

#### "SC Is Chief Justice-Centric, **Needs to Change'': Justice**



New Delhi, (HS) Making an important observation and calling for reform, Supreme Court judge AS Oka, whose last working day was on Friday, said the court is Chief Justice-centric and needs to change. Justice Oka also hinted that this change may come under the new Chief Justice, BR Gavai, who took charge earlier this month and will remain in the post until his retirement in November. Speaking at his farewell organised by the Supreme Court Bar Association, Justice Oka said High Courts function more democratically than the Supreme Court.

"The high courts function through committees, while the Supreme Court is Chief Justice of India-centric. It needs to change. You will see this change with the new CJI," he said, adding, "I am very happy that Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna (who retired on May 13) took us forward on the path of transparency. He took decisions after taking every judge of the Supreme Court into confidence. Justice Gavai has democratic values in his blood." Pointing out other areas in which the top tier of the judiciary could improve, Justice Oka said the Supreme Court and the High Courts have ignored the trial courts. "We should also think about trial courts and the common man. There are too many cases pending in our trial and district courts... Never call a trial court a subordinate court. This is against constitutional values... It is a difficult task to punish someone after 20 years," he explained. Recalling his judicial journey, Justice Oka said many people had asked him how he was feeling about demitting office. "Judges have the freedom to do justice and you don't have that freedom when you are no longer a judge. After 21 years and nine months, and having been a judge of three constitutional courts, judgeship becomes life, and life becomes judgeship."

He emphasised that he had no regrets that he became a judge and gave up what would have probably been a more financially rewarding career 'When a successful lawyer Continued P-4

# Northeast Transformed From Backward Frontier Region To Growth Front-Runner: PM



New Delhi, (HS): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday gave a clarion call to India Inc. to reap the first mover advantage for investing in the northeast states as the region has been transformed, in the last 11 years, from a backward "frontier region to a growth front-runner." Addressing the Rising North East Investors Summit in the national capital, PM Modi said the

government's policy had accorded priority in development to the northeast, as a result of which the region has now come to the centre stage of India's growth story.

He highlighted that as part of this policy, Union Cabinet ministers had visited the northeast states more than 700 times, and he also had made a night stay mandatory for them

during their visit. This enabled the Centre to get a first-hand feel of the ground reality and the aspirations of the people in drawing up the strategy for development, he explained. The development of the northeast is not only a brick and mortar story reflected in the massive infrastructure development of the region, but also an "emotional connect" which has resulted in

highlighted that more than 11,000 km of highways, hundreds of km of railway lines and the development of waterways formed part of this infrastructure development that has increased connectivity in the region. Besides, the large number of mobile towers providing 4G and 5G connectivity and a 1600 km pipeline gas grid have been constructed in the state.

This infrastructure is the backbone that industry can now use to take the development further, as there is now adequate power, highways and logistics in the region. He also highlighted that peace has returned to the region as over 10,000 youths have given up guns to come back to the mainstream, as the government has followed a zero tolerance policy towards

the remarkable growth in the region, he remarked. PM Modi said the infrastructure revolution in the northeast has now transformed the long-time backward region into a land of opportunity. The PM

#### **CM Reviews Works** Projects for Bhubaneswar-**Cuttack Twin City**



Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi today reviewed various ongoing projects of the Works Department in Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Twin City at Lok Seva Bhawan. The meeting focused on discussions regarding the integrated development plan for Bhubaneswar and the traffic decongestion plan.

The proposed projects include an elevated corridor from Jayadev Vihar to Nandankanan, construction of a road along the Daya West Canal from Patia Station Chhak to Suanga Mouza, widening of the Sundarpada-Jatni road, and the construction of three

flyovers at Kalpana Chhak, Museum, and Shishu Bhawan Chhak, along with an underpass at AG Chhak. Additionally, work is underway on a left parallel road from the Institute Mathematics Pathargadia, Utkal Hospital, and Rail Vihar to Ekamra Kanan. Plans have also been made for three right access roads from Damana to Press Chhak, Kalarahanga to Barimunda, and Kelucharan Park to Barimunda. Furthermore, an inner ring road will be constructed. The Chief Minister expressed optimism that these projects will address the growing traffic issues in Bhubaneswar and contribute

## **Application Process** For +2 Admissions **Begins Tomorrow**

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): The Directorate of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha, has announced that the application process for admissions to plus two courses will commence on May 24 (Saturday) and will continue till June 30. The application process will be conducted online, and students can apply on the SAMS portal (www.samsodisha.gov.in). The first merit list is expected to be released on July 7, and the admission process will take place from July 8 to 14. Classroom teaching for the first year of plus two is scheduled to begin on July 24. The notification has been issued for over 1,600 higher secondary schools in the state, including self-financing colleges and vocational education colleges. Students are advised to carefully read the Common Application Form (CAF) before filling it out, as only online applications will be accepted. No offline forms will be entertained. Students can access the CAF on the SAMS portal from May 24 and apply till June 30. The Directorate of Higher Secondary Education has urged students to follow the guidelines and ensure the timely submission of their applications.

# Operation Sindoor Sparked Panic in Pakistan Army, Intercept Reveals Post

New Delhi, (HS): The Indian Army's recent precision strikes under Operation Sindoor triggered chaos and panic within the Pakistani military ranks, with intercepts revealing that several of its officers abandoned their posts during the offensive.

According to sources in the Indian Army, intercepted communications show that a commander of the Pakistani Army's 75th Infantry Brigade, stationed near the Line of Control (LoC) in Pakistanoccupied Kashmir (PoK), refused to return to his post during the operation. When junior officers contacted him to inquire about the reopening of the office,



the commander reportedly replied, "The office will open later, save your lives first."The 75th Infantry Brigade, based near Muzaffarabad, was among the units targeted in the Indian

Army's assault on terror infrastructure across the border. Multiple camps, including those in the Sawai Nala area and Syedna Bilal Camp, were destroyed in the attack, eliminating more than

100 terrorists and decimating two key launch pads. In another intercepted communication shared by the Indian Army with IANS, junior Pakistani officers could be heard saying: "Our commander sahab escaped with great difficulty. He's offering namaz in a mosque. He's sent his men here and said he will return only when things calm down." The panic was compounded by casualties within the Pakistani Army. One intercept confirmed the death of Captain Hasnain Shah of the 16th Baloch Regiment, who was killed in the Haji Peer sector. His body was reportedly brought back to Abbottabad by the 6th Pakistani

Brigade, Indian Army officials estimate that at least 64 Pakistani soldiers were killed and over 96 wounded in India's retaliatory strikes. As per the army, India did not target civilian or nonmilitary infrastructure, focusing solely on terror hubs and those providing cover to militants.

Operation Sindoor was launched in response to the brutal killing of 26 Indian tourists in Pahalgam on April 22 by Pakistan-backed terrorists. In a swift counteroffensive, Indian forces struck nine terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistanoccupied Kashmir, neutralising top terrorists and dismantling


## **Ukraine War**

Last year, US President Donald Trump claimed he would end the war in Ukraine within "24 hours". More recently, he suggested that the conflict could only be resolved through an inperson meeting between himself and Russian President Vladimir Putin. Following a two-hour phone call with Putin on Monday, Trump said that any peace agreement would have to be negotiated directly between Russia and Ukraine. This sudden pivot away from his earlier stance underscores the complex nature of the ongoing deadlock between Ukraine and Russia. Even as Trump posted on social media that Kyiv and Moscow would "immediately start" negotiations for a ceasefire, Putin rejected a US-proposed 30-day unconditional ceasefire - one Ukraine has already agreed to. The Russian President has consistently rejected such proposals, arguing that a temporary halt would allow Ukraine time to regroup and rearm. He instead reiterated on Monday Moscow's demand for addressing what he calls the "root causes" of the conflict. In February, Trump had announced that peace talks would begin "immediately". Back then, however, Kyiv was not invited to the table, prompting European leaders to rally around Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Today, both Trump and Zelenskyy appear to have moved on from their infamous televised spat in late February, and they recently signed the muchtouted critical minerals deal. Washington is now making efforts to bring both Kyiv and Moscow into direct negotiations. Yet, the core obstacles to peace remain unchanged: Russia currently occupies about a fifth of Ukraine and insists that Kviv cede this land, which would eventually be rendered permanently "neutral". Ukraine insists on a full Russian withdrawal and seeks NATO membership as a long-term security guarantee. There is no quick fix. Less than a week ago, Russia and Ukraine held their first direct peace talks (proposed by Putin) since 2022 in Istanbul. While they failed to make meaningful progress on the territory issue, the two delegations agreed to exchange 1,000 prisoners of war each.

A Ukrainian delegate reportedly described Moscow's demands as "detached from reality". Still, the mere fact that these direct talks took place is significant. The next crucial step must be securing an immediate ceasefire - creating the space needed to tackle the more difficult questions surrounding a lasting peace agreement. Putin reportedly declined to attend the Istanbul meeting despite being invited by Zelenskyy. For a way out, leadership must rise above optics and meaningful engagement must be prioritised.

# "Influencers, wake up! Responsibility should also go viral"

Today, the influence of influencers on social media is rapidly increasing on society and politics. They influence public opinion without accountability, especially in elections. Unlike traditional media, there is no clear code of conduct for them. In such a situation, to maintain the transparency and fairness of democracy, it is important that they are also monitored and accountable. The Election Commission and the government should take concrete steps in this direction. Along with freedom of social media, responsibility is equally important.

In today's digital age, social media has become an integral part of our lives. It is not only a powerful medium of communication, but has also become an important platform for public opinion formation, social awareness and political debate. The influence of influencers on platforms like Twitter, Instagram, YouTube and Facebook is no longer limited to entertainment, but they have also started guiding

public thinking on social and political matters. In such a situation, it is natural to ask whether these influencers should have any moral or legal accountability? Should they also follow impartiality like is expected from journalists? Social media influencers are people who have thousands or millions of followers. Their thoughts, reactions, reviews and comments influence people. Many brands and companies promote their products with the help of these influencers. Now this influence is not only economic, but it has also penetrated deeply into the social and political sphere. In the 2024 Lok Sabha elections and the assembly elections in many states, it was clearly seen how social media influencers are playing the role of campaigners for political parties. They directly share posts, make videos or conduct live debates in support or opposition of a particular party. Most of these posts contain promotional material, but it is not clear whether it is 'paid' or not. There is a guideline of the Election Commission to monitor paid news in traditional media, but this new world of social media does not have this control. The Supreme Court and various High Courts have also expressed concern from time to time about the monitoring of misinformation, hate speech and election campaigns on social media. Technology may have given people freedom of expression, but when this freedom is exercised without any responsibility, it starts weakening democracy.



an internet connection. In such a situation, there is a thin line between journalism and the role of influencers, which needs to be clearly marked. There is a code of conduct for journalists, there is a Press Council, there is accountability of news organizations. But no such mechanism exists for social media influencers.

Two things are important here - one, the freedom of

here - one, the freedom of influencers and second, their responsibility. Freedom does not mean that they spread any kind of information or idea without checking the facts. If they are propagating a political ideology or influencing public opinion in favor of a particular party, then it is important that they do it in a transparent manner and it is clear that they are working under an agenda. Apart from this, considering the posts or videos of influencers as paid promotion, the Election Commission should

the same way promotional posts on social media should also be monitored. After all, the strength of democracy lies in its transparency and fairness. If any medium - be it traditional media or social media - behaves in a biased manner, it affects public opinion and weakens the roots of democracy. On the other hand, many influencers may argue that they are free citizens and have the right to support any idea. This argument is correct to some extent, but when a person or group is influencing the opinion of millions of people through their ideas, then they also have a social and moral responsibility. Influencers must understand that their words are not limited to entertainment or promotion of beauty products, but they can also influence social concerns and

influence, they must also accept accountability.

It is time that the government. Election Commission, and society take concrete steps in this direction. Social media platforms should also monitor the activities of their users and make technical arrangements to identify paid advertising. Also, a framework should be created that brings influencers under the ambit of code of conduct and also binds them to transparency and fairness. The need of the hour is that we should not only talk about freedom of expression but also give equal importance to its responsibility accountability. For the success of democracy, it is essential that

accountability. For the success of democracy, it is essential that every platform, every medium and every voice is fair, responsible and truthful - be it a newspaper editorial, a TV debate or an Instagram post.

It is believed that worshipping this tree on Savitri Brata brings blessings of good fortune. One of the key rituals involves Sadhava women tying a thread around the tree, symbolising their prayers and hopes for prosperity and well-being.

In the epic Mahabharata, we find the inspiring tale of King Ashwapati, who ruled over the Madra country. In his desire for a child, he organised a yagna to invoke the goddess Savitri, who eventually appeared to him. Upon her arrival, she urged Ashwapati to request a suitable groom for his future child. Though the king longed for a son, the goddess informed him that it would not be possible, yet blessed him with a virtuous daughter. This led to the birth of a remarkable girl named Savitri, whom Ashwapati cherished as a blessing from the goddess. As Savitri grew into adulthood, her father encouraged her to seek a husband. Determined and resolute, she ventured forth with her companions to find a suitable mate. Satyavan, the son of Dyumatsen, the king of Shalva, faced challenges during his early life when his father became blind due to divine misfortune, forcing them into a life of seclusion in the forest. Despite this, Satyavan showed unwavering devotion to his parents, living modestly on fruits and roots. During her travels, Savitri encountered Satyavan and was deeply moved by his commitment to caring for his father and his virtuous character. Choosing love over material wealth, she resolved to marry him. After returning to inform her father of her choice, sage Narada



warned her that Satyavan had only one year to live, urging Savitri to reconsider. Nevertheless, Savitri stood firm in her decision, and with the blessing of both families, the couple wed and settled into a humble life in a hut in Tapovan, where Savitri devoted herself to her in-laws.

In Sanatana Dharma, Sati Savitri is celebrated as one of the five revered Satis: Anusuya- Honoured as the epitome of devotion, she was the wife of sage Atri and demonstrated her power of Sati-vows by transforming the three goddesses into boys to teach them a lesson about humility. Draupadi- The daughter of King Drupada, she is renowned for her steadfastness and virtue as the wife of the five Pandavas, embodying the qualities of a great Satibrata. Sulakhana- As the wife of Meghnad (Indrajit), Ravana's son, she also holds the title of a Sati. Savitri - The dedicated daughter of Maharaja Ashwapati, Savitri's extraordinary virtues enabled her to bring her husband Satyavan back from the clutches of Yama, the god of death. Manadodri- Another distinguished Sati, she was Ravana's wife.

The festival of Savitri Amavasya, or Savitri Brata, is a significant observance for married women in Odisha. Occurring on the no-moon day of the month of Jyestha, this

fast is undertaken with great reverence. On this auspicious day, married women participate by fasting and recounting the tale of Savitri and Satyavan, seeking blessings for their husbands' long lives. As Savitri's first wedding anniversary approached, she engaged in a three-night fast. On the final day, as they gathered fruits and herbs, Satyavan fell asleep in her lap-this was the moment he passed away. Undeterred, Savitri continued to hold her husband's head, refusing to let go even when Yama's messengers arrived for him. When Yama himself appeared to take Satyavan, Savitri, driven by her devotion, followed him and was granted three boons. Instead of asking for Satyavan's life, she prioritised her family's needs and insisted on her husband's return. Moved by her unwavering love, Yama ultimately restored

Satyavan to life. Savitri Osha is celebrated on Jyeshtha Amavasya, where women observe a fast and engage in prayers until the afternoon. After completing their rituals, they may enjoy fruits like bananas, mangoes, pineapples and other village fruits. The story of Savitri and Satyavan is recited either beneath the moonlight or at home during the fasting period, with devotion directed towards Maa Savitri, the goddess worshipped during this puja.

# Odisha Crime Branch Arrests Two From MP In 1.5 Cr Cyber Fraud Case Cuttack, (DMC): The Cyber Crime Unit of Odisha's Criminal Bhubaneswar. The investigat has resulted in the seizure

Cuttack, (DMC): The Cyber Crime Unit of Odisha's Criminal Investigation Department (CID), Crime Branch, has apprehended two persons in connection with a massive investment fraud involving Rs. 1.5crore. The accused have been identified as Tayyab Khan (23) and Firoz Khan (36) from Bhopal and Ratlam in Madhya Pradesh.

The arrests were made on the basis of a case registered under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the IT Act, 2000 following a complaint lodged on January 29 this year at the Cyber Crime Police Station in Bhubaneswar. As per an official press release, according to the complainant from Bhubaneswar, unknown cyber fraudsters lured him with promises of high returns through international metal





trading, including investments in Initial Public Offerings (IPOs) and Over-The-Counter (OTC) trades. The victim was persuaded to transfer Rs. 1,50,50,000 to the fraudsters. Despite incurring initial losses, he was coerced into investing more. When he attempted to withdraw his funds, the fraudsters demanded additional payments and refused to release his money, leading him to realize he had been scammed. Led by Deputy Superintendent of Police Diptimayee Mallick, investigating team

transaction details and digital evidence. Their efforts led to a crackdown in Ratlam and Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, where they identified and arrested two key perpetrators: Tayyab Khan (23) from Bhopal and Firoz Khan (36) from Ratlam. The accused, who posed as trade analysts, allegedly defrauded the complainant of Rs. 1,50,50,000 through their investment scam. Both Tayyab and Firoz have been brought to Odisha on transit remand from courts in Ratlam and Bhopal and were presented

# Odisha govt comes up with action plan for management of flood & water logging in urban areas

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Odisha government has come up with action plan for management of possible flood and water logging in urban areas during Monsoon-2025. The State government issued the action plan as the probabilistic forecasts for the southwest monsoon season (June to September) of 2025 indicates that most parts of the State of Odisha may experience abovenormal rainfall and the urban areas/pockets may experience waterlogging and flood-like situations due to heavy-rain, flood situations.In light of the potential risks arising from excessive rainfall, floods, and cyclones, it is imperative to undertake following preventive and preparatory

measures on an urgent basis, said Director Municipal Administration (i/c) Debasis Singh to the Municipal Commissioners of all Municipal Corporations and the Executive Officers of all Municipalities / N.A.CsULBs shall inspect all drainage channels under their jurisdiction and ensure timely desilting and necessary clearance of choked or clogged sections to maintain proper flow and prevent waterlogging.Ensure 100% verification of all drains and manholes (both open and

jurisdiction. For closed drains and manholes, check for any damage or vulnerability in the covers that could pose safety risks. Undertake immediate repair and covering of damaged or open manholes and drains. Where repair is not immediately feasible, install appropriate warning signage to caution the public. Ensure covering of drains with slabs and installation of safety nets at vulnerable points with adequate warning signage to prevent accidents.Strictly monitor and prevent the piling of construction and demolition debris inside drains and along roadsides. encroachments Remove obstructing the flow of storm water, rainwater, or wastewater in drain channels. Initiate legal proceedings, wherever necessary, against defaulters to prevent further encroachments. Install bar screens in secondary/tertiary drains and wire mesh at outfalls to filter solid waste. Ensure proper disposal of collected waste and map human resources to regularly clear screens, especially during heavy rainfall.ULBs shall notify the concerned department such as the Drainage Division or Minor Irrigation Division of Water Resources Department of



any choked or clogged drainage channels identified during inspection that fall outside their jurisdiction, to ensure appropriate follow-up action. Take all possible measures to clear urban roads blocked due to tree falling and other reasons immediately after cyclone. Co-ordinate with Fire Services and other line Departments for logistic assistance like tree- cutters etc.Any damaged urban roads should be restored to motorable conditions within 72 hours after cyclone/flood utilizing own funds or any permissible grants. Supply of drinking water to affected areas must be ensured by the PHEO/ WATCO in close co-ordination with ULBs. Any damage to Water Supply System be repair and restored within least possible time.Identification of Flood-Prone/

Vulnerable Points and De-Watering Arrangements: Identify waterlogging prone and low-lying areas. Deploy pump sets in advance at strategic locations to ensure prompt de-watering during emergencies.Identify zones for cities and designated zone level officers may be assigned to carry out emergency services during cyclone/flood situations. Verify operational status of equipment like pump sets, DG sets, Generator & inflatable tower light and prepare a list of inventories of machines and equipment available with the ULBs and other line Departments. Arrangement and management of shelters:ULBs having MCS/MFS shall utilize them, during time of emergency. In addition, ULBs shall Identify public buildings like schools/colleges for use as shelters

structural stability of all cyclone shelter and carry out necessary repairs if needed, ensure proper electrification, drinking water supply systems, approach roads and display clear and visible signage to guide people to shelters during emergencies. Sanitation of all facilities, including clean and functional toilets be ensured.Lady home guards/security personnel may be deployed in the shelters to take care of women, children, old and other vulnerable people. Local volunteers, WSHG members must be identified, briefed and deployed in all the shelters. Provision of cooked food in the shelter may be made in case the evacuated persons are required to stay more than a day.In the rainy season, due to flood like situation, there may be outbreak of common vectorborne diseases like malaria, dengue & Japanese encephalitis & water borne diseases like diarrhea and jaundice. Following works may be undertaken to address the issue. Waterlogging in habitation areas should be completely avoided during the rainy season to prevent outbreaks of vector-borne

diseases. Proper sanitation measures must be taken with utmost care, ensuring cooperation from all relevant departments. Apply larvicides and bleaching powder in waterlogged areas, cover and seal septic tanks and soak pits, and ensure that water containers are properly covered to prevent mosquito breeding. Ensure proper disposal of garbage and unused items such as plastic containers and tyres near households, which can collect stagnant water and become mosquito breeding grounds. Conduct regular fogging activities

in ULB areas as a priority measure to control mosquito populations and reduce the risk of disease outbreaks.All ULBs are requested for opening of Control Room headed by dedicated officer in charge of Control Room. This Control Room shall be managed by officials on roster duty basis during the operation period. The Control Room should become very active and provide all necessary assistance & coordination to public during monsoon and emergency situations.


### **Protest against Goa Carbon for** demolition of shops & settlements



department reported that the arrival of paddy is ongoing. On May 22, the mandis of Bargarh district processed 564688 bags of paddy, while 518149 bags were received overall. Specifically, 251862 bags arrived at the Attabira RMC, and 215715 at the Bargarh RMC, with further incoming at Padmapur RMC.

With 789707 bags or 340980.57 quintals received, it has been particularly challenging for the farmers, as 4,587 bags equate to 1,980.58 quintals in the mandis. Likewise, 424883 bags have been received across

Padmapur RMC. The weather hasn't been kind, with a thunderstorm warning looming overhead. Fields are abundant with paddy, yet farmers find themselves in distress.Despite the Rabi paddy harvesting starting on May 14, conditions have not improved. The mandis are still not operating at full capacity, and many farmers are feeling the weight of uncertainty regarding their crops.

While some paddy remains harvested in fields, there are still bags in the markets. Many farmers, holding onto their crops at home or drying them on the roadside, haven't yet brought their paddy to market due to a lack of suitable conditions. Frustration grows as farmers grapple with unsatisfactory prices and persistent doubts about the sale process. The unchanged circumstances regarding previous promises

from the administration only intensify their worries. The forecast of a Kalabaishakhi storm, along with rain and hail, has left these hardworking individuals restless, fearing for their livelihoods. Amidst all this, the slow progress in lifting paddy has only compounded the situation, as day by day, more arrive while existing stocks remain.

Although some relief has been noted, the issue is not resolved. The challenges from past irregularities in the Akhaa Basta incident still loom over the community, and farmers in Bargarh are advocating for meaningful change. Their ongoing requests for improvements, especially regarding gunny bags, underscore their commitment to resolving these pressing matters. They sincerely hope that the decisions from the DLPC meeting will be implemented soon, allowing them to move forward.

# SC raps Rajasthan on rising student suicides

New Delhi, (HS): The Supreme Court on Friday grilled the Rajasthan government over the surge in student suicides in the city of Kota calling the situation "serious." A bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and R Mahadevan said 14 suicide cases were reported from the city so far this year. "What are you doing as a state? Why are these children dying by suicide and only in Kota? Have you not given a thought as a state?" Justice Pardiwala asked the counsel representing state of Rajasthan. The counsel said a special investigation team (SIT) was formed in the state to examine cases of suicides. The top court was hearing a matter over the death of a 22-year-old student studying in IIT, Kharagpur. The student was found dead in hostel room on May 4. It was also dealing with another case of a girl, who was a NEET aspirant and was found dead in her room in Kota where she lived with her parents. The bench learnt that an FIR was lodged in connection with the death of IIT Kharagpur's student.

#### **Maharashtra: 4 Maoists neutralised** in encounter

Gadchiroli, (HS): Four hardcore Maoists were neutralised in an intense exchange of fire with Gadchiroli Police and CRPF personnel near the Maharashtra-Chhattisgarh border on Friday morning, following a targeted anti-Naxal operation launched based on credible intelligence.

According to the release, the operation, led by Additional SP Ramesh, involved 12 C60 commando teams, comprising around 300 personnel, and a CRPF unit. The operation was initiated on Thursday at noon from Kawande and Nelgunda, moving towards the Indravati riverbank near the recently opened Forward Operating Base (FOB) Kawande, despite heavy rainfall in the area. On Friday morning, while laying a cordon and searching the Maoists riverbank, opened indiscriminate fire on the C60 commandos, prompting effective retaliation. The heavy exchange of fire lasted nearly two hours. A subsequent area search led to the recovery of four Maoist bodies, one automatic Self Loading Rifle, two .303 rifles, and a Bharmar. Additionally, walkie-talkies, camping materials, and Naxal literature were seized from the spot. Anti-Naxal operations and area searches are ongoing to locate remaining Maoists. Earlier on May 21, in a major blow to the Maoist insurgency, security forces in Chhattisgarh killed 27 Naxals, including CPI-Maoist General Secretary Nambala Keshav Rao alias Basavaraju, during a massive joint operation in the Abujmarh forests of Narayanpur district.

The Inspector General (IG) of Bastar Range in Chhattisgarh, P Sundarraj, on Wednesday said that the joint operation that killed 27 naxals, including CPI-M General Secretary Nambala Keshav Rao, alias Basavaraju, was carried out by District Reserve Guard (DRG) teams from Narayanpur, Dantewada, Bijapur, and Kondagaon.

The bench referred to a March 24 verdict of the top court which took note of recurring cases of student suicides in higher educational institutions and formed a national task force to address the mental health concerns of students and prevent

On Friday, the bench said a prompt filing of the FIR was necessary in such cases in line with the verdict. "Why you took four days to lodge an FIR?" the bench asked a police officer concerned, present in court. The officer said the FIR was lodged and the investigation in the case was underway. "You continue with the investigation in accordance with law," the bench told him. It came on record that the IIT Kharagpur authorities alerted the police so after they learnt about the suicide. The bench, however, was not convinced with the explanation of the IIT Kharagpur counsel and the police officer. "We could have taken a very strict view of the matter. We could have even proceeded for contempt against the police officer in-charge concerned of the jurisdictional police station," it said. The bench then refrained from saying "anything further" with the FIR being lodged and progressing investigation. The investigation, it said, should be carried out expeditiously in the right direction.

#### 'United stand against terror': Germany vows support for India in its against terrorism

New Delhi, (HS): In a strong show of solidarity, the Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs of Germany, Johann Wadephul, on Friday condemned the Pahalgam terror attack and vowed to support India in its fight against cross-border terrorism. Speaking at a joint press conference with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar in Berlin on Friday, Wadephul said, "We were all appalled by the brutal terrorist attack on India on April 22. We condemn this attack on civilians in the strongest terms. Our deepest sympathy goes out to all victims and their families." "After military attacks on both sides... and India, of course, has every right to defend itself against terrorism... the fact that a truce is in place is something we appreciate very much," he stressed. He also expressed hope that the ceasefire between India and Pakistan stands. "What is important now is that this truce remains stable, that dialogue can happen to find bilateral solutions," he said. Addressing the media, S Jaishankar reiterated that India has zero tolerance for terrorism and New Delhi will "never give in to nuclear blackmail." In an apparent response to US President Donald Trump's repeated claims on mediating the ceasefire negotiations between India and Pakistan using trade as leverage, Jaishankar said, "India will deal with Pakistan purely bilaterally" and there should be "no confusion in any quarter" in that regard."I came to Berlin in the immediate aftermath of India responding to the Pahalgam terror attack. Let me share with you what I conveyed to Mr Wadephul in that context. India has zero tolerance for terrorism. India will never give in to nuclear blackmail," he said. "And, India will deal with Pakistan purely bilaterally. There should be no confusion in any quarter in that regard," Jaishankar said. He also said India values "Germany's understanding" that "every nation has a right to defend itself against terrorism." The Union minister is currently in Germany as part of his three-nation Europe visit.

# Storm, Screams, Hailstones: IndiGo's 8,500 Ft/Min Drop After Pak Refusal

New Delhi, (HS): A domestic flight from Delhi to Srinagar went through a chaotic situation on Wednesday, after the IndiGo aircraft encountered a violent hailstorm and severe turbulence, triggering multiple warnings, an 8,500-feet-per-minute descent, and a denied request for emergency passage through Pakistani

New details indicate that the flight encountered a grave in-flight emergency after flying into an intense storm. These details, announced by the civil aviation watchdog Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), suggest that the pilots were fighting multiple cockpit warnings and instrument failures after entering a hailstorm. At one stage, the IndiGo A321neo aircraft operating as Flight 6E-2142 dropped 8,500 feet per minute. The normal rate of descent is 1,500 to 3,000 feet per minute. According to an initial report from the DGCA, the flight carrying more than 220 passengers, including members of



Parliament, was cruising at 36,000 feet when it ran into adverse weather near Pathankot, close to the India-Pakistan border. According to the crew's postflight statement submitted to the DGCA, the flight team identified significant bad weather ahead and made an urgent request to the Indian Air Force's Northern Control for a deviation towards the left, which would have

taken the aircraft briefly into Pakistani airspace. That request was denied. Subsequently, the flight crew contacted Lahore Air Traffic Control directly, seeking clearance to enter Pakistani airspace for a short period to avoid the storm system. This request too was declined. With limited options and a fast-approaching thunderstorm, the pilots initially considered a return to Delhi. However, by then, the aircraft was already too close

to the approaching clouds. Weighing the proximity and potential hazards, the crew decided to penetrate the weather head-on to proceed toward Srinagar. According to sources, Indian Air Force Air Traffic Control officers alerted the pilots of the IndiGo aircraft of the presence of a ban on overflights over Pakistan when the cockpit crew asked to divert West to avoid the storm front.

Subsequently, IAF flight controllers helped provide the pilots with the frequency of Lahore Air Traffic Control to the pilot. The permission to overfly Pakistan was denied by Lahore ATC. Once inside the thunderstorm, the aircraft experienced severe hail impact and violent turbulence. Several critical systems began flagging malfunctions. DGCA's preliminary assessment confirms that the aircraft suffered Angle Of Attack (AOA) fault while alternate law protection was lost. These failures were triggered by the aircraft's flight control systems as the plane was tossed vertically by intense updrafts and downdrafts. Amid this chaos, the autopilot disengaged. The crew was forced to assume full manual control under rapidly fluctuating airspeed indications and extreme stress. At one point, the aircraft entered a steep descent, recording a rate of 8,500 feet per minute. Compounding the crisis were multiple stall warnings and alerts indicating the aircraft was nearing its Maximum Operating Speed and Mach number.

#### Delhi govt issues advisory on Covid amid rise in cases



New Delhi, (HS): The Delhi government on Friday issued an advisory on the Covid-19 disease, asking hospitals in the national capital to ensure the availability of beds, oxygen, medicines and vaccines. All health institutions have been asked to send all positive Covid-19 samples for genome sequencing to Lok Nayak Hospital.

"The hospitals must ensure preparedness in terms of availability of beds, oxygen, antibiotics, other drugs and vaccines. All equipment such as ventilators, Bi-PAP, oxygen concentrators and PSA must be in functional condition," it stated. The health department said that daily reporting of all parameters must also be done on the Delhi State Health Data Management Portal. Mild infections have been reported from several parts of India. According to the Union health ministry, a total of 257 cases were reported across the country on Wednesday, with Kerala having 95 active cases. Maharashtra reported 56 Covid cases, while Tamil Nadu logged 66. Infections were also detected in Puducherry, Delhi, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Haryana, Karnataka, and West Bengal. On Friday, Haryana reported four new covid cases, which were reported to be mild, and the concerned individuals have been kept under home observation with medical supervision. Health minister Arti Singh Rao assured that there is no need for panic and added that the state government is closely monitoring the situation. On May 19, experts from the National Centre for Disease Control, Emergency Medical Relief division, Disaster Management Cell, Indian Council of Medical Research and central government hospitals held a review meeting chaired by the director general of health services regarding the recent uptick in Covid-19 cases

#### **India extends** airspace ban for Pakistani airlines

New Delhi, (HS): India on Friday extended the closure of Indian airspace for Pakistani airlines, shortly after Pakistan announced the extension of the ban on Indian airlines till June 24. Indian airspace will not be available for aircraft registered in Pakistan as well as for planes operated, owned or leased by Pakistan airlines and operators till June 23, 2025, according to a NOTAM (Notice to Airmen) issued on Friday. As per the NOTAM, the ban will also be applicable to Pakistan's military aircraft. The extension follows the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) rules that restrict such closure for a month at a

# YouTuber Jyoti grilled by police over Mahakal temple visit; nothing suspicious found

Haryana, (H.S): Haryana-based YouTuber Jyoti Malhotra, arrested on suspicion of espionage, was questioned by Madhya Pradesh police over her visit to Ujjain's Mahakaleshwar Temple, but officials found nothing incriminating, PTI reported, quoting an official. She was questioned by a five-member Madhya Pradesh police team in Haryana after they received information about her visit to Ujjain's famous Mahakaleshwar Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva, in April last year.

Ujjain additional superintendent of police (ASP) Nitesh Bhargava told PTI that the team grilled her but found nothing suspicious or incriminating about her temple visit. "The team was



sent four days ago and is scheduled to

return tonight (Friday) or by tomorrow (Saturday)," he added. The YouTuber had shared photos and videos on various social media platforms, and police received information that she visited Mahakal Temple for obeisance in April last year, the officer said. "The place is very sensitive and sees a huge number of footfalls daily, including devotees from overseas. So it was important to grill her. We took suo motu (on its own motion) action to send a team to Hisar (where she is being grilled by different agencies)," PTI quoted Nitesh Bhargava as saying. # Is the IMF Fuelling Terror by Bailing Out Pakistan?

New Delhi, (HS): When the International Monetary Fund (IMF) disbursed another \$1 billion instalment to Pakistan under its bailout agreement, the global financial community may have quietly cheered the move as an act of economic stabilization. But behind this seemingly standard transaction lies a profoundly disturbing question: Is the IMF indirectly legitimizing a state machinery that harbours deep-rooted ties to global terrorism?

At the centre of this storm is Lt. Gen. Ahmed Sharif Chaudhary, Pakistan's current DG ISPR. What the IMF and the world must not ignore is that he is the son of Sultan Bashiruddin Mahmood, a man internationally designated as a global terrorist. Mahmood, a Pakistani nuclear scientist once celebrated for his role in Pakistan's nuclear program, later founded Ummah Tameer-e-Nau (UTN)-an organization banned and sanctioned by the United States and the United Nations for aiding Al Qaeda and the Taliban. The evidence is not speculative; it's documented in UN Security Council reports. In August 2001, just weeks before the 9/11 attacks, Mahmood and his colleague travelled to Kandahar to meet Osama bin Laden and Ayman al-Zawahiri. He allegedly shared technical insights into nuclear weapons infrastructure, including the potential impact and development strategies -effectively arming Al Qaeda with the most dangerous knowledge possible. Mahmood's UTN worked closely with the Taliban and had affiliations with Al Rashid Trust and Jaish-



e-Mohammed, both terror groups with blood on their hands. He funded Taliban reconstruction efforts and frequently met with Mullah Omar, the Taliban's elusive leader. Mahmood even acted, by many accounts, as a de facto ambassador for the Taliban in Pakistan. So how does the son of such a man rise to become the public face of Pakistan's military? And more pressingly: How can the IMF, an institution tasked with safeguarding economic integrity and global stability, approve financial aid without scrutinizing such dangerous associations? The IMF must understand the broader consequences of its decisions. In propping up Pakistan's economy without demanding accountability or structural reform, it risks enabling a system where ideologues with extremist legacies retain influence. This is not just about lineage; it's about institutional tolerance for radicalism-a tolerance that has

historically cost the world dearly.

Recent threats by Al Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS) to support Pakistan against India only amplify the urgency. The ideological alignment between terror groups and elements within the Pakistani establishment is not a relic of the past-it is alive and dangerous. This is not an argument against economic aid; it's a call for conditional accountability. The IMF must demand transparency, severance from extremist networks, and a demonstrated commitment to democratic and secular principles before approving further funds. The global community cannot afford to fund regimes that flirt with fundamentalism while claiming t fight it. It's time the IMF answers the hard question: Is it backing economic recoveryor inadvertently funding the infrastructure

## "Maa, I Didn't Steal Chips": 12-Year-Old's Suicide Note

Kolkata, (HS): A 12-year-old boy died by allegedly consuming pesticide after he was accused of theft and asked to do sit-ups by a shopkeeper for "stealing" a packet of chips at Panskura in Paschim Medinipur district, a police officer said Friday. Krishendu Das, a class 7 student, allegedly lifted a packet of chips from a shop at Gosaiber bazar in the Panskura area on Thursday evening after he failed to find the shopkeeper Subhankar Dikshit. He had called out "uncle I will buy chips" repeatedly without any response and finally left the shop allegedly with one packet of chips, the officer said quoting his grief-stricken mother.

He was allegedly chased by Dikshit who came back to the shop soon afterwards, slapped and asked to do sit-ups in full public view, the officer said quoting a complaint by the family. The officer said a probe is underway Das' mother was summoned to the spot and she also scolded him and slapped him while the boy claimed he picked up the junk food packet lying in a heap before the shop and would have come to pay later. He even offered to pay immediately apologising for lifting the packet without the consent of the shopowner but the shopowner accused him of lying. A sulking Krishnendu then returned to his house with his mother, bolted the door of his room from inside and did not open the door. After some time his mother along with neighbours broke open the door and found him frothing from the mouth with a half-empty pesticide bottle lying on his side, the officer said, adding that a note purportedly scribbled by him in Bengali was found lying on the side. "Maa I am not a thief. I did not steal. Uncle (shopkeeper) was not around as I waited. While returning I spotted a kurkure packet lying on the road and picked it up. I love Kurkure," said the note.

Krishnendu further said, "These are my final words before leaving. Please excuse me for this act(consuming pesticide)". He was taken to Tamluk Hospital and admitted to ICU but died soon afterwards. ## Act of Terror: FBI on Killing Two Israeli Embassy Employees in US

Washington, (H.S): US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Assistant Director in Charge Steven J. Jensen on Friday called the tragic murder of two Israeli Embassy employees outside the Jewish National Museum in Washington, both an act of terror and directed violence against the Jewish community. Addressing a press conference, he stated that the matter has the full and unwavering attention of the FBI, and it will continue to pursue all leads and use all available resources to investigate the attack."

With the assistance of FBI offices across the country, we're continuing to investigate and contact the subject's associates, family members, and co-workers. We are also executing search warrants for his electronic devices and reviewing his social media accounts," Jensen said. The shooting took place outside an event hosted by the American Jewish Committee for Young Diplomats at the Lillian and Albert Small Capital Jewish Museum. The single shooter was identified by police as 30-yearold Elias Rodriguez of Chicago. Metropolitan Police Chief



Pamela Smith said at a news briefing the suspect shouted "Free, free Palestine!" while being taken into custody. The victims were Sarah Lynn Milgrim and her partner Yaron Lischinsky, who both worked at the Israeli embassy in Washington. According to a statement from the US Department of Justice, the accused Rodriguez has been charged with federal and local murder offences in connection with the fatal shooting of two Israeli Embassy staff members on May 21.He is charged in the US District Court for the District of Columbia with the murder of foreign officials, causing death through the use of a firearm, and discharging a firearm during a crime of violence. The charges

were announced by US Attorney Jeanine Ferris Pirro, FBI Assistant Director in Charge Steven J. Jensen, and Metropolitan Police Department Chief Pamela Smith."Make no mistake: This attack was targeted, anti-semitic violence. The FBI will continue to pursue all leads and use all available resources to investigate this heinous murder," said Assistant Director in Charge Jensen. Describing the attack as brutal, anti-Semitic violence which has no place in the US or anywhere in civilization, Attorney General Pamela Bondi

"We will follow the facts and secure the most severe possible punishment for the perpetrator of this heinous crime, which robbed two wonderful young people of a bright future together." "According to the affidavit in support of the criminal complaint, Rodriguez allegedly opened fire on the victims as they were leaving an event hosted by the American Jewish Committee, which brought together Jewish professionals and members of the diplomatic community. Both victims were employed by the

Israeli Embassy. One was an Israeli citizen and an official guest of the US government," read the statement by the US Department of Justice."Surveillance footage reportedly shows Rodriguez walking past the victims before turning and firing multiple rounds. After the victims fell, he allegedly continued firing at close range, including as one attempted to crawl away.

Investigators recovered a 9mm handgun and 21 spent shell casings at the scene," the statement added. According to the official statement, Rodriguez entered the Museum after he committed the murders; and witnesses and surveillance video reportedly confirmed his involvement. He had flown from Chicago to Washington the day prior with the firearm declared in his checked luggage."The case is being investigated by the FBI's Washington Field Office and the Metropolitan Police Department. It is being prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia with assistance from the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice," the statement concluded.

Jerusalem, (H.S): Israel's military has said that a missile launched from Yemen had been intercepted by the country's aerial defence system, marking the second missile attack by Houthi forces on Israel within the same day. The missile, launched around Thursday noon, triggered air raid sirens in the Jerusalem area, several settlements in the occupied West Bank, and the Dead Sea region, Israeli police said.Israel's Magen David Adom rescue service reported that no injuries were sustained, Xinhua news agency reported."

A missile launched from Yemen was intercepted," the military said in a statement, adding that sirens were activated "in accordance with protocol". Overnight between Wednesday and Thursday, the military also intercepted another missile launched from Yemen toward Israel.Houthi forces in Yemen have pledged to cease attacks on US vessels but have continued firing missiles at Israel, citing solidarity with Palestinians in Gaza. The ongoing Israeli offensive, which began 19 months ago, has resulted in the deaths of more than 53,000

Israel has conducted a series of retaliatory airstrikes in Yemen, including one in May on the capital, Sanaa, which damaged the main international airport and left several people dead. Earlier this month, a Houthi missile slipped through air defences and landed in the grounds of Ben Gurion Airport, injuring six people, none of them

international carriers promptly halted services to Israel, though some have since said they will resume operations.Israel responded to that attack with strikes on Sanaa airport, causing an estimated \$500 million worth of damage. The Houthis - whose slogan calls for "Death to America, Death to Israel, (and) a Curse on the Jews" - began attacking Israel and general maritime traffic in November 2023, a month after the October 7 Hamas massacre. Several of the missiles have fallen short.

#### 2 Killed, 8 Injured After Small Plane Crashes Neighbourhood in San Diego

Los Angeles, (H.S): At least two people were killed and eight others were injured after a small plane crashed into a neighbourhood in US southwestern city of San Diego, authorities said. The incident took place early Thursday morning. The crash occurred around 3:45 a.m. local time in a military housing complex in the Tierrasanta neighbourhood, local officials said.

The crash site is a little more than 2 miles east of Montgomery-Gibbs Executive Airport, Xinhua news agency reported. Police said they believed no one on the ground was killed but could not immediately confirm that. The San Diego Police Department said in a post on X that the crash also damaged around 10 buildings in the neighbourhood.Local officials confirmed that the small plane a Cessna jet, crashed into Murphy Canyon neighbourhood just before 4 a.m. local time. The crash sparked fires



in multiple residences and vehicles, Dan Eddy, assistant chief of the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department, told the media." We have jet fuel all over the place. We have hazmat on scene right now, and we've asked for more resources to come for that," Eddy said. Eddy said that all of the fatalities were on the plane, which could hold up to 10 people. Officials do not yet know how many were on board. About 100 local residents were evacuated following the crash. Officials confirmed that the affected residences were military housing units. The tract where the crash occurred is managed by Liberty Military Housing, officials said." We are actively

working with all military families affected, specifically within this region, because they may be out of their homes for a while," said Captain Bob Heely, commanding officer of Naval Base San Diego. Heely said he was working with Liberty Military Housing and the Red Cross to provide temporary housing to the affected families." As you can see, the damage behind us is incredibly significant, was life-threatening, and thank God nobody on the ground was killed," Raul Campillo, a member of the San Diego City Council, said at a news conference near the crash site. The crash will be investigated by the Federal Aviation Administration and the National Transportation Safety Board.

#### US House of Representatives Passes Sweeping Tax-Cut Bill Amid Warning From Budget Group

Washington, (H.S): The Republican-controlled US House of Representatives has narrowly passed a sweeping tax and spending bill, despite prior warnings from budget groups that the legislation would significantly increase federal debt. The bill was approved by a vote of 215 to 214, Xinhua news agency reported. All Democratic lawmakers and two Republican lawmakers voted against it, while one Republican lawmaker voted "present," neither for nor against the bill.

The bill extends the corporate and individual tax cuts enacted during US President Donald Trump's first term in 2017, while adding new tax breaks for tips, overtime and car loans.It also increases defence spending and allocates additional funds for deporting immigrants. Additionally, the bill repeals many green energy policies championed by former US President Joe Biden and raises the eligibility thresholds for low-income individuals to



access healthcare and food assistance programs, in an attempt to reduce federal expenditures. The bill is sent to the Republican-controlled Senate, where it will likely face modifications." THE ONE, BIG, BEAUTIFUL BILL has PASSED the House of Representatives! This is arguably the most significant piece of Legislation that will ever be signed in the History of our Country!" Trump wrote on his social platform Truth Social. Meanwhile, budget groups have

expressed deep concern." The House's reconciliation framework has been an insult to fiscal responsibility, adding more than \$3 trillion to the debt and setting up a massive cliff of tax cuts and spending expirations that could cost trillions more to extend," Maya MacGuineas, President of the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, said in a statement on Wednesday. According to the latest data from the Treasury Department, the US national debt has surpassed \$36.2 trillion.With

the House majority standing at 220-212, Speaker Mike Johnson had little room for dissent and made last-minute concessions to satisfy various Republican factions. Johnson described the bill as "generational, truly nation-shaping legislation," emphasising its significance in shaping America's future.

The 1,100-page bill enshrines much of Donald Trump's populist campaign promises, including new tax breaks on tips and car loans, increased military spending, and enhanced border enforcement.It extends the corporate and individual tax cuts enacted in 2017 and repeals many greenenergy incentives introduced under former US President Joe However, Congressional Budget Office (CBO) projects that the taxcut bill will add approximately \$3.8 trillion to the federal debt over the next decade, on top of the existing \$36.2 trillion.

# After India's Objections, IMF Justifies Bailout Package To Pakistan

New Delhi, (H.S): Amid India's objections to the International Monetary Fund bailout package to Pakistan, the IMF has said the debt-ridden country "met all the required targets" to receive the latest loan instalment. The IMF recently gave the nod to a \$ 1 billion (over Rs 8,000 crore) bailout package to Pakistan even as India expressed reservations. The bailout came when Pakistan was retaliating to India's Operation Sindoor - a military strike on terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK).

India had asked it to reconsider the bailout as Pakistan allows terrorists to use its soil for launching state-sponsored attacks against Indian citizens. Last week, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said that the aid to Pakistan is a "form of indirect funding to terror" and had cautioned the international agencies, including the IMF. The global lender disbursed \$2.1 billion to Pakistan in two tranches under its Extended Fund Facility



(EFF) programme. The IMF and Pakistan last year signed a deal for \$7 billion under the EFF. Defending its loan, IMF's director of the communications department, Julie Kozack, said on Thursday, "Our Board found that Pakistan had indeed met all of the targets. It had made progress on some of the reforms, and for that reason, the Board went ahead and approved the programme." Kozack also made a short statement with regards to the conflict between India and Pakistan and hoped for a peaceful resolution between the two countries. "With respect to Pakistan and the conflict with India, I want to start here by first expressing our regrets and

sympathies for the loss of life and for the human toll from the recent conflict. We do hope for a peaceful resolution of the conflict," she said. She said the IMF Executive Board had approved Pakistan's EFF program in September of 2024. And the first review at that time was planned for the first quarter of 2025. "Consistent with that timeline, on March 25th of 2025, the IMF Staff and the Pakistani authorities reached a Staff-Level Agreement on the First Review for the EFF. That agreement, that Staff-Level Agreement, was then presented to our Executive Board, and our Executive Board completed the review on May 9th. As a result of the completion of that review, Pakistan received the disbursement at that time." She said it was part of a standard procedure under programmes that the IMF Executive Board conducts periodic reviews of lending programs to assess their progress. "And they particularly look at whether the program is on track, whether the conditions under the program have been met, and whether any policy changes are needed to bring the program back on track.

And in the case of Pakistan, our Board found that Pakistan had indeed met all of the targets. It had made progress on some of the reforms, and for that reason, the Board went ahead and approved the program," she said. Kozack said that there was a sufficient consensus at the Board to allow the IMF to move forward or for the Board to decide to move forward and complete Pakistan's review. She, however, added that any deviation from the established programme conditions would impact future reviews for Pakistan.

# **Expect Turkey To Strongly Urge Pakistan To End Its Support To Cross-Border Terrorism: MEA**



New Delhi, (H.S): India on Thursday emphasised that it expects Turkey to "strongly urge" Pakistan to end its support to cross-border terrorism and take credible and verifiable actions against the terror ecosystem it has harboured for decades. "We expect Turkey to strongly urge Pakistan to end its support to cross-border terrorism and take credible and verifiable actions against the terror ecosystem it has harboured for

Relations are built on the

basis of sensitivities to each other's concerns," Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated during a weekly media briefing in New Delhi.Led by President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, Turkey has openly backed Pakistan's aggression and military response to India's decisive Operation Sindoor targeting Pakistani terror infrastructure. Last week, in a strong retaliatory measure, the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) revoked the security clearance of

Celebi Airport Services India Pvt Ltd offering ground handling services at nine airports, in the interest of national security. The order came days after Turkey backed Islamabad and condemned India's Operation Sindoor launched to avenge the killing of 26 innocent people in the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. The drones launched by Pakistan on a large-scale targetting Indian regions and military bases earlier this month - all attacks successfully thwarted by India's air defence systems - were also

sourced from Turkey."

This (Celebi) matter has been discussed with the Turkish Embassy here and our Ministry of External Affairs. However, I understand that this particular decision was taken by the Civil Aviation Security, as they are mandated to handle security issues," Jaiswal mentioned on Thursday. Under Erdogan's rule, Turkey has undergone a dramatic transformation from a relatively secular, pro-Western democracy to a country moving towards

Islamist populism. Central to this transformation has been Erdogan's use of the media as a strategic weapon, both at domestic and international fronts. Ankara's military, diplomatic and media support to Islamabad has added fuel to fire over the past few weeks. Erdogan met Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif hours after the Pahalgam attack which was conducted by The Resistance Front (TRF), an extended group of Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

Post Operation Sindoor, Erdogan vocally condemned India's air strikes, reiterating solidarity with Pakistan during a call with Sharif.Earlier, six Turkish C-130 Hercules military transport aircraft, possibly carrying an arms shipment, landed at Karachi airport on April 27 and on May 2. A Turkish warship, TCG Buyukada (F-512), the second ship of the Ada-class ASW corvettes of the Turkish Navy, had also docked at Karachi.

#### Pak Army Spokesman Parrots Hafiz Saeed's Comments, Warns India Over Indus Waters Treaty Suspension

Islamabad, (H.S): Pakistani military spokesperson Lieutenant General Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry has issued a warning to India similar to that used by Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) terrorist Hafiz Saeed. He was speaking at a public gathering over India's decision to keep the Indus Waters Treaty in abeyance till Islamabad abjures terrorism and stop aiding, funding and supporting terrorist groups emanating from its soil. Chaudhry reportedly made the comments during a speech at a university in Pakistan.Referring to India's recent move to suspend the water-sharing

treaty following a deadly terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, he said, "If you block our water, we will choke your breath."His statement mirrors the hostile rhetoric used by LeT founder Hafiz Saeed, the mastermind of the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks, known for his inflammatory speeches against India and the US.In a video, making rounds on social media X, Hafiz Saeed can be heard saying those same words. The statements come as India suspended parts of the Indus Waters Treaty on April 23, a day after the terror attack in

Pahalgam killed 26 people.The treaty, signed in 1960 and brokered by the World Bank, governs the sharing of the Indus River and its tributaries between the two countries. Meanwhile, New Delhi has repeatedly said "blood and water cannot flow together; talk and terror cannot go together," signalling a tougher stance on Pakistan's alleged support for cross-border terrorism. Suspension was a part of countermeasures taken against Islamabad, including "Operation Sindoor" on May 7 that targeted nine terror hideouts in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir. India's

Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Thursday declared that any future dialogue with Pakistan will focus solely on the vacation of illegally occupied Indian territory in Jammu and Kashmir.MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated firmly that "terror and talks can't coexist," highlighting that India remains open only to discussions on the extradition of wanted terrorists already listed and shared with Islamabad. Clarifying India's stance on the Kashmir issue, Jaiswal underlined, "Any bilateral discussion will only be on the vacation of illegally occupied Indian territory by Pakistan."

#### 27,000 Crore Government Securities Auction Fully Subscribed



New Delhi, (H.S): Government securities (G-sec) auctioned Rs. 27,000 crore bonds in two tranches on Friday. On May 22, it was fully subscribed, reflecting strong investor demand. The cut off price for both bonds was above par. The 6.75 per cent Gsec with a notified amount of Rs 15,000 crore, maturing in 2029, was sold at a cut-off price of Rs 103.49, yielding 5.8675 per cent. The 7.09 per cent G-sec with a notified amount of Rs 12,000

crore, maturing in 2054, was sold at a cut off price of Rs 103.39, yielding 6.8197 per cent. The bond yield is the return an investor expects to receive each year over its term to maturity. As per the auction results, the development of primary dealers was stated as 'NIL' for both the bonds, indicating healthy demand for Gsec from the investor community. Primary Dealers, commonly referred to as PDs, are financial institutions authorised by the RBI to buy and sell government securities. The underwriting auction was conducted through multiple price-based methods on May 23 (Friday) between 09:00 A.M. and 09:30 A.M.Bids under the Additional Competitive Underwriting (ACU) auction were done electronically through the Core Banking Solution (E-Kuber) System.

Earlier this year, on March 27, the government had notified the indicative calendar for the issuance of government-dated securities, including Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs), for the first half of the fiscal year 2025-26 (April 1, 2025, to September 30, 2025). The indicative calendar for such auctions is released beforehand in order to enable institutional and retail investors to plan their investments efficiently and to provide transparency and stability to the Government Securities market.

# JSW Steel Q4 results: Net profit rises 16% to 1,503 crore, revenue falls 3%

backed steel major JSW Steel Ltd on May 23 reported a net profit of Rs 1,503 crore for the fourth quarter of FY25. This marks a rise of around 16 percent from the Rs 1,299 crore net profit reported in Q4 of previous financial year. Revenue from operations however fell around 3 percent on-year to Rs 44,819 crore during the quarter during review.

JSW Steel had reported revenue from operations at Rs 46,269 crore for the corresponding quarter of FY24. Most steelmakers reported weakness in their toplines for the quarter, owing to steel prices failing to gain momentum amid weakness in demand and cheap imports from China and south-east Asia. Operating earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortisation



(EBITDA) for the reporting quarter on a consolidated basis were Rs 6,378 crore, higher compared to Rs 6,124 crore in the same period a year ago. The operating EBITDA margin for the quarter was 14.23 percent, higher than the 13.2 percent reported a year ago, as input costs showed a decline year-onyear, despite sluggishmess in pricing.Despite JSW Steel experiencing a setback in its acquisition of Bhushan Power and Steel Ltd (BPSL) through the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) process after the Supreme Court ordered the BPSL's liquidation, the company said in a press release that it sees legal remedies to the apex court judgment on May 2. The company also did not make any provisions related to

the BPSL judgment in its balance sheet, saying in an accompanying note to the balance sheet that the recoverable amount is sufficient to cover the carrying value of assets under BPSL, valued at Rs 14,091 crore as on March 31, 2025. The results were released in the post market hours of May

The shares of the company had closed in the green with marginal gains at Rs 1,007.90 apiece. Along with the Q4 results, the company announced a final dividend of Rs 2.8 per equity share for the financial year 2025. Further, the company's board has approved the plan to raise longterm funds by issuing nonconvertible debentures worth up to Rs 7,000 crore, and/or equity shares and/or convertible securities worth up to Rs 7,000 crore.

## India's power transmission body flags regulatory hurdles in equipment procurement

New Delhi, (H.S): India's power transmission sector is facing acute supply-side bottlenecks, especially in procuring High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) equipment critical for carrying renewable energy over long distances, raising concerns over the country's ability to meet its 2030 renewable energy targets. Electric Transmission Association (EPTA) has urged the Power Ministry to provide a levelplaying field in procurement policies, highlighting a regulatory mismatch that allows renewable energy (RE) developers to subcontracting bypass restrictions, while transmission companies remain bound by

The association has called for a temporary exemption from these restrictions until December 2030, to help transmission developers procure key HVDC components without delay. "This mismatch between generation and transmission is hurting the overall power sector and delaying addition of capacity," said an official from a leading transmission company, reported PTI. According to the official, while RE projects are built in 12-18 months, transmission lines often take 3-4 years, and HVDC systems even longer. The issue stems from restrictions on suppliers and subcontractors



from countries sharing land borders with India, particularly China, which is a major source of HVDC equipment. Although these curbs apply to central ministries, autonomous bodies, and public-private partnership (PPP) projects, they also extend to transmission developers operating under the fully privately funded Build-Own-Operate-Transfer (BOOT) model, leaving them similarly affected

The EPTA noted that renewable developers are exempt from these restrictions, following a 2022 clarification by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. It stated that while SECI's procurement qualifies as public procurement, the contracts don't fall under "works contracts,"

thereby allowing unrestricted subcontracting, including from China. Transmission developers, on the other hand, continue to face full restrictions under tariff-based competitive bidding (TBCB). "Despite TBCB projects not being PPPs, the transmission service providers cannot procure or subcontract from countries sharing land borders with India, thereby severely limiting supplier choices," said an industry official.

This asymmetry, industry players say, has created a systemic gap between RE generation and transmission readiness, particularly in HVDCdependent regions like Rajasthan and Khavda in Gujarat. At present, only two domestic OEMs offer LCC-based HVDC systems, while global

manufacturers in Europe and the US are booked until 2030, amid surging renewable installations in the West. As a result, the constrained market is pushing project costs higher, with tariffs reaching up to 17% above levelised rates, and project timelines extending up to six years. "HVDC projects are vital for renewable energy development, and must be governed by the same procurement norms as RE projects," EPTA said in its representation to the Power Ministry. Data from two recently concluded HVDC bids show that it took 19 months just to finalise the tender, with an overall implementation window of 54

The Central Electricity power Regulatory Commission (CERC) has also acknowledged the issue, noting that HVDC component supply constraints are inflating project costs and justifying higher bids. Calling for urgent policy harmonisation, EPTA improving Director General G P Upadhyaya said: "A systemic gap has emerged between generation readiness and transmission infrastructure timelines, particularly for HVDC-dependent RE zones like Rajasthan and Khavda in Naver Founder, Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang Discuss AI Cooperation Gujarat. chairman in March. The appointment was widely seen as a strategic move to lead the company through intensifying global competition in big tech and artificial intelligence (AI).Lee previously met with Huang at Nvidia's U.S. headquarters in June 2024 while serving as Naver's global investment officer. Then, the two discussed issues related to sovereign AI, which refers to the concept of building regionally customized AI models that reflect local culture and values, and comply with local regulations.

Naver is expected to bolster the development of HyperClova X, the company's proprietary large language model (LLM) first introduced in 2023. The company aims to integrate AI across key services, including search and commerce platforms, to enhance

its existing ecosystem. Cobbling together rough and random elements from a mystifying mish-mash of genres, this Maddock Films dramedy seeks to achieve what the banner did in the recent past with a blend of horror and humour in Stree and its sequel, the biggest hit of actor Rajkummar Rao's career.

As an absurd caper playing out in the realms of fantasy and in the bustling streets, ghats and marketplaces of Banaras, it isn't madcap enough. And as a timeloop comedy, it goes completely overboard with its central premise without being able to create a logical context for the

perplexing goings-on in the life of a lad trapped in a limbo. It isn't only owing to its outlandish plot that Bhool Chuk Maaf is a tad difficult to comprehend and decipher. It goes round and round in circles. What that leads to isn't a pretty sight despite the energy that Rajkummar Rao packs into the lead performance and the steady support that Wamiqa Gabbi extends to him. The lead pair does its best to lift the film out of its wobbly ways, but only with sporadic success. Bhool Chuk Maaf also has the services of a bunch of other able actors

flawless. However, the script written by director Karan Sharma is way too contrived and all over the place to make the most of the presence of the likes of Seema Pahwa, Raghubir Yadav, Sanjay Mishra (in a special appearance) and Ishtiyak Khan.
