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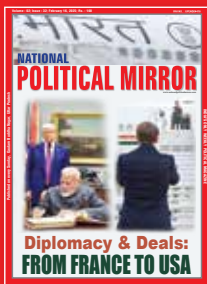
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A Father's Princess

I firmly believe that an increase in women's participation in politics generally leads to greater focus on women's issues. Women's involvement in politics is essential for achieving gender equality and authentic democracy. This promotes women's active participation in public decision-making and serves as a way to enhance accountability for women.

Political accountability to women

starts with boosting the representation of women in decision-making roles. I believe that recent decisions by top BJP leadership will certainly encourage more women to enter politics, a topic I will discuss in the next paragraph.

On the other hand, I am not sure what other journalists believe about daughters, girls, or women, but they are gods to me since they create life.

And I always support women through National Political Mirror,

having published numerous stories in prior editions.

So, in this edition, I am going to tell you about Rekha Gupta, a Daulat Ram College student who joined the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) in 1992 and went on to become the Delhi University Students' Union general secretary in 1995 and the body's president in 1996. She became the 9th Chief Minister of Delhi on February 20, 2025.



After the mega oath ceremony at Ramlila Ground in New Delhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Delhi Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena, and Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta gathered with the newly appointed Delhi Ministers for group picture.

Rekha Gupta, a BJP leader, became Delhi Chief Minister after the party returned to power in the national capital after 27 years, winning 48 seats in the 70-member House in the 2025 Delhi Assembly elections.

Interestingly, BJP leader Rekha Gupta lost the Shalimar Bagh constituency in 2015 and 2020 but lost to the AAP's Bandana Kumari in two wave elections in favour of Arvind Kejriwal's party. However, she did not back down and contested the 2025 Delhi assembly polls again, eventually defeating Kumari by more than 29,000 votes, and becoming Delhi's Chief Minister as a first-time MLA.

Rekha Gupta took the oath of office at a magnificent event at New Delhi's Ramlila Maidan, bringing the BJP back to power in the capital after 27 years.

She is the fourth female politician to hold the top position in Delhi. Six crucial ministers were sworn in

alongside her, including Parvesh Verma (who defeated Arvind Kejriwal), Sikh politician Manjinder Singh Sirsa, and Purvanchli members Kapil Mishra, Pankaj Singh, Ashish Sood, and Ravinder Indraj Singh.

The gathering developed into a tremendous show of strength for the National Democratic Alliance (NDA), with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, and NDA chief ministers all in attendance.

The presence of female leaders, such as Bansuri Swaraj and Diya Kumari, reflected the party's emphasis on women's emancipation.

Who is Rekha Gupta?

In February, Rekha Gupta of the BJP took her oath as the ninth chief minister of Delhi, marking her as the fourth woman to hold this position, following Sushma Swaraj, Sheila Dikshit, and Atishi.

Gupta emerged victorious in the Delhi Assembly elections from Shalimar Bagh, defeating AAP candidate Bandana Kumari by nearly 29,000 votes.

The recent Delhi state elections saw the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) securing 48 out of 70 seats, successfully defeating the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and reclaiming power in Delhi after almost thirty years.

Rekha Gupta is an experienced BJP leader who began her political career as a student leader. The 50-year-old has previously served as the National Vice President of the BJP's Mahila Morcha.

Gupta, a lawyer by profession, began her political career as President of the Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU) in 1996-1997. She later entered municipal politics, winning the Delhi Councillor elections for Uttari Pitampura (Ward 54) in 2007 and being

re-elected in 2012. She has also served as Mayor of the South Delhi Municipal Corporation, which strengthens her administrative credentials.

Born on July 19, 1974, in the village of Nandgarh in Jind district, Haryana, Rakha Gupta's father held the position of a bank officer. In 1976, the family relocated to Delhi when Gupta was merely two years old.

She grew up and finished her schooling in the capital city, where her solid intellectual background paved the way for her future political career.

Rekha Gupta's political career began in the early 1990s, when she joined the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) at Daulat Ram College, Delhi University, in 1992. In 1996-97, she was elected President of the Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU), firmly establishing her leadership position. She won the MCD Councillor elections from Uttari Pitampura (Ward 54) in 2007, and went on to become the BJP's National Executive Member.

Rekha Gupta's entry into politics began during her student years. While studying at Delhi University, she became a member of the Akhil

Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP), which is the student organisation associated with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS).

Her engagement in student politics resulted in her election as the President of Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU) for the 1996-1997 term. She held the position of secretary at Dyal Singh College and was actively involved in student activism, which advanced her journey into public life.

Rekha Gupta's professional political career in the BJP began in the early 2000s. She joined the party's youth wing, the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM), and served as secretary for the Delhi section. Rekha Gupta's leadership abilities were rapidly noticed, and she was chosen as National Secretary of BJYM from 2004 to 2006. Her great organising skills and commitment to the party's objective helped her rise in the BJP ranks.

In 2007, Gupta was elected to the MCD council, representing the North Pitampura constituency.

From 2007 to 2009, she served as President of MCD's Women's Welfare and Child Development Committee.

She also held various important posts, including General Secretary of the Delhi BJP Women's Wing and National Executive Member of the party.

Even with her solid political background, Rekha Gupta encountered significant obstacles in her electoral path. She ran for the Shalimar Bagh seat in the 2015 and 2020 Delhi Assembly elections but faced defeat against AAP's Bandana Kumari in both instances. Gupta's determination and steadfast dedication to her constituents bore fruit in 2025 as she achieved victory in the Shalimar Bagh seat, reclaiming it with a decisive

Let's discuss about the Rekha Gupta team

BJP leaders Parvesh Verma, Manjinder Singh Sirsa, Kapil Mishra, Ashish Sood, Pankaj Kumar Singh, and Ravinder Indraj Singh were sworn in as cabinet ministers in the new BJP government led by Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta at Ramlila Maidan.

Parvesh Verma

The 47-year-old Verma, a prominent Jat face and a senior leader

of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), was considered the frontrunner for the position of chief minister, which was subsequently awarded to first-time MLA Rekha Gupta following BJP top leadership decisions.

However, Parvesh Verma has been chosen as the new Deputy Chief Minister.

Verma has been extensively linked with the BJP for about 30 years. He is the son of Sahib Singh Verma, a former Delhi Chief Minister and the BJP's senior vice president.

His uncle, Azad Singh, served as mayor of the North Delhi Municipal Corporation and ran for office on a BJP ticket from Mundka. Verma was a two-term Member of Parliament from West Delhi and also represented Mehrauli as an MLA. His political career began in 2013, when he ran in the Delhi Legislative Assembly elections from Mehrauli.

Verma is known as a dynamic politician, having positioned himself as Kejriwal's challenger for the New Delhi seat that the former Delhi Chief Minister has held three times. He matched Kejriwal's strategy in 2013, when the AAP chief faced off against another three-time CM, Sheila Dikshit, from the New Delhi constituency. While he defeated Kejriwal by approximately 4,000 votes, he has the distinction of winning with record margins in the West Delhi Lok Sabha seat in 2014 and 2019.

Verma has an MBA from the Fore School of Management and has participated in social work through Rashtriya Swabhimani, a non-profit organisation created by his father.

He was born on November 7, 1977, in Delhi. He has an interest in politics since childhood and joined the RSS as a Bal Swayamsewak in 1991. Verma became a member of the BJP Initially part of Yuva Morcha, later joined its national executive and subsequently served as the general secretary of the BJP's Delhi unit.

He first became an MLA from Mehrauli in 2013, and then won successive West Delhi Lok Sabha seats in 2014 and 2019. He has the largest margin of victory of any leader who has run in Delhi's parliamentary elections. In 2019, he won by a massive margin of more than 5.78 lakh votes.

Manjinder Singh Sirsa,

Manjinder Singh Sirsa, the then-leader of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) and president of the Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee, joined the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in December 2021. Four years later, he won the Rajouri Garden seat on a BJP ticket in the 2025 Delhi Assembly elections. He recently took his oath as a Delhi cabinet minister.

Sirsa defeated Dhanwati Chandela, the Aam Aadmi Party's candidate, by more than 18,000 votes. He also represented the constituency in the 2017 Delhi by-elections. Sirsa was defeated in the 2020 Delhi Assembly elections by AAP candidate Dhanwati Chandela.

Kapil Mishra

Kapil Mishra started his professional political career with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) but left to join the BJP in 2019. He lost the 2020 Delhi Assembly elections but won the 2025 Delhi Assembly polls from the Karawal Nagar seat. He has now been appointed as a Cabinet Minister in the Delhi government led by the BJP.

Kapil Mishra is the son of Annapurna Mishra, a former East Delhi mayor connected with the BJP.

Kapil Mishra made his debut in the political arena during the 2015 Delhi Legislative Assembly election, representing the AAP from the Karawal Nagar constituency. He secured victory in the election, overcoming his competitor from the BJP, Mohan Singh Bisht, by a margin of 44,431 votes.

Ashish Sood

Ashish Sood is a seasoned leader with strong ties to both the BJP and the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS). Sood, who has been with the BJP

for several years, is no new to Delhi's political landscape.

Ashish Sood was sworn in as a Delhi minister in chief minister Rekha Gupta's Cabinet after winning the Janakpuri constituency by nearly 19,000 votes over AAP candidate Rajesh Rishi.

Sood, known for his organisational talents, has held a number of important positions within the party, including councillor, Leader of the House in the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC), and, most recently, Goa in-charge and co-in-charge for Jammu and Kashmir.

Sood, a significant player in the Delhi BJP, has actively contributed

to the party's expansion, serving as general secretary of the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) before becoming its national vice president.

His contributions to the party's organisational efforts are clear, having served as secretary of the Delhi BJP in 2008 and then as general secretary. His strategic influence within the party has cemented his position as a reliable figure in the BJP's leadership.

Sood's triumph in Janakpuri is further bolstered by his excellent grassroots ties, which have allowed him maintain a consistent presence in Delhi's political realm. He has strong support from senior BJP figures as well

as the RSS.

Pankaj Kumar Singh

Pankaj Kumar Singh, a dental surgeon turned politician, has emerged as a significant figure in Delhi's newly created Rekha Gupta government. Singh was sworn in as a minister in February 2025, after winning the Vikaspuri seat by more than 12,000 votes. His appointment to the cabinet demonstrates the BJP's strategic concentration on the Purvanchali voter base, which is a powerful electoral force in the national capital.

Singh (48), a first-time MLA, has

a long history with the BJP, having served as general secretary of the party's Poorvanchal Morcha in Delhi. Poorvanchalis – migrants from eastern Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Jharkhand — have sway in various constituencies, therefore Singh's inclusion is a strong indication of their political prominence.

Singh's political path started at the grassroots level. Before being elected to the Assembly, he worked as a municipal councillor in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD), where he gained governance expertise. He has a bachelor's degree in dentistry from Magadh University in Bodh Gaya, Bihar.

His appointment to the Delhi Cabinet comes at a time when Bihar is preparing for assembly elections later this year, underscoring the BJP's overall electoral strategy.

Ravinder Indraj Singh

Ravinder Indraj Singh, the BJP leader who won the Bawana (SC) assembly seat in the Delhi elections, was sworn in as a cabinet minister in Chief member Rekha Gupta's ministry.

Singh is from Bawana, in the North Delhi district. He is the son of Shri Indraj Singh (a former MLA from Narela). A notable Dalit figure within the Delhi BJP, Singh (50) has successfully attained his higher education, securing a Bachelor of Arts degree from the School of Open Learning at Delhi University.

Ravinder Indraj Singh, a first-time MLA, has demonstrated active involvement within the BJP's Scheduled Caste (SC) Morcha. Singh represents the Dalit community in the Delhi Cabinet led by Rekha Gupta.

He defeated Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) candidate Jai Bhagwan Upkar for the Bawana (SC reserved) seat by more than 31,000 votes.

Singh is affiliated with the party's SC Morcha and has played an important role in rallying support for the party in North Delhi. His political background is strongly ingrained in Bawana, which he now represents in the Delhi Assembly. ■

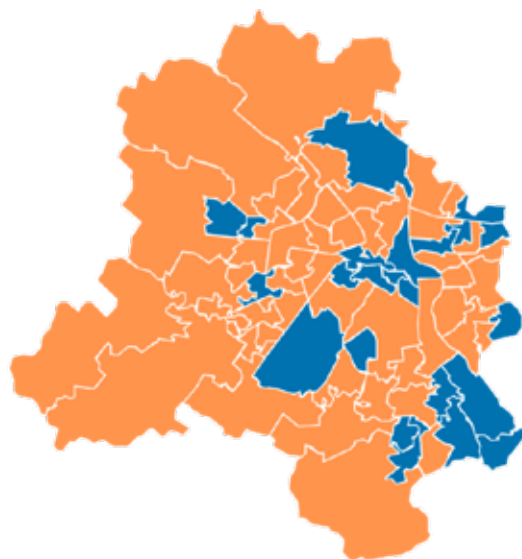

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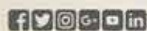


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
