a phased manner. It was told in the meeting that public transport should also be transferred to electric buses. Under the new policy, the government will help in purchasing electric two-wheelers, threewheelers, e-light commercial vehicles (e-LCV) and etrucks. It was told in the meeting that a State EV Fund will be created to encourage EV policy. Funds will be collected through green levy, pollution cess and aggregator license fees. The proposed subsidy was also discussed. It was said that with the increase in these vehicles, fuel vehicles will be reduced, which will reduce air pollution in the capital. The government will bring e-buses on the roads of Delhi on priority basis.
