#### Justice BR Gavai to Take Oath as 52nd **CJI Tomorrow**



New Delhi, (HS): Justice B.R. Gavai will take oath as the 52nd Chief Justice of India (CJI) on Wednesday, making him the first Buddhist to head the country's judiciary. President Droupadi Murmu will administer the oath of office to Justice Gavai, who succeeds former CJI Sanjiv Khanna.

President Murmu, in exercise of powers under Article 124(2) of the Constitution, had appointed Justice Gavai, the seniormost Judge of the Supreme Court, as Chief Justice of India, and the Ministry of Law and Justice had later notified his appointment. Justice Gavai was elevated as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India on May 24, 2019. In the last six years, he was a part of around 700 Benches dealing with matters pertaining to a variety of subjects, including constitutional and administrative law, civil law, criminal law, commercial disputes, arbitration law, electricity law, education matters and environmental law. He has authored around 300 judgments, including that of the Constitution Bench on various issues, upholding the rule of law and safeguarding the fundamental rights, human rights and legal rights of citizens. He became a permanent Judge of the Bombay High Court on November 12, 2005. He presided over Benches having all types of assignments at the Principal Seat at Mumbai as well as Benches at Nagpur, Aurangabad and Panaji. Earlier, in an informal interaction with the media, Justice Gavai expressed sorrow over the tragic incident in Pahalgam and said that the Supreme Court cannot remain untouched when the country is mourning. Son of former Bihar Governor R. S. Gavai, Justice Gavai takes pride in the fact that he is about to become the first Buddhist CJI of the country.

"My father had embraced Buddhism along with Baba Saheb Ambedkar. I will become the first Buddhist Chief Justice of the country," he said. Asserting that he believes in all religions, Justice Gavai said, "I go to temples, dargahs, Jain temples, gurudwaras everywhere.

# 'Ghar Mein Ghus Kar Maarenge': PM Warns Pakistan of Total Annihilation If Terror Returns



Adampur Airbase (Punjab), (HS): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday issued a sharp warning to Pakistan and its supported terror groups, declaring that India's new doctrine on terrorism involves striking at the source, deep inside enemy territory. "Hum ghar mein ghus kar marenge aur bachane ka ek mauka tak nahi denge," the Prime Minister thundered during his address to air warriors at the Adampur Air Force base in Punjab.

He praised India's armed forces for their massive response to last week's Pahalgam terror attack, in which 26 people were killed by terrorists from a Lashkar-e-Taiba

'Operation Sindoor'-India's swift, coordinated military response targeted nine terror bases in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, which was followed by hostilities that saw India repelling Pakistani missile and drone retaliation. "This is our new normal," PM Modi said, referring to Operation Sindoor, which he described as India's first triservice combat operation since the 1971 war. "India's 'Laxman Rekha' against terrorism is crystal clear now. If another terror attack occurs now, India will give a reply - a solid reply. We saw this during the surgical strike, during the air strike. Now, Operation Sindoor is India's new normal,"

he asserted. Taking aim at Pakistan's military support for terror outfits, PM Modi declared: "Jis Pakistani sena ke bharose ye aatanki baithhe the, Bharatiya sena, Bharat ki Air Force aur Bharatiyon ne us Pakistani sena ko bhi dhool chata di hai. (The terrorists who were relying on the Pakistani Army the Indian Army, the Indian Air Force, and the people of India have made that Pakistani Army bite the dust)." He added that India's growing military strength should serve as a deterrent. "Our drones, our missiles, just thinking about them will keep Pakistan sleepless for days." The Prime Minister used the moment to

express deep gratitude to the armed forces. "Every Indian is proud of you... you have written history. I have come for your blessings. You are an inspiration for this and the coming generations. I want to salute the Army, Navy and Air Force." "The terrorists dared us... but you hit them front-on. You wiped out their terror bases and killed 100 terrorists. They have now realised that if they try to attack us, the result will be their destruction... massive destruction," PM Modi said. The Adampur Air Force base itself was at the centre of the recent military escalation, and also the target of a Pakistani disinformation campaign. Islamabad falsely claimed that its China-made JF-17 jets had destroyed the base and knocked out one of India's Russian-origin S-400 air defence systems. India responded by releasing a photograph of PM Modi saluting soldiers at Adampur, with a fully operational S-400 system in the background - silencing claims from across the border and reinforcing India's military **Continued P-4** 

#### Over 10K Public Petitions Resolved by CM's Grievance Cell in Less Than A Year



#### **Individual Judge Can't Recommend for Senior Designation of Advocates: SC**

New Delhi, (HS): The Supreme Court on Tuesday said that an individual apex court or HC judge cannot recommend any advocate for "senior" designation. "The scheme of Sub-section (2) of Section 16 (of the Advocates Act, 1961) indicates that an individual Judge of the Supreme Court or the High Court, as the case may be, cannot recommend any Advocate for designation as the decision is a collective decision of the Full Court, a bench presided over by Justice Abhay S. Oka.

The Bench, also comprising Justices Ujjal Bhuyan and SVN Bhatti, added that even if an advocate deserving of a designation does not apply for designation, on the basis of the discussion in the house, the Full Court can always recommend his designation, subject to his consent. "For that purpose, the recommendation in writing of an individual Judge is not warranted," clarified the apex court. In its detailed judgment, the Justice Oka-led Bench said that the practice of advocates making applications for the grant of designation can continue as the act of making an application can be treated as consent of the advocates concerned for "senior" designation. It clarified that the Full Court may consider and confer designation without an



Further, the top court opined discontinuation of point-based assessment by the Permanent Committee for the "senior" designation of advocates. The apex court said, "The applications of all candidates found to be eligible by the Permanent Secretariat, along with relevant documents submitted by the applicants, shall be placed before the Full House. An endeavour can always be made to arrive at a consensus. However, if a consensus on the designation of Advocates is not arrived at, the decision-making must be by a democratic method of voting." However, the Justice Oka-led Bench left it to the High Courts to take a call as to whether, in a given case, there should be a secret ballot. ## **CM Launches Mega Development Drive** in Mayurbhanj with Rs 420 Cr Projects Bhubaneswar/Bisoi,

(DMC): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan inaugurated and laid the foundation stones developmental projects worth over 420 crore in Mayurbhanj district during a grand event at Bisoi on Tuesday. According to an official press release, the projects, spanning various blocks, aim to transform the region's infrastructure and socioeconomic landscape, marking a significant step toward a prosperous Odisha. The Chief Minister inaugurated 133 projects valued at over ?328 crore and laid the foundation for 52 projects worth more than 91 crore. These initiatives cover critical areas such as rural drinking water, mega piped water supply, school infrastructure upgrades, banking facilities, health centers, road construction, and tribal

cultural centers. The projects are expected to benefit areas like Rairangpur, Kusumi, Bijatala, Bahalda, Jamda, and Tiring, fostering inclusive growth. In a significant announcement, Majhi revealed plans to establish a +2 college at the Bisoi block headquarters to boost education in the region. He also declared that the Bisoi Mini Stadium would be named after the revered leader Dharanidhar Naik, with a statue to be installed



in his honour. Addressing the gathering at the Bisoi Mini Stadium, the Chief Minister described the projects as a "new chapter" in Mayurbhanj's development journey. "Today is a day of pride and glory for the people of Mayurbhanj. These projects will create a new wave of development and lay the foundation for a prosperous Odisha," he said. Highlighting his government's achievements over the past 11 months, Majhi cited transformative decisions such as opening all four gates of the Shree Jagannath Temple, launching the Subhadra scheme benefiting over 1 crore women, and setting the minimum support price for paddy at ?3,100. The Subhadra scheme has empowered 17 lakh women to become "Lakhpati

Didis," strengthening the rural economy. The recently launched CM Kisan Yojana further supports farmers. Majhi also emphasized Odisha's industrial growth, driven by central government support. He announced that industries worth ?10,000 crore will be established in Mayurbhanj, creating extensive employment opportunities and doubling the district's development. # PIL Filed over Bengal Govt's in Digha Jagannath Temple

Kolkata/Bhubaneswar, (DMC): A Public Interest Litigation (PIL) was filed at a division bench of the Calcutta High Court on Tuesday questioning the involvement of West Bengal government with the recently inaugurated Lord Jagannath Temple at Digha in East Midnapore, reportedly modelled after the iconic Shree Jagannath Dham Temple at Puri in Odisha.

In the petition filed by Calcutta High Court advocate and the state BJP leader in West Bengal, Kaustav Bagchi argued on various points, claiming that the involvement of the state government with the Digha



temple, reportedly shown as Shree Jagannath Dham Cultural Centre in the records of the state government, is against the constitutional provisions. The division bench of Justice Soumen Sen and Justice Smita Das has

admitted the petition. In his petition, Bagchi had also requested that the first hearing in the matter be conducted by May 19. The first question raised by Bagchi in the petition is how the address of the office of the West

Bengal Housing Infrastructure Development Corporation (WBHIDCO), the implementing agency of the Digha temple, was shown as the address of the trust of the Digha Temple. Bagchi further raised objections over the announcement of tax concessions against donations made to the temple trust. The petitioner's question is, since, as per legal provision, no state government can be involved in the construction of any religious establishment, how could the announcement for tax concessions be announced? Bagchi also raised how money could be spent from the state exchequer behind the

construction of any religious structure, as was done in the case of the Digha Lord Jagannath Temple. The estimated cost borne from the state exchequer for the Digha structure is Rs 250

Already, since the inauguration of the temple on April 30, several controversies have surfaced in the matter. The first allegation was regarding the use of leftover timber meant for Puri's Shree Jagannath Dham Temple for carving deities in the Digha Temple. Secondly objection was raised regarding the use of "Dham" for describing the structure at Digha, considering Continued P-4

After several rounds of negotiations involving discussions over contentious issues such as the carbon tax, India and the UK have finalised the long-awaited free trade agreement. This is a welcome trade push. The agreement, which has been concluded against the backdrop of the tariff war unleashed by US President Donald Trump, is arguably the most comprehensive deal that Delhi has entered into with a major developed country. It comes after trade deals with Australia and the UAE, which reflect the shift in Delhi's approach towards embracing freer trade and integrating more deeply with global supply chains. The UK is India's significant trading partner. Bilateral trade between the two countries is about \$60 billion, and is projected to double by 2030. The trade deal will eliminate tariffs levied by the UK on about 99 per cent of products, including labour-intensive sectors such as textiles, footwear and manufacturing industries like electrical machinery and automobile components. The agreement addresses various issues concerning labor mobility that have posed significant challenges for India. Notably, skilled Indian professionals working in the UK, as well as their employers, will benefit from an exemption from social security contributions for a duration of three years. This provision aims to facilitate smoother transitions for Indian workers and enhance their employment opportunities abroad. Alongside, India has got "commitments on digitally delivered services for Indian services suppliers". On its part, Delhi has lowered tariffs on whiskey and gin to 75 per cent, and further to 40 per cent over 10 years. It has also reduced automotive tariffs to 10 per cent under a quota. Other areas where duties have been lowered are cosmetics, aerospace products, medical devices. This trade deal with the UK has been finalised at a time when India is also holding discussions on similar deals with countries/regions such as the US, the EU, Chile and Peru.

As such, it not only sends a signal to these countries, but also provides a template for other agreements. Recent developments indicate that potential agreements with both the United States and the European Union could soon come to fruition. It is crucial for the government to focus on finalizing these agreements as quickly as possible. At the same time, it is essential for the government to push forward with its domestic reform initiatives while also addressing the ongoing structural challenges that hinder economic growth.

# India-UK Trade Will China take over the Baton from USA?

 ${f P}$ rior to the second world war, the British used to say "The sun never sets on British empire". They ruled over a quarter of the globe for three centuries. This made them financially strong and a great military power. By the end of the second world war, Britain was financially weak and there was demand from the colonies for freedom. During the next couple of decades most of the British colonies got freedom; the major countries among them were India, Pakistan, Burma, Srilanka, Israel, Malaysia and Singapore. A number of African countries like Botswana, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya and Libya followed and got independence soon to add to the decline of the British empire. A few countries like Egypt and Iraq had already got independence before the WW2. The power vacuum was filled up by the USA which was relatively unscathed in the WW2 and which emerged as the only nuclear power after the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings. The power and leadership baton passed on from the hands of UK to the USA.

Post WW2 the new world

order saw USA as the new leader of the world in the areas of finance, education, diplomacy, warfare, science and technology. Though USSR emerged as a competitor in warfare and technology especially in the areas of space and nuclear technology, still US was considered as the global leader due to its democratic set up and open market system. USSR being a communist country with less transparency was no match to the USA in terms of size of economy and depth of financial market. USD became the reserve currency of the world and every country was investing its surplus in US market which helped USA to get cheap funds. But eight decades later things are looking for a change. China is the second largest economy today with a nominal GDP equal to USD 19 trillion as against USD 31 trillion for the USA. In PPP terms China's GDP is more than that of USA and it ranks number one in the world. The current stance of USA is different from the stance taken by it post WW2 and USA appears to have lost interest in leading the world politically. It has exited from the WHO, the environment related Paris Accord and decided to put the WTO in to backburner and enter in to its own tariff regime including a trade war with China. It has decided to exit its role from giving aids to the developing world and shut down the USAid which in addition to providing aid, was acting as its political presence across the world. It also decided to shut down its consulates in many African countries and the Voice of America service. Internally, the US Government has also been reducing its staff strength in government departments to control expenditure. All the above steps have been taken apparently to reduce its expenditure and keep the budgetary deficit under



control. The Government has also been inward looking ignoring its international obligations and diplomatic strategy. It has decided to alienate its traditional allies in Europe, Canada and Mexico and instead it has announced its intention to take over Greenland and Gaza which has been interpreted by experts as start of an imperial regime. The tariff hike has created discontent to the extent that Japan decided to sell US bonds as a strategy to give a message to USA. It has also indicated that it would use its USD 1.1. trillion US bond holdings during its negotiation with USA for tariffs. China also holds about USD 800 bn of treasury bonds and it can use these bonds to create havoc in US

As the whole world including its allies in Europe are drifting away from USA, does it indicate that it is time for another nation to take over the baton of global leadership from USA? In order to take over the global leadership, the country should be reasonably strong both financially and militarily. China being the country next to USA in terms of financial and military strength has been suggested by experts as the next leader of the global order. But does China fits in to it? Historically Chinese banks were heavily relying on state owned enterprises for credit disbursement; interest rate on bank loans was controlled by the state and the exchange rate was managed. But China is stated to be undertaking financial reforms over the last decade to come out of it. It has reduced state guarantee to banks for loans and giving them more leeway to finance private entities. The interest rate on loans has also been deregulated. It also claims that its exchange rate is flexible and is not manipulated by the state any more. Banking sector remains the major source of financing of the economy and at the end of 2023 the NPA was reported to be less than 2%. The provision coverage ratio of commercial banks was 207.9%, the capital adequacy ratio 14.66% and the Liquidity Coverage Ratio 143.5%. China's inflation rate is also reasonably low. During the period 1981 to 2024, the average inflation rate was 4.6% and during 2024 the inflation was less than 1%. It has also opened up its capital market for investments from outside. In the recent years, China's bond market has developed rapidly. At the end of 2023, the size of China's bond market exceeded RMB 155 trillion (USD 21 trn), and the total market value of the

stock market was close to RMB

80 trillion (USD 11 trn), making it the second largest bond and stock market in the world. The size of outstanding government bonds was RMB 66 trm and it is growing at a reasonable pace. The government bonds are issued with tenures up to 30 years and yields are low commensurate with the inflation rate. It is said that more than 1000 Foreign Institutional investors from 70 countries have invested in Chinese bonds.

The main risk indicators of Chinese banking sector are within the acceptable range. It has opened up its markets and with the growth of fintech, access to the market by overseas investors has become easier. China is also militarily catching up and China claims that it is ahead of USA in electronic warfare. Therefore, there is a good chance that China is poised to take over the baton from USA as the leader of the next world order. On the negative side, the the world is still reluctant to accept RMB as a good reserve currency and as such its share in SDR is 12.28% as against 43.38% of USD. The foreign exchange reserves held in RMB comprise only 2.28% of the total global reserves. Further, there are several issues China needs to address before projecting itself as a credible successor to USA. First it has to be transparent in dishing out its data and ensure data integrity. Second it should project it as an open society and not one where a foreign visitor will be tracked every where he goes. Third, markets should function on principles and mot on the whims and fancies of rulers. Rights of foreigners on their financial assets should be clearly established and announced. It takes time to build credibility but it can be destroyed in a short time.

# When water also becomes a weapon: India's unity robbed

The battle within India in the shadow of the border" "When water also becomes a robbed"

Today India is grappling with internal disintegration more than external attacks. Be it the Punjab-Harvana water dispute or the Pahalgam terror attack-an invisible ideological war is hidden behind every crisis. A third front has emerged within the country in the name of caste, religion, language, region, and ideology. This front neither fights with bullets nor with bombs-it silently breaks the unity and consciousness of the country. Until this front is identified, India will keep losing internally even after winning on external fronts.

When it comes to national security, most eyes turn towards the border-the line that separates us from Pakistan or China. But the most dangerous war that India is facing today is neither on the border nor in the bullets of the enemies. That war is going on within India-against our soul, unity, and ideology. The recent dispute over water between Haryana and Punjab is not just an administrative problem but a serious warning of the instability and regional imbalance of India's federal structure. When the water level of the Nangal Dam rose, causing floods in Haryana, and Punjab refused to take responsibility for it, it was not just one state opposing another. It was the breakdown of the unity on which India stands. On the other hand, the terrorist killing of a Hindu tourist in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, made it clear that some forces are still trying to divide India on religious grounds, and this effort is being made not only with bullets but also with ideological poison. India now faces three battlefronts-the military front on the borders, the diplomatic front



on the global stage, and the ideological war going on within the country, which I call the 'half front.' This half-front is invisible, but the most deadly. It is visible in our universities, media, social media, and sometimes even in our politics. This front divides the country on the basis of ideas, makes people fight in the name of religion, caste, language, and region, and fills the mind of a common Indian with distrust towards the nation. The people fighting on this front are imposters. These are the people who call the idea of India being divided a revolution, who consider Bharat Mata Ki Jai as communalism, and who look at every terrorist incident through the lens of 'reaction' and 'background.' For them, the nation is not an emotion but a subject of criticism. When the Indian army displays bravery, they remember human rights. When India achieves scientific achievements, they remind us of 'poverty and hunger.' When India gains respect on the global stage, they start comparing it with 'dictatorship.' This 'ideology' is slowly

entangling the youth in its web. Universities, which should be centers of character building, are now becoming laboratories of

anti-national slogans. There was a time when the aim of education was "Sa Vidya Ya Vimuktaye," i.e., education is that which liberates. But today's education is confusing the youth by distorting history, dividing freedom fighters into castes, and naming the concept of nation as 'cultural supremacy.' Social media has sharpened this halffront. An organized effort is visible on Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, and YouTube, in which India is given tags like 'Hindu Rashtra,' 'Manuvadi rule,' and 'anti-minority country.' These tags not only affect the international image but also confuse a common Indian. A common Muslim starts living in fear, a common Dalit starts feeling isolated, and a common Hindu starts living in guilt. But this ideological war is not limited to academic debates or social media posts. Its real and dangerous consequences are also emerging. In the Pahalgam incident, a Hindu tourist was killed because he was a 'Hindu' by religion. This is not just terrorism but an extreme form of religion-based ideological hatred. This incident indicates that our efforts to transform India's diversity into unity are still incomplete, and the roots of

hatred are very deep. The role of politics on this half of India's front is also very suspicious. While leaders have to raise the flag of nationalism to come to power, to get votes they promote discussions that divide the society. Sometimes minority appeasement, sometimes Dalit reservation politics, sometimes regional identity-all these have weakened India's national identity. Putting the country's unity at stake for political gain is suicidal, but this is what is happening today. There is another face of this ideological war-regional battles over water, electricity, resources, and languages. Is it not a matter of concern that two states of the same country-Haryana and Punjab-have started throwing each other into floods and droughts for water? Is it not also a part of the ideological war to create a feeling of 'hatred towards the other state' within India? The same is true for languages. Discontent in the South in the name of the imposition of Hindi, Marathi versus Hindi, Bengali versus Assamese-all these are examples of the 'half war' waged against the soul of India. Today, there is a need to take this half of India's front as seriously as the

military conflict on the border.

We have to understand that there is a difference between 'criticism of the country' and 'antinationalism,' but this difference ends when the purpose of criticism is not improvement but destruction. To win on this front, India needs not just soldiers but teachers, writers, journalists, poets, activists, and ordinary citizens. We have to reorient our education system towards nation building. We have to create an ideological front in favor of the nation on social media as well. And most importantly, we have to force politicians not to do politics at the cost of the country. Those who consider this half-front as the 'voice of freedom' must also understand that the first condition of freedom is unity. Without unity, freedom is only an illusion. How long will a nation that cannot identify its internal enemies fight its external enemies?

The real test of India is not in the battlefield but in the classrooms of universities, the pages of the media, the posts on social media, and the debates in Parliament. The test is whether we consider India to be just a piece of land or a living consciousness. consciousness can survive only when every citizen, every student, every politician, and every writer understands that India's diversity is its strength, not its weakness. So now is the time to take this 'half front' very seriously. To save the country from breaking apart, we will have to fight with ideas, not tanks. And in this fight, every Indian is a soldier-either in favor of the nation or against the nation.





# Hot And Humid Weather Likely To Grip Odisha For Next Four Days

#### Odisha Records 282 Heat-Related Illness Cases, No Confirmed Sunstroke Death So Far

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): With an increase in temperature, hot and humid weather conditions are likely to prevail in Odisha till May 17. The regional meteorological centre has issued yellow alerts for several districts for the next four days. For May 14 weather prediction, hot and humid conditions are very likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati. Besides, the IMD has predicted thunderstorms with lightning with gusty surface wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph very likely to occur in the afternoon/evening hours at one or two places over the districts of Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar, Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Gajapati and Ganjam for May 14. As per IMD prediction for May 15, hot and humid conditions are very likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati. For May 15, the IMD has forecast thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds in several Odisha districts. In the districts of Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati, and Ganjam, thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds reaching 40-50



km/h are likely to occur in the afternoon or evening hours at isolated places. Additionally, thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds reaching 30-40 km/h are expected in the afternoon or evening hours at one or two places in the districts of Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Nabarangapur, Kandhamal, Bhadrak, Angul, Dhenkanal, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Balangir, Kalahandi, and Cuttack. According to the weather forecast, hot and humid conditions are very likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati on May 16. "Thunderstorm with lightning with gusty surface wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph very likely to occur in the afternoon/evening hours at one or two places over the districts of Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati", read the prediction of IMD for May 16. Hot and humid conditions are very likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati", read the IMD forecast for May 17. As temperatures continued to soar across Odisha amid hot and humid conditions, the number of heat-related cases also recorded considerable rise in the state. As per data available with the Health and Family Welfare Department, at least 282 persons have fallen ill due to heat-related

issues so far this summer. Sharing details regarding heat-related illness cases, Director of Public Health Dr Nilakantha Mishra told reporters that all these 282 affected persons sought treatment at outpatient departments (OPDs) of government hospitals and none of them required hospitalisation. Stating that unverified report of a suspected heatstroke death was received in Balangir district, Dr Mishra clarified that the case has not been confirmed as the district administration's report is still awaited by the Revenue and Disaster Management Department. He said Sambalpur district reported the highest number of 83 heat-related illness cases, followed by Jharsuguda (72), Mayurbhanj (42), Balasore (24), Sonepur (17), and Deogarh (15). Advising people to avoid venturing out after 10 am, Dr Mishra said in case of emergencies, one should carry an umbrella or a cotton gamchha for protection. Those who have to go outside must stay hydrated by drinking adequate quantity of Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) or rice water, he said. Truck drivers have been specifically advised to avoid working in mining areas during peak heat.



#### 'You are conscience keepers of the system': CJI Sanjiv Khanna's message to Bar as he demits office



New Delhi, (HS): Overwhelmed by the rich accolades on his last day at the Supreme Court, Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna on Tuesday said he was certain his successor CJIdesignate Justice B R Gavai would uphold the values of the Supreme Court, fundamental rights and the basic constitutional doctrines. The ceremonial bench comprised the outgoing CJI, Justice Gavai, and Justice Sanjay Kumar, showcasing a rare moment of reflection, celebration, and reverence, not

just for Justice Khanna's contributions, but the legacy of his uncle, former Supreme Court judge Justice H R Khanna, he took forward.

The CJI called Justice Gavai his "biggest support" while expressing confidence in the latter's leadership and commitment to constitutional values. "What to say about justice and CJI designate B R Gavai, we got elevated the same year. Here we are in the collegium, and thereafter, we have interacted on several occasions. And I must say, he has been my biggest support. And I am sure that you have in Justice Gavai an excellent chief justice who's going to uphold the institution and who's going to uphold the fundamental rights who's going to uphold our basic doctrines which we have adopted and applied," he said. In his parting remarks, Justice Khanna expressed gratitude, reflecting on the memories he carries from his years in the judiciary and said, "I am overwhelmed." "I carry with me a lot of memories. Memories that are very nice and will remain with me throughout my life," he said. Emphasising the role of the bar and the bench in earning public trust, he shared, "The judiciary is not just judges; it includes the bar. You are the conscience keepers of the system."

CJI Khanna lauded the collegiality among judges from diverse regions and backgrounds, saying such diversity allowed for richer deliberations and more nuanced decisions. "Another thing is the biggest plus factor in this court. We have judges from different parts of the country, and they with different thought processes, different backgrounds, are able to discuss and find a lot of solutions. We were able to find out the right path," he said. Justice Gavai, who would assume the CJI office on May 14, said Justice Khanna "embraced his legacy" and built his own. He called it not a farewell but a transition and said, "What ends today is not a career, but the beginning of another."

#### **Top LeT Commander** killed with three terrorists in J&K




SRINAGAR, (HS): Three militants from the desingnated terrorist outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) have been killed in an ongoing encounter with security forces in the Shukroo forest area in South Kashmir's Shopian district in Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday. The militants include top LeT commander Shahid Kuttay, according to officials. A police officer said a massive cordon and search operation was launched by troops in the Shukroo forest area of Keller in Shopian in the early hours of Tuesday, after receiving specific input about the presence of some militants there. Police said the search operation turned into an encounter after the terrorists fired upon the forces who retaliated. In the exchange of fire, three terrorists were killed as their bodies were sighted in the deep vegetation area in the forests, the officials said. A senior police officer identified the two as Shahid Kuttay and Adnan Shafi. The identity of the third one was being ascertained. Kuttay, a resident of Chotipora Heerpora area of Shopian, who had joined the terror ranks in March 2023, was a category "A" terrorist and a top commander of the

## Ban on 4PM Youtube Channel Lifted, SC Told

New Delhi, (HS): The Supreme Court was apprised on Tuesday that the Union government has withdrawn its directive to block the YouTube channel 4PM News Network. A bench of Justices B. R. Gavai and A. G. Masih was hearing a plea filed by journalist Sanjay Sharma challenging the Centre's directive to block his news channel on YouTube on the grounds of "national security" and "public order". Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing on the petitioner's behalf, submitted that since the blocking order has been withdrawn by the authorities, the prayer for interim relief has turned infructuous.

However, Sibal pressed the prayer contained in the petition challenging the constitutional validity of the Information Technology (IT) Blocking Rules, 2009. In view of the submission, the Apex Court ordered tagging the instant petition with the pending batch of pleas raising similar issues. Last week, the Justice Gavai-led Bench issued notice on the plea filed by the editor of the digital news platform and sought responses from the Union government, including the Ministry of Home Affairs, and YouTube. When a prayer for interim relief was pressed, the Top Court had said that it was not inclined to pass any stay order without



hearing from the government. In his writ petition filed before the Apex Court, journalist Sanjay Sharma said that non-furnishing of the blocking order or underlying complaint violated statutory and constitutional safeguards. "Rules 8, 9, and 16 of the Information Technology (Procedure and Safeguards for Blocking for Access of Information by Public) Rules, 2009, which permit blocking without notice or hearing, are violative of Articles 14, 19(1)(a), and 21 of the Constitution, as they oust the principles of natural justice and enable a shadow regime of censorship devoid of transparency or accountability," stated the petition filed through Talha Abdul Rahman. Further, it said that the Constitution does not

permit the blanket removal of content without an opportunity to be heard.

"'National security' and 'public order'

are not talismanic invocations to insulate executive action from scrutiny. They are constitutionally recognised grounds under Article 19(2), but are subject to the test of reasonableness and proportionality," the plea said. A vague reference to these grounds, without even disclosing the offending content, makes it impossible for the petitioner to challenge or remedy the allegation, thereby depriving him of his fundamental right to free speech and fair hearing, added the petition. The Editors Guild of India, in a recent press statement, said that it was "deeply concerned" by the decision of the Union government to block YouTube Channel 4PM News Network, and termed the move an "opaque use of executive power, without prior notice or opportunity for response". "Arbitrary takedown orders undermine the fundamental right to freedom of speech. The Guild reiterated its demand for a transparent and accountable mechanism for content takedowns, particularly when it concerns journalistic work. National security cannot become a pretext to silence critical voices or independent reporting," added the press statement.

"We saw this during surgical strike, the air strike and now Operation Sindoor has become India's new normal," he said, highlighting the three-pronged policy of responding to terror attacks at will, ignoring nuclear blackmail and treating terror masterminds and their state sponsors alike. Saluting Indian forces and the Border Security Force for teaching a befitting lesson to the Pakistan Army for supporting terror, PM Modi said, "You have reminded Pakistan that if there is a terror attack, we will hit them in their own territory." PM Modi congratulated the IAF and other forces for showing exemplary man-machine coordination and said, "The thought of our drones and missiles now makes Pakistan lose its sleep."

#### Hooch tragedy death toll rises to 21, kingpin among 10 arrested

CHANDIGARH, (HS): The death toll in the Amritsar hooch tragedy has risen to 21, with 10 others hospitalised after consuming spurious liquor in five villages of the Majitha area in Punjab. Ten people, including the main supplier and the alleged kingpin, were arrested in connection with the incident. Along with the suspension of four officers: Deputy Superintendent of Police, Station House Officer (SHO), besides Majitha subdivision excise and taxation officer (ETO) and excise inspector. Sources revealed that the deceased include youths from Bhangali, Patalpuri, Marari Kalan, Therewal, and Talwandi Ghuman villages. With the condition of ten others critical, the death toll may rise. The victims have been admitted to Amritsar Civil Hospital. Police have launched an investigation into the source of the illicit liquor.

# 'Our targets were...': What India said on Pakistan 'nuclear leakage'

New Delhi, (HS): Ministry of external affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal on Tuesday addressed questions about reports around Pakistan's nuclear facility in Kirana Hills in context with India's Operation Sindoor military strikes, saying that it was for the Pakistani side to respond to claims being made over it. In the press briefing on Tuesday, Randhir Jaiswal was asked about social media buzz on 'nuclear leakage' in Pakistan after the Indian strikes. "Talk of Egyptian or American aircraft - those are questions for them (Pakistan) to answer, not for us. Our position was made very clear during the defence briefing. As for your question, the Pakistani minister has already made some remarks on that," he said. Clarifying India's stance, he added, "Our military action was entirely within the conventional domain. There were some reports suggesting that Pakistan's National Command Authority would convene, but those were later denied. In Pakistan's government representatives have officially denied this on record."

Jaiswal also reiterated India's broader policy approach: "As you know, India has a firm stand that it will not give in to nuclear blackmail or allow cross-border terrorism to be conducted, invoking it in conversations with various countries, we've also cautioned that they subscribing to such scenarios would hurt them in their own region." Responding to US President Donald Trump's remarks, in which he claimed that the US played a role in preventing a potential nuclear war between India and Pakistan that could have claimed millions of lives, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said,?"The military action from

#### All schools, colleges in non-border districts in Kashmir reopen

SRI NAGAR, (HS): All schools and colleges in Kashmir, except those in the border districts, reopened on Tuesday following a suspension of hostilities between India and Pakistan, officials said. Education institutes in Kupwara, and Baramulla districts, and those in the Gurez sector of Bandipora would remain closed for now, they said. According to the officials, Kashmir University will resume classes on Wednesday. Schools, colleges and universities in the Union Territory were temporarily shut last week in view of the military standoff between India and Pakistan. However, in a pause in the standoff, the Jammu and Kashmir government on Monday ordered the reopening of educational institutes across the Union Territory, except for those in the border districts.

### BJP-Led NDA Sweeps Panchayat Polls in Assam

Guwahati, (HS): The Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) has secured a sweeping victory in the 2025 Assam Panchayat elections, consolidating its political dominance in the state. In a decisive show of strength, the alliance secured 300 out of 376 Zilla Parishad seats, capturing more than 76 per cent of the vote share. This landslide win not only reflects the alliance's widespread grassroots support but also underscores the growing confidence of the electorate in its governance model. The ruling alliance also fared impressively in the Anchalik Panchayat elections, winning 1,436 out of 2,192 seats across the state. With a substantial vote share of 66 per cent in these local bodies, the NDA has demonstrated its strong foothold at the village and block levels. This robust performance marks a significant milestone for the BJP and its allies, particularly in the run-up to the 2026 state Assembly elections. Reacting to the panchayat poll results, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma took to social media platform X to express gratitude to the people of the state.

#### Monsoon reaches Andaman and Nicobar islands

Andaman, (HS): The IMD (India Meteorological Department) confirmed on Tuesday that the much awaited Southwest monsoon reached Andaman and Nicobar islands. Widespread moderate rainfall with heavy rainfall at a few places occurred over the Nicobar Islands during past 24 hours. Thus, the widespread rainfall with isolated/scattered heavy rainfall continued over the Nicobar Islands during past 2 days. The strength and depth of westerly wind increased continuously during past 2 days over parts of south Bay of Bengal, Nicobar Islands and Andaman Sea. The westerly wind speed at 1.5 km above mean sea level is above 20 knots and the depth of westerly wind over some parts of south Bay, Nicobar Islands and some parts of Andaman Sea is up to 4.5 km above mean sea level. The Outgoing Longwave Radiation over the area continued to decrease becoming less than 200 W/m2 during past 2 days (190 &170 W/m2 on 12th & 13th May, 2025).

# Before-After Satellite Pics Show Damage to Pak Bases in Indian Strikes

New Delhi, (HS): India struck multiple Pakistani air bases during 'Operation Sindoor', damaging runways, hangars, and buildings, causing a massive blow to Pakistan. Accessed before and after satellite images of these bases -Sargodha, Nur Khan (Chaklala), Bholari, Jacobabad, Sukkur and Rahim Yar Khan.

Maxar Technologies' high-resolution images show the extent of damage to these air bases in India's precision strikes. Air Marshal AK Bharti, Director General of Air Operations, during a press briefing, said India hit selected military targets deep inside Pakistan and its response was "measured and calibrated." The Jacobabad Air Base is around 200 km from the International Border. It is located in the Sindh province of Pakistan, west of Rajasthan's Longewala. India struck the hangar at the Jacobabad air base. Hangars are structures built at an air base to protect aircraft, primarily for maintenance and repair. The satellite image from May 11 shows damage to the hangar and debris

next to the structure. A before image from April 30 shows the structure is intact. India struck air bases in Pakistan's Sindh province - Bholari, Jacobabad and Sukkur. It is one of the newest air bases of Pakistan, which became operational

During India's precision strikes on Pakistan, Bholari was chosen as a target, and India struck the hangar at the air base, causing severe damage to its roof, as shown in an image from May 11. A satellite picture from April 27, when tensions between India and Pakistan were still high post the Pahalgam attack, shows the hangar intact. Sukkur air base, located in the Sindh province, is a strategic air base for Pakistan, which lies west of the International border with Rajasthan. Sukkur, Jacocabad and Bholari are located in Sindh. Sukkur is operated by Pakistan's Southern Air Command. A satellite image from May 10 shows severe structural damage at the base and massive debris on the side. There was vegetation burn that may



have been caused by fire after the strike, with a possible burn/strike scar next to the damaged structure. Nur Khan is a strategic air base situated between Rawalpindi and Islamabad - the two nerve centres of Pakistan. The former is the headquarters of the Pakistan military, and the latter is the political power centre of the country. The air base was earlier known as Chaklala. It was not the first time India struck Nur Khan. During the 1971 war, the 20 Squadron of the Indian Air Force

targeted the air base with their Hawker Hunters.

The satellite image from Maxar shows multiple buildings being destroyed during India's "measured and calibrated" strikes. A satellite image from April 25, taken almost two weeks ago, shows the structures intact. The air base is located in the Punjab province of Pakistan, and it is located 200 km south of Bahawalpur, the terrorist site targeted by India on May 7 during the first phase of Operation Sindoor. Air Marshal AK Bharti, during the press briefing, showed a video of extensive damage to the runway of the air base. A large crater was formed on the runway after the

The satellite images from Maxar locate the area which was hit by India. A huge crater was formed on the side of the runway of the air base. The Mushaf air base in Sargodha is a strategically important base of the Pakistan Air Force, which was targeted by India during Operation Sindoor. Sargodha is located west of Lahore and around 200 km from the international border with Punjab. The Indian Air Force, during the 1965 and 1971 wars, targeted Sargodha during its aerial campaign. The craters formed after Indian strikes were at least eight metres wide. During Operation Sindoor, Indian strikes damaged the runway at two locations of the airbase - One at an intersection and the other on the main runway. The images from May 10 show the runway being cratered after Indian strikes at the

two locations. The images from April 30 and May 10 show the extent of damage caused to the runway at Mushaf.

India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7 and attacked nine terror sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK) to avenge the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 people were shot dead. The Indian armed forces destroyed multiple camps of terror groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and Hizbul Mujahideen, and killed more than 100 terrorists. After India's overnight operations, the Pakistani Army launched drones and missiles at western parts of India, which were successfully intercepted. India then hit selected military targets deep inside Pakistani territory. The two countries reached a ceasefire agreement last Saturday to halt military actions with immediate effect after four days of intense cross-border drone and missile

## Pakistan says 11 military personnel killed during military confrontation with India

ISLAMABAD, (HS): Pakistan on Tuesday said that 11 military personnel were killed and 78 others injured during the recent military confrontation with India. In a statement, the military also claimed that 40 civilians died and 121 others were injured in the "unprovoked and reprehensible dastardly attacks" by India on the night of May 6-7. India and Pakistan reached an understanding on Saturday to end the conflict after four days of intense cross-border drone and missile strikes. While defending the motherland, 11 personnel of Pakistan's armed forces were killed and 78 others were wounded, the Pakistan military said. The victims from the Pakistan Air Force include Squadron Leader Usman Yousuf, Chief Technician Aurangzeb, Senior Technician Najeeb, Corporal Technician Farooq and Senior Technician Mubashir, it said. Naik Abdul Rehman, Lance Naik Dilawar Khan, Lance Naik Ikramullah, Naik Waqar Khalid, Sepoy Muhammad Adeel Akbar and Sepoy Nisar were among the army personnel killed in the strikes, it added. The Pakistan Armed Forces "mounted a resolute response under the banner of 'Marka-e-Haq', delivering precise and notch-up retributive strikes through Operation Bunyanum Marsoos," the statement said. Pakistan's armed forces, together with the people of Pakistan, pay solemn tribute to the deceased civilians and military personnel, it said. "Let there be no ambiguity: any attempt to challenge Pakistan's sovereignty or territorial integrity, ever again, shall be met with a swift, full-spectrum, and decisive response," it said.

#### Bangladesh's interim government strips former ruling party of registration

DHAKA, (HS): Bangladesh's Election Commission has cancelled the registration of the former ruling party of ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, preventing it from participating in the next national election, which is expected to be held by June next year. The decision on Monday came hours after the country's interim government headed by Nobel Peace Prize laureate Muhammad Yunus issued an official notification banning the Awami League party and its affiliated bodies from conducting activities online and elsewhere. Monday's formal notification from the Ministry of Home Affairs was issued two days after the interim Cabinet decided to ban all activities of the party under the country's Anti-Terrorism Act until a special tribunal concludes a trial for the party and its leaders. In the notification, the government said it outlawed all activities "including any kind of publication, media, online and social media" as well as "any kind of campaign, procession, meeting, gathering (or) conference until the trial of the leaders and activists ... is completed." It said the decision was effective immediately. Separately, the Election Commission said Monday it would not allow the Hasina-led party to contest the next election. Political parties must be registered with the Election Commission to take part in elections. A government adviser said Monday that anyone who posts comments online in support of the Awami League party would face arrest. On Sunday, the Awami League accused the interim government of "stoking division" and trampling on "democratic norms" by banning its activities. It said in a statement that the ban "stoked division within society, strangled democratic norms, fueled ongoing pogrom against dissenters and strangled inclusivity, all undemocratic steps.'

# Saudi crown prince welcomes Trump to kingdom as US leader begins four-day Middle East tour

US, (HS): President Donald Trump opened his four-day Middle East trip on Tuesday by paying a visit to Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, for talks on US efforts to dismantle Iran's nuclear program, end the war in Gaza, hold down oil prices and more. Prince Mohammed warmly greeted Trump as he stepped off Air Force One at King Khalid International Airport in the Saudi capital and kicked off his Middle East tour. The two leaders then retreated to a grand hall at the Riyadh airport, where Trump and his aides were served traditional Arabic coffee by waiting attendants wearing ceremonial gun-belts. The pomp began before Trump even landed. Royal Saudi Air Force F-15s provided an honorary escort for Air Force One as it approached the kingdom's capital. Trump and Prince Mohammed also were taking part in a lunch at the Royal Court, gathering with guests and aides in an ornate room with blue accents and massive crystal chandeliers. Several major business executives were invited to the event. including Blackstone Group CEO Stephen Schwarzman, BlackRock CEO Larry Fink, and Tesla and SpaceX CEO Elon Musk. Musk is also leading the Department of Government Efficiency, a controversial second term effort tasked with slashing waste, fraud and abuse in the US government. Later, the crown prince will fete Trump with a formal dinner. Trump is also slated to take part Tuesday in a US-Saudi investment conference. "When Saudis and Americans join forces, very good things happen more often than not, great things happen," Saudi Investment Minister



Khalid al-Falih said.

Saudi Arabia and fellow OPEC+ nations have already helped their cause with Trump early in his second term by stepping up oil production. Trump sees cheap energy as a key component to lowering costs and stemming inflation for Americans. The president has also made the case that lower oil prices will hasten an end to the Russia-Ukraine war. But Saudi Arabia's economy remains heavily dependent on oil, and the kingdom needs a fiscal break-even oil price of \$96 to \$98 a barrel to balance its budget. It's questionable how long OPEC+, of which Saudi Arabia is the leading member, is willing to keep production elevated. The price of a barrel of Brent crude closed Monday at \$64.77. "One of the challenges for the Gulf states of lower oil prices is it doesn't necessarily imperil economic diversification programs, but it certainly makes them harder," said Jon Alterman, a senior Middle East analyst at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington. Trump picked the kingdom for his first stop, because it has pledged to make big investments in the US, but Trump ended up traveling to Italy last month for Pope Francis' funeral. Riyadh was the first overseas stop of his first term. The three countries on the president's itinerary - Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates - are all places where the Trump Organization, run by Trump's two elder sons, is developing major real estate projects. They include a high-rise tower in Jeddah, a luxury hotel in Dubai and a golf course and villa complex in Qatar. Trump is trying to demonstrate that his transactional strategy for international politics is paying dividends as he faces criticism from Democrats who say his global tariff war and approach to Russia's war on Ukraine are isolating the United States from allies. He's expected to announce deals with the three wealthy countries that will touch on artificial intelligence, expanding energy cooperation and perhaps new arms sales to Saudi Arabia. The administration earlier this month announced initial approval to sell \$3.5 billion worth of air-to-air missiles for

Saudi Arabia's fighter jets. But Trump arrived in the Middle East at a moment when his top regional allies, Israel and Saudi Arabia, are far from neatly aligned with his approach. # Europe's Latest Warning to Russia Ahead of Putin-Zelensky Meet in Turkey

Istanbul, (HS): While US President Donald Trump "thinks" of flying to Turkey this week for possible talks between Ukraine and Russia over the ongoing war, the European leaders are threatening Moscow with a new round of punishing sanctions if it doesn't accept an unconditional ceasefire deal with Kyiv. In a fresh twist to the stopstart peace talks process, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky on Sunday accepted his Russian counterpart's offer of direct peace talks and said he would travel to Turkey and wait to meet President Vladimir Putin there on Thursday. Efforts to diplomatically end the war in Ukraine are speeding up before the proposed meeting in Istanbul on Thursday, with each party-- including Kyiv, Moscow, Washington and European leaders-wanting to achieve an outcome they

Ukraine and its European allies have demanded a 30-day ceasefire starting Monday -- calling it a prerequisite for direct peace talks between Kyiv and Moscow. European leaders have also threatened to immediately impose new sanctions on Russia if the Kremlin does not change its stance by the end of



Monday. "The clock is ticking - we still have 12 hours until the end of this day," said Stefan Kornelius, spokesperson of the German government, at a news conference. Moscow, meanwhile, rejected their call on Monday, despite threats. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said during his daily briefing that "the language of ultimatums is unacceptable to Russia". He later said that Moscow wanted "serious" negotiations to achieve peace in the conflict, which has left tens of thousands of people dead. Moreover, Defence ministers from five major

European military powers are also planning to meet in Italy on Friday to discuss support for Ukraine. Italian Defence Minister Guido Crosetto will host his counterparts from Britain, France, Germany and Poland, his

ministry said Monday in a statement. Trump has said that he was "thinking" of flying to Turkey for possible Russia-Ukraine talks. "I was thinking about actually flying over there. There's a possibility of it, I guess, if I think things can happen," the US President told journalists at the White House prior to departing for a trip to

the Middle East. "I think you may have a good result out of the Thursday meeting in Turkey between Russia and Ukraine, and I believe the two leaders are going to be there," he said. Asked if he would sanction Russia if President Vladimir Putin does not agree to a 30day ceasefire, Trump said: "I have a feeling they're going to agree. I do. I have a feeling." The US State Department said that Secretary of State Marco Rubio had spoken with his Turkish counterpart, Hakan Fidan, on Monday and thanked Turkey for "hosting and facilitating Russian and Ukrainian direct negotiations." Rubio, who is accompanying Trump on the Middle East visit, "welcomed the possibility of an immediate ceasefire," the State Department said.

## 13 killed as expired military munitions explode in Indonesia

Java, (HS): At least 13 people were killed in an explosion during a disposal of expired military ammunition in West Java Antara News has reported citing the Indonesian Defence Forces. The blast took place on Monday. Those who died include four military officers, who were part of the operation to dispose expired ammunition in Sagara village in West Java's Garut district. As per Antara News, the Chief of Indonesian military's (TNI) Information Office, Major General Kristomei Sianturi, said that their bodies have been evacuated to the Pameungpeuk Regional General Hospital for autopsy and pre-funeral handling. "We are coordinating with onsite officers to secure and clear the incident site as a precaution against other potential explosions," he said during a TV interview in Jakarta on Monday. Citing the military, Antara News reported that the explosion occurred at 9:30 am local time when Army officers were trying to dispose of expired and unused ammunition at a site belonging to the Garut District Natural Resources Conservation Agency (BKSDA). "The Garut BKSDA site has been regularly used for the disposal of

expired ammunition," Kristomei said. He further noted that the ammunition originated from Ammunition Depot No. 3 of the Indonesian Army Equipment Centre (Puspalad). As per Antara News, the four TNI officers killed in the accident were identified as Colonel Antonius Hermawan, Major Anda Rohanda, Second Corporal Eri Dwi Priambodo, and First Private Aprio Setiawan. The remaining victims were civilians - Agus bin Kasmin, Pian bin Obur, Iyus Ibing bin Inon, Anwar bin Inon, Iyus Rizal bin Saepuloh, Toto, Dadang, Rustiawan, and Endang. On March 31, a similar case involving expired munitions had taken place wherein the Indonesian Defence Forces (TNI) Commander General Agus Subiyanto confirmed that 65 tons of expired munitions had been affected by a fire and explosion that engulfed the Army ammunition depot in Ciangsana, Bogor District, West Java.

# Bangladesh: Pakistan High Commissioner Flees Country after His 'Scandalous Activities' Bring Shame to Islamabad

Dhaka, (HS): Pakistan's High Commissioner to Bangladesh, Syed Ahmed Maroof's sudden leave and disappearance from the country has set rumour mills abuzz, not only on social media but also in political and diplomatic circles from Dhaka to Islamabad

Citing sources in the Bangladesh's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, local media reported that Maroof has proceeded on an indefinite leave since May 11 and is currently outside the country. It was revealed that Maroof did not get any protocol nor any formalities as he cautiously left Dhaka for Pakistan on May 11 via Dubai on an Emirates flight. Pakistan's Deputy High Commissioner in Dhaka, Muhammad Asif, is serving as the Acting High Commissioner in the absence of Syed Ahmed Maruf. Normally, the Deputy High Commissioner takes over in the absence of an officer in such a position. Several social media posts indicated that Maroof,



who began his diplomatic duties in the country in December 2023, was recalled because of his involvement in a scandal involving a woman at a hotel in Cox's Bazar. "Ahmed Maroof was involved with one Hafiza Haque Shah, a senior official working with a Bangladeshi bank. Officials at the Pakistan Embassy also knew about this as she used to visit him regularly. But during Maroof's latest visit to Cox's Bazar, the issue of their immoral relationship came to the fore more conspicuous to suppress. That is why Pakistan has been forced to take back their important asset," an official stated on the condition of anonymity. Social media is abuzz about Maroof's scandalous activities with Shah. Inputs confirmed that, faced with a potential diplomatic embarrassment, Pakistan had no choice but to withdraw one of its key operatives from the Bangladeshi soil. According to the available details, Maroof had left Dhaka on May 8 for Cox's Bazar and was scheduled to return on May 10. This was his second visit to Cox's Bazar in three months. Earlier, Maroof had visited Cox's Bazar on February 6-7 for a vacation with his wife. During this time, he also held a long meeting with a team of Rohingyas -Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army (ARSA) and Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI) in the presence of Jamaat Amir Shafiqur Rahman. These two groups are under extremism. On February 8, for the first time in 16 years, a party workers' conference was held in Cox's Bazar in the presence of the Jamaat Ameer. The conference was organised by the Cox's Bazar district branch of Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami. Sources further stated that in the last nine months, Maroof had been criss-crossing the nation, convening meetings, engaging with fringe groups in the volatile political environment of Muhammad Yunus's Bangladesh and shaping a network designed to reassert Pakistani influence through soft power and ideological infiltration.

During the call on Monday, Abdelatty outlined

Egypt's ongoing mediation efforts, undertaken in coordination with Qatar and the US, "to resume the ceasefire, facilitate the release of hostages and detainees, and ensure uninterrupted delivery of humanitarian, medical, and shelter aid into the war-torn enclave," according to the ministry's statement. The Egyptian top diplomat also briefed Fidan on preparations for the Cairo

# US-China tariff deal may undercut India's trade advantage

New Delhi, (HS): With the US and China reaching an agreement to significantly reduce tariffs on each other's imports, India may lose the edge it had gained from the earlier imposition of reciprocal duties. The US had initially levied an additional 26% tariff on imports from India-much lower than the 145% imposed on Chinese goods. At the time, the view was that this skewed tariff structure could help India attract manufacturing operations shifting out of China. However, on Monday, China and the US reached a deal under which the US will cut tariffs on Chinese imports from 145% to 30%, while China will reduce duties on US products from 125% to 10%. These reductions will not impact any sector-specific tariffs or exemptions that existed prior to April 2, 2025.

Currently, Indian goods face a 10% baseline duty in the US, after Washington decided to pause the 26% reciprocal tariff for 90 days. The narrowing of this tariff gap could intensify competition for Indian exporters. "It could entail stark competition for Indian exporters considering the narrowing of the tariff gaps between Chinese and Indian exports," says Krishan Arora, Partner and Leader, India Investment Advisory Services at Grant Thornton Bharat LLP. He adds that India Inc must now revisit its production and logistics costs and develop more efficient value chains to remain competitive in export markets. Since the US ramped up tariffs on Chinese imports to 145%, India had hoped to benefit from the high tariff differential. iPhone maker Apple had even announced that the majority of

# Coal Imports Drops by 9.2%



New Delhi, (HS): Coal imports in the country declined by 9.2 per cent to 220.3 million tonnes (MT) during April 2024 to February 2025 - compared to 242.6 MT in the same period of previous fiscal year due to an increase in domestic production, the government said on Tuesday. This reduction in coal imports resulted in foreign exchange savings of approximately \$6.93 billion (?53137.82 crore) for the country, said the Ministry of Coal.

The non-regulated sector, excluding the power sector, experienced a more significant decline, with imports dropping by 15.3 per cent year-onvear. Although coal-based power generation grew by 2.87 per cent from April 2024 to February 2025 compared to the previous year, imports for blending by thermal power plants sharply decreased by 38.8 per cent. This highlights India's ongoing efforts to reduce its dependence on imported coal and enhance self-sufficiency in coal production, the statement explained. The government has implemented several initiatives, including Commercial Coal Mining and Mission Coking Coal, to enhance domestic coal production and reduce imports. These efforts have also led to an encouraging 5.45 per cent growth in coal output during the April 2024 to February 2025 period, compared to the same period of FY 2023-24. India's coal sector plays a pivotal role in supporting its rapidly growing economy, with coal serving as a primary energy source for critical industries like power, steel and cement, etc. However, the country faces a significant challenge in meeting its domestic coal demand, especially for coking coal and high-grade thermal coal, which are in short supply within the country's reserves. As a result, coal imports have been vital to meet the needs of key sectors, including steel.

The Ministry of Coal has been implementing strategic measures to strengthen domestic production and ensure a secure coal supply, aligning with India's goals of reducing coal imports and enhancing energy security. By prioritising domestic coal output, the government aims to march ahead towards Viksit Bharat goal by building a self-reliant, sustainable energy framework that supports long-term economic growth, the statement added.

# World trade chief says global free trade is in a 'crisis'

TOKYO, (HS): Global free trade is in crisis, the head of the World Trade Organization chief said Tuesday while meeting Japanese Prime Minister Shigaru Ishiba on Tuesday. Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, director-general of the World Trade Organization, told Ishiba that she has high expectations for Japan as a champion of open markets as US President Donald Trump disrupts world commerce with his fast-changing tariffs and other policies.

"Trade is facing very challenging times right now and it is quite difficult," she said. "We should try to use this crisis as an opportunity to solve the challenges we have and take advantage of new trends in trade." Japan, as "a champion of the multilateral trading system" must help maintain, strengthen and reform the WTO, the Japanese Foreign Ministry cited her as saying. They met a day after the United States and China said they had agreed to slash recent skyhigh tariffs for 90 days to allow time for negotiations. ## India's Retail Inflation Eases to 3.16 Pc in April

New Delhi, (HS): India's retail inflation fell to 3.16 per cent in April from 3.34 per cent in March to its lowest level since July 2019, as food prices eased further bringing respite to household budgets, according to figures released by the Ministry of Statistics on




Tuesday.Food inflation, which accounts for nearly half of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) basket, slowed to 1.78 per cent in April, compared to 2.69 per cent in March. This is for the third month in row that inflation has stayed below the RBI's 4 per cent medium-term target and will enable the central bank to continue with its soft money policy to spur economic growth.

India's annual inflation rate based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) declined to 3.34 per cent in March this year, compared to the same month of the previous year, which was the lowest level since August 2019. Retail inflation in the country has been on a declining trend in recent months. The Reserve Bank's Monetary Policy Committee has reduced its inflation forecast for 2025-26 to 4 per cent from 4.2 per cent earlier as the "outlook for food inflation has turned decisively positive," said RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra during the monetary policy review meeting recently. The outlook for food inflation has turned decisively positive. The uncertainties regarding rabi crops have abated considerably and the second advance estimates point to a record wheat production and higher production of key pulses over that last year, the RBI Governor pointed out. He observed that along with robust kharif arrivals, this is expected to set the stage for a durable softening of food inflation. "The sharp decline in inflation expectations in our latest survey for three months and one year ahead would also help anchor inflation expectations, going ahead," he pointed out.

Furthermore, the fall in crude oil prices augurs well for the inflation outlook. Concerns on lingering global market uncertainties and recurrence of adverse weather-related supply disruptions, however, pose upside risks to the inflation trajectory. He said that taking all these factors into consideration, and assuming a normal monsoon, CPI inflation for the financial year 2025-26 is projected at 4.0 per cent, with Q1 at 3.6 per cent; Q2 at 3.9 per cent; Q3 at 3.8 per cent; and Q4 at 4.4 per cent. Malhotra also sees the risks are evenly balanced.

On Monday, Sensex and Nifty had logged their biggest intraday gains in the last four years amid easing geopolitical tensions between India and Pakistan. IT stocks bore the brunt of the sell-off on Tuesday, with heavyweights like Infosys, TCS, and HCL Technologies sliding 3-4% on profit booking. Auto and FMCG sectors also saw steep declines, reflecting broader market weakness. However, PSU banking, pharma, and defence stocks bucked the trend, eking out modest gains. Broader markets displayed a mixed trend. The small-cap index ended in positive territory, while the mid-cap index closed flat. "The relief-driven surge-fuelled by easing global and domestic risks, including a reduction in trade war tensions and Indo-Pak geopolitical stress-appears to be taking a breather," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited. He added, "This consolidation is primarily affecting large-cap stocks, while mid- and small-cap segments continue to gain traction. This divergence is expected to persist, supported by broad-based earnings improvements reflected in Q4 results

# Bharti Airtel Q4 results: Profit after tax soars 503% to 12,475 crore

**New Delhi, (HS):** Bharti Airtel has reported a net profit of 12,475 crore in the fourth quarter of financial year 2024-25, registering a growth of 503 per cent from Q4 profit of 2,068.2 crore during the previous financial year. The company's revenue from operations increased 27 per cent to 47,876.2 crore, compared to last year's Q4 revenue of 37,599.1 crore. The company attributed the rise in revenue to currency revenue growth in Africa, "(Revenue rise was) driven by strong underlying momentum in India, rebound in reported currency revenue growth in Africa and full quarter impact of Indus Towers consolidation.", the company said in an exchange filing.

# Major ports' cargo rises 4.3% in FY25; PPA & DPA cross 150 MT

New Delhi/Paradip, (DMC): India's Major Ports have consistently demonstrated remarkable progress over the past decade, with FY 2024-25 emerging as a milestone year in terms of cargo handling, operational efficiency, and infrastructure modernisation.

In FY 2024-25, Major Ports registered an impressive annual growth rate of 4.3% in cargo handling, increasing from 819 million tonnes in FY 2023-24 to ~855 million tonnes in FY 2024-25. This growth highlights the resilience and capacity of Major Ports in accommodating rising trade volumes. The increase in traffic was driven by higher container throughput (10%), fertilizer cargo handling (13%), POL cargo handling (3%), and handling of miscellaneous commodities (31%) compared to the previous fiscal year. Among commodities handled at Major Ports, Petroleum, Oil, and Lubricants (POL)-including crude, petroleum products, and LPG/LNG-led the charts with a volume of 254.5 million tonnes (29.8%), followed by container traffic



at 193.5 million tonnes (22.6%), coal at 186.6 million tonnes (21.8%), and other cargo categories such as iron ore, pellets, fertilizers, and more in FY 2024-25.


# Vijay Sethupathi starrer 'Ace' trailer out now
