Orissa HC Sets Unique Bail



Conditions for

Cuttack, (DMC): In a landmark decision blending justice with social reform, the Orissa High Court has granted conditional bail to an accused who had allegedly filed a false case against another individual. As part of the bail conditions, the accused must engage in community service, including cleaning hospital premises and planting trees-a move that highlights the judiciary's increasing emphasis on rehabilitation and social accountability. The bail was granted by a division bench comprising Justice Sanjeeb Kumar Panigrahi and Justice B.R. Das, who were hearing a regular bail application. The bench observed that false litigation not only burdens the judicial system but also unjustly harasses innocent individuals. As such, the accused, found to have falsely implicated someone, must now undertake activities aimed at societal betterment. According to the Orissa High Court's directive, the accused will be required to clean rooms and wards of Capital Hospital in Bhubaneswar for a full month.

Additionally, he has been

tasked with planting at least 100 saplings of native species such as mango, neem, and tamarind in the Dumduma area of Bhubaneswar. These saplings are to be planted in the upcoming monsoon season to ensure better survival and environmental impact. The Court has further instructed the accused to approach the Superintendent of Capital Hospital to coordinate his month-long cleaning duty. Simultaneously, the local revenue authorities are to assist in identifying suitable land in the Dumduma area if required, ensuring the plantation activity is not hindered due to the nonavailability of land. Moreover, the Court has emphasized post-plantation care and instructed the concerned local police station's IIC (Inspectorin-Charge) to supervise the execution of these bail conditions in coordination with the local forest department officials. It will be their responsibility to verify whether the tree plantation is actually carried out and to ensure that the accused adheres

PM Meets Air Chief Marshal AP Singh Amid India-Pakistan Tensions



New Delhi, (HS): Air Chief Marshal AP Singh today met Prime Minister Narendra Modi amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan over the Pahalgam terror attack, which killed 26 people on April 22, sources said. The engagement with the Air Force chief came less than 24 hours after a separate meeting between the Prime Minister and Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi, the Chief of the Naval Staff. The Prime Minister had met Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi

last week. While an official readout of the meeting was not released to the media, it is being seen as part of ongoing deliberations over a response to the April 22 attack, in which gunmen opened fire on a group of tourists in Pahalgam. All those killed were civilians, many of them tourists from various states across India, visiting the picturesque region in south Kashmir during the spring season. The attack marked one of the deadliest strikes on civilians in Kashmir in recent years and has

triggered calls for retributive action against Pakistan, which India accuses of providing support to terror groups to carry out cross-border attacks. Prime Minister Modi, in a high-level meeting held earlier this week, gave clear directions to the defence leadership that the Indian armed forces have "complete operational freedom" to decide the nature, targets, and timing of the country's response to the attack. Present at that earlier meeting were Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, National

Anil Chauhan, and the heads of the Army, Navy, and Air Force. Two days after the Pahalgam massacre, PM Modi's reference to taking the fight to the "ends of the earth" and punishing the perpetrators "beyond their imagination" was widely seen as a direct message to Pakistan. Historically, India has responded to terrorist provocations with force. In 2016, India carried out surgical strikes on terrorist launchpads across the Line of Control, following the attack on soldiers in J&K's Uri, and the 2019 Balakot airstrikes after the Pulwama bombing. The Air Force played a key role in the Balakot operation, using Mirage-2000 fighter jets to carry out strikes on what the government described as a major terror training facility. Following the Pahalgam attack, India has already taken diplomatic and strategic steps aimed at increasing pressure on Islamabad. One such move was the decision to put in abeyance certain provisions of the Indus Waters Treaty, a longstanding bilateral agreement governing the use of rivers that flow from India into Pakistan.

Odisha to Write WB Over Naming of Digha Temple as 'Jagannath Dham'



Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Odisha Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan on Sunday announced that the state government will write to the West Bengal government over the naming of the Jagannath temple in Digha as 'Jagannath Dham'. Addressing the media, Harichandan said he would apprise Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi of the issue upon his return to Odisha, following which a letter will be sent to the West Bengal government.

"There is no justification or reason to name the Jagannath temple in Digha as 'Jagannath Dham'. The sanctity and identity of the Puri Jagannath Temple, along with its unique culture and traditions, must remain undisturbed," the minister said. He further stated that the state government is committed to taking all necessary steps to

safeguard the sanctity of the Puri temple. According to Harichandan, the Chief Administrator of the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA), Puri, has already held discussions with representatives of the Chhatisha Nijoga (the council of the 36 traditional categories of servitors (Sevavats)) and other stakeholders involved in the temple's rituals. The SJTA convened a meeting on Saturday night and made key decisions pertaining to the issue. The Law Minister said the government is taking a firm stance to prevent any recurrence of indiscipline related to servitors, temple rituals, and cultural practices. The temple administration, he added, has been granted authority to take appropriate action where necessary. Targeting the

The unfortunate incident has reignited the debate over the safety of Nepalese students pursuing higher education at the varsity.Several members of the Nepal National Assembly, including Chairperson Narayan Prasad Dahal, expressed concern over the repeated reports of unfortunate deaths of Nepalese students at the university during today's emergency session. Dahal described the incident as extremely 'distressing' and called for strong diplomatic engagement

between Nepal and India to



uncover the truth behind such occurrences. The legislators have urged the Nepal government to carry out a neutral and independent investigation into the cause of the students' deaths. In addition, they demanded justice for the deceased. Dahal specifically asked for measures that would ensure no such incident would repeat in the future.

The parliamentarians further demanded that students planning to study at KIIT University should not be allowed to proceed. Tula Prasad Bishwakarma, a member of the Rashtriya Janamorcha, called on the government to immediately halt the process of issuing NOCs for the private university. "It is deeply saddening that such

Digha Jagannath Temple Controversy: SJTA **Investigates Sacred Neem Wood Dispute**

Bhubaneswar. (DMC): In a developing controversy surrounding the Digha Jagannath Temple, Daitapati Nijoga President Ganesh Das Mohapatra and Secretary Ramakrushna Das Mohapatra appeared before the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) today as part of the ongoing investigation into the use of sacred Neem wood at the temple. The temple administration had previously issued notices to presidents and secretaries of all Sevayat Niyogs, demanding an explanation for the transfer of sacred Neem wood to the Digha Jagannath Temple. A crucial meeting was held at the SJTA office, chaired by Dr. Arabinda Kumar Padhee, where officials discussed the fate of the remaining Neem wood from Nabakalebar rituals. The issue gained further attention when Sri Jagannath Sena filed a complaint against Ramakrushna Das Mohapatra at the Singha Dwar Police Station. Meanwhile, Chief Badagrahi Jagannath Swain Mahapatra stated that no place other than Puri should be called

Jagannath Dham, rejecting an invitation to attend the Digha Temple consecration ceremony. As the debate continues, temple officials and servitors remain divided over the significance of the sacred Neem wood and its rightful place in Jagannath tradition. The SJTA is expected to take further action based on its inquiry.

Heavy Rain, Thunderstorms Likely in Odisha Tomorrow

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued orange and yellow warnings for several districts in Odisha, forecasting thunderstorms with lightning, gusty winds reaching 40-50 kmph, and heavy rainfall likely during the afternoon and evening hours on May 5.

As per the IMD's mid-day weather bulletin, light to moderate rain or thundershowers are expected in the districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khordha, Nayagarh, Ganjam, Gajapati, Mayurbhanj, Malkangiri, Koraput, and Rayagada. One or

two places in Keonjhar, Kandhamal, Sundargarh, Kalahandi, Nabarangpur, Nuapada, Balangir, Angul, Dhenkanal, and Boudh may also receive rainfall. Dry weather is likely to prevail over the remaining districts.

An orange warning has been issued for Mayurbhanj, Koraput, and Malkangiri districts, indicating the possibility of intense weather activity. A yellow warning has been issued for Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam, Gajapati, Rayagada, Nabarangpur,

"If Missiles are Going to Rain...": Experts on "Cost" of India-Pak War

New Delhi, (HS): As emotions run high in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, a former diplomat has warned that public mood should not dictate a war with Pakistan. Ajay Bisaria, former high commissioner to Pakistan, highlighted the key aspects of such an action and said its timing should not be based on what the people feel. "For any operation to succeed, you need three elements: speed, surprise, and secrecy. There is an issue of choosing our timing, and that should not be dictated by the public mood," said the former diplomat. Mr Bisaria, who has headed the Indian mission in Pakistan during 2017-2020, stressed the need to be able to



fight the battle on its own if the situation escalates."We have to fight this battle on our own. When you escalate, you have to be prepared for the worst-case which is an scenario,

uncontrolled escalation where you could even be fighting a fullscale war. And have the capacity, intent, political will, and national will to be able to do that," he

His comments assume significance amid the soaring tensions between India and Pakistan after 26 civilians were massacred in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam by terrorists with links to a Pakistan-based terror group. Sushant Sareen, a strategic affairs expert, warned of the "massive costs" of war and said both countries will be vulnerable if the situation escalates to the point where India and Pakistan drop missiles on

Yamuna Cleaning

The Yamuna in Delhi spans only 22 km of the river's more than 1,400-km stretch. Yet, the Capital accounts for 75 per cent of the Yamuna's pollution. In March, a report of the parliamentary standing committee on water resources pointed out that the river is virtually non-existent in Delhi. It underlined that the river loses all its environmental flow the volume and quality of water required by a water body to maintain its health and perform its ecological functions downstream of the Wazirabad Barrage. In other words, the Yamuna simply does not have freshwater for most of its Delhi stretch. Instead, it carries the waters emptied by more than 20 drains, except during the monsoon months when there is good rainfall. The quality of the river's waters was among the issues in the Delhi Assembly elections. Now, the Centre has come together with Delhi's new government to resolve the longstanding problem. Their joint action plan ticks a few of the right boxes - particularly salient is the project's emphasis on restoring the river's environmental flows. However, much will depend on the project's fine print. Similar plans have run out of steam in the past.

The project plans to use sewage treatment plants (STPs) to restore some of the river's ecological functions. Water treated by these plants will be discharged downstream of the Wazirabad and Okhla barrages. For that, the efficiency of the STPs needs to be increased. Delhi Pollution Control Committee reports, in recent years, have underlined that at least half of Delhi's STPs do not meet operating standards. In the past 10 years, projects to upgrade these plants suffered because the Delhi government and the Centre were not on the same page. The new BJP government in Delhi appears to have embarked on a course correction. However, the Centre and the Delhi government will be mistaken to completely rely on treated water to revive the Yamuna's environmental flows - water cleansed at STPs is not freshwater. The river needs freshwater to nurture a healthy aquatic ecosystem. In the long run, Delhi needs to find better ways to use rainwater. One of the shortcomings of the new Yamuna plan is that it does not connect the dots between rainwater harvesting and reducing the city's dependence on the Yamuna. The plan does have a floodplain component. However, much of the focus seems to be on removing floodplain encroachments. Delhi will also have to find ways to refurbish its wetlands and catchment areas. The new plan is a beginning. Much more needs to be done.

Astronaut Day



National Astronaut Day is celebrated on May 5 since 2016 to commemorate the first time an American, Alan Shepard, went to space. From the first-ever space flight to the longest spaceflight by a woman; we have come a long way.

In January 1959, NASA began an astronaut selection procedure in response to the space race and Russia's first victorious launch into space. This included screening the records of 508 military test pilots from which 110 candidates were chosen. At the end of the extremely tough selection process, seven were chosen based on final interviews. They were: L. Gordon Cooper Jr., Scott Carpenter, Virgil "Gus" Grissom, John H. Glenn Jr., Alan Shepard Jr., Walter Schirra Jr., and Donald Slayton. They would go down in history as the Mercury Seven. Among them, Astronaut Alan Bartlett Shepard Jr. became the first American to be launched into space on May 5, 1961. The flight lasted 15 minutes and reached a height of 116 miles, which itself was a milestone. National Astronaut Day was created in 2016 by Uniphi Space Agency. It is a talent and marketing division of Uniphi Good LLC, a firm that represents over 20 former NASA astronauts.

National Astronaut Day celebrates astronauts as heroes who keep on inspiring us to reach for the stars. It is a tribute to all those brave people who risked their lives to expand mankind's knowledge about space exploration and the universe at large. Towards a Five Trillion Dollar Economy

With an ambitious vision to transform the country into a global economic powerhouse that creates more jobs, raises incomes, and improves everyday life for its people, in the year 2019, the government of India (GOI) laid out a bold dream of turning India into a \$5 trillion economy by 2025. At that time, India's economy was valued at around \$2.94 trillion and the country had already achieved the status of the fastest growing economy of the world. But the target of a \$5 trillion dollar economy by 2025 was seemed like an unprecedented dream and highly optimistic and unreachable goal for many experts at that time. The Trillion dollar club is an unofficial classification of the major economies of the world which has a gross domestic product (nominal GDP) of more than US\$1 trillion per year.

As per the International Monetary Fund (IMF) estimation, hitting the target of a \$5 trillion dollar economy needs a growth rate of around 8-9% every year. But the minimum expected GDP growth rate even if in FY26 (as per the economic survey tabled in Parliament by the union finance minister) is only 6.3% and adjusting to the inflation

be as low as 5.7% this year. The "Trading Economics" has predicted India's GDP to be only around \$3.781 trillion in 2025 while the earlier IMF prediction was \$4.340 trillion this year. The country's dream to grow its economy to \$5 trillion and beyond depends on how it manages the exchange rate of its currency against the US dollar in the near future while retaining the current GDP growth agenda. It's reported that Rupee has depreciated about 3% in 2024 making the dollar stronger than the Indian currency. A strong dollar affects the value of imports, especially crude oil which accounts for nearly 25% of our gross import bill and this huge expenditure carries a chain effect on user industries. This appears to be the biggest challenge before the economy and government in this year and for the coming ones. It's of no doubt that the country's economy, despite various national and international setbacks, is on a growth path. Indian economy in 2025, by more than doubling its size, has outpaced all the nations in the G7, the G20, and the BRICS of economy. The agriculture sector is projected to grow by 3.8%, while the industry sector is expected to grow by 6.2%. The services sector, a major contributor to India's GDP, also continues to be a key growth driver. The government's focus on infrastructure development through initiatives like the 'Gati Shakti plan', increasing the investment in digital transformation (including expanding 4G connectivity in all villages) and various policy initiatives such as 'Make in India' may lead to a further boost to the economy of the country.

As per the latest data from



the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the country shows a staggering 105% growth in the recent past. The growth rate has outpaced many major economies like China (76%), USA (66%), Germany (44%), France (38%) and UK (28%). India is on the cusp of overtaking Japan (GDP at \$4.4 trillion) as the fourthlargest economy in the world by the third quarter of 2025. It's also expected that India will surpass Germany (the third-largest economy globally) by the second quarter of 2027. German's GDP currently stands at \$4.9 trillion. And it's also predicted that breaking into the top two places will take India little over two decades at its current rate of growth. The growth trajectory of the country in the recent past is also quite phenomenal. While the country, took 60 years for its GDP to reach the first trilliondollar mark (in 2007), on the other hand, from \$1 trillion to \$2 trillion it took 7 years (in 2014). Further, despite the unset of COVID-19 (which had stalled the world economy), India reached the \$3 trillion mark in 2021 and the journey from \$3 trillion to \$4 trillion took just 4 years. Should the progression continue the way it is, the country is poised to add a trillion dollars to its GDP every

1.5 years, and could likely become a \$10 trillion economy by end of 2032. Despite some setbacks, it's said that India's economic trajectory has been nothing short of remarkable. Morgan-Stanley's report claims "Macro-stability should remain in the comfort range, providing flexibility to policymakers." Going forward, the country's consumption recovery is expected to be broadbased as the income tax cuts propel urban demand which will support the buoyant trend in rural consumption. Within investments, public and household capex drove growth, while private corporate capex recovered gradually. The strength in services exports bodes well for the labour market outlook, with moderating inflation likely to improve purchasing power. Domestic demand may emerge as the key driver of growth, bolstered by policy support on the monetary and fiscal front. Morgan Stanley expects inflation to be 4.3% year-on-year in FY2026-27 which is lower than 4.9% in FY2025. On the monetary policy front, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is easing across all its levers: rates, liquidity and regulations. It embarked on a rate easing cycle in the February policy, and Morgan Stanley

expected more cautious rate cuts ahead. Stating that risks to growth stem from external factors, the report says: the most crucial cue will likely be global, including US policy and global growth rates. "A global recession or a near recession will challenge our call and keep the Indian equities off highs in 2025," it added. The IMF data also highlighted that the GDP per capita (which measures the average income of a citizen based on the total economic output) is estimated at \$11,940 (or 11.94 thousand international dollars in terms of purchasing power parity). This indicates an improvement in individual prosperity and living standards over the years.

In the integrated economic framework of the world. India doesn't get respite from global turbulences but with appropriate macroeconomic steps and policy packages the situation can be tackled to many extents. A comprehensive multi-pronged policy measure and a stimulus that pumps more money into the economy in the form of transfers, production aid, and investment support is highly required to sustain the growth path of the economy. Fiscal, monetary and financial market measures targeted at the most vulnerable sectors, the households and businesses, both at domestic and international levels is the need of the hour. We might miss the originally expected timeline of 2024-2025 to achieve the target of \$5 trillion economy, but by pursuing the correct policy-mix, we might get to that milestone very well by 2028-2029 or at least by the end of this decade.

Class Struggle: Marx argued that capitalism inherently creates class conflict, with the bourgeoisie exploiting the proletariat for profit. This exploitation, he believed, would lead to a revolutionary overthrow of capitalism. Health Dept. braces up for Puri Car Festival

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): The Health & Family Welfare Department, Odisha braced up for ensuing Car Festival 2025 at Puri with Secretary Aswathy S. reviewing the preparedness in a high level meeting held in Lokseba Bhawan Conference hall yesterday evening.

Taking stock of the available and required health care facilities, Aswathy directed the senior officers of the department present in the meeting to ensure adequate arrangements for sevayats, pilgrims, tourists and people from Nabajauban Darshan(26 June) to Niladribije(8 July) without fail. She added, "the facilities and services with required manpower be placed well in advance of the scheduled dates of the grand public festival". Mainly, the issues relating to strengthening of hospitals across Puri district, especially the Government health facilities in and around the pilgrim city, setting up of the first aid centers,



stationing of ambulance services at strategic sites, deputation of additional manpower including specialists, doctors and paramedics, food safety measures, prevention, combat and control of any possible outbreak etc were discussed in the meeting; and, necessary resolutions were arrived at. Secretary Aswathy assured that necessary funds would be made available for setting up additional facilities, more beds for the patients, including repair and upkeep of the clinical equipments.It was decided that more beds and facilities in district head quarter hospital, KDMM

home urban public health center, police hospital, Chandanpur CHC, Sakhigopal CHC, Mangalpur CHC, Pipili CHC, TB and IDH hospital, Jagannath medical college and hospital, Station Road, and Rebenuagaon CHC will be kept ready and reserved for the ensuing festival. Around 33 First Aid Centers (FACs) would function round the clock in three shifts with necessary logistics and emergency medicines. Each shift would have at least one doctor, pharmacist, multipurpose health worker and one attendant. It was proposed

Badadanda(grand trunk road), 03 in Sea beach area, 03 in Talabania and Railway station, 09 in Puri-Bhubaneswar road, 04 in Puri-Konark road, and 02 in Puri-Satapada road. Similarly, 31 more ambulance services with entire team would be placed at the places like dist head qrt hospital, Badadanda, Sea beach, various places inside the town, railway station, Puri-Bhubaneswar road, Puri-Konark road, and Puri-Satapada road.

The movement of the ambulances would be facilitated by ambulance corridor with the help of volunteers. Besides, 07 numbers of 108 Ambulances will be stationed at strategic points on NH-203. More than 300 specialists, doctors, nursing officers. epidemiologist, pharmacist, Multi-Purpose Health Workers, dressers, attendants would be deputed to DHH Puri for healthcare during the festival. Sufficient blood units of different groups would be kept

ready for meeting any emergency. It was also decided to station food safety teams headed by Food Safety officers for ensuring food safety precautions. Preventive actions including disinfection of water sources will be carried on before and during the festival along with IEC activities. Rapid Response Teams along with 24x7 Health Control room would be functioning during the Mission Director Dr Brundha

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): The Odisha Works Department has set up a three-member technical committee to submit its report within 15 days on the mishap that occurred yesterday during the construction work for the six-laning of the Cuttack Ring Road near Khannagar. According to an official notification, the committee has been formed under the guidance of Works, Law, and Excise Minister Prithviraj Harichandan.

The committee is tasked with investigating the cause and circumstances of the incident and recommending appropriate actions if negligence is found. Headed by the Engineer-in-Chief-cum-Special Secretary of the Works Department, the panel also includes the Chief Engineer (Roads-II) and the Additional District Magistrate (General), Cuttack. The committee has been directed to conduct a comprehensive inquiry to determine whether the incident resulted from human error or other lapses. Minister Prithviraj Harichandan stated that strict action will be taken if any party is found responsible.

Odisha Raj Bhavan to go fully solar-powered with 400 kW power plant

Odisha Govt To Finalise Administrative Boundaries By June 30 Ahead of Census

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): In a key preparatory move for the upcoming national Census, the Odisha government has set June 30, 2025, as the deadline to finalise the boundaries of all administrative units, including districts, sub-divisions, tahsils, revenue villages, and urban local bodies (ULBs). According to an official notification issued by the Revenue and Disaster Management Department, the state government has allowed changes in the boundaries of these administrative units until the end of June. After this date, the



boundaries will be frozen on July 1, 2025, and no further alterations will be permitted for the purposes of Census enumeration."The State Government do hereby allow changes of administrative boundaries of the Districts, Sub-Divisions, Tahasils, Revenue Villages and also Urban Local Bodies so fixed including boundaries fixed under any law for the time being in force, before 30th June, 2025. The boundaries of administrative units for ensuing Census will be frozen on 1st July, 2025," the notification stated. Freezing administrative

boundaries prior to a Census is a standard procedure carried out to ensure the accuracy, consistency, and comparability of data across all regions. This step helps census authorities avoid discrepancies in population counts and administrative records during enumeration. District administrations and local bodies across Odisha have been instructed to complete any necessary adjustments or restructuring of administrative units well before the June 30 deadline to ensure a smooth and accurate Census operation.

Economic offence: Cuttack Police puts up 'Wanted' notice outside fugitive's home

Cuttack, (DMC): In a stern move, the Commissionerate Police put up a public notice on Sunday outside fugitive Niranjan Behera's residence in Mangalabag in Cuttack, warning of property seizure if he fails to appear within a month. The action follows repeated court orders and his continued defiance since

According to official sources, the Police have taken visible legal action against Niranjan Behera, a fugitive accused in two financial fraud cases, by beating the 'dengura' (drum) and putting up a Latka (public proclamation notice) outside his residence in Gopalsahi. Acting on an instruction from the JMFC Court in the City, Mangalabag Police affixed the notice, declaring fugitive Niranjan (from Ranihat locality) as absconding



due to his repeated failure to appear in court despite multiple warrants issued since 2019. The court has officially labeled him a 'proclaimed offender' and 'abscondee' as

Police not only displayed the proclamation in front of his home but also issued a formal notice to his family, instructing them to ensure Niranjan appears before the authorities

within one month. Failure to do so, as per the court directive, will result in the confiscation of his entire property," Cuttack ACP Zone II, Girija Shankar Chakraborty said Niranian's long-standing evasion and disregard for court orders have now escalated the case, bringing him under stricter legal scrutiny.

The court had previously issued notices and Non-Bailable Warrants (NBWs) to which the accused had not responded, the ACP Zone II expressed in a presser while briefing mediapersons. mentioning, in a crackdown, the Commissionerate Police-Bhubaneswar had put up a warrant notice (Latka in local parlance) issued against a youth named Akshay Naik alias Nanda, on March 23. Akshay is accused of raping a minor girl.

Odisha's CAD&WM Schemes Boost Irrigation Potential, Agricultural Productivity



Bhubaneswar, (DMC): In a significant step toward strengthening sustainable water resource management, a high-level meeting chaired by Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary Anu Garg was held on Saturday.

The meeting was convened to share the findings of an independent evaluation study on the Command Area Development and Water Management (CAD & WM) and Reconstruction of Field Channels (RCOFC) schemes. Senior officials from Water Resources, Finance and other key stakeholders attended the meeting. The study assessed the progress made during the period

2021-22 to 2023-24, across six sample divisions covering both new and reconstructed field channel works. The results highlighted Odisha's notable achievements in improving irrigation efficiency, farmer participation, and agricultural productivity through targeted interventions in 59 major, medium, and minor irrigation

Key findings revealed a significant increase in irrigated land from 44% to 89%, reflecting a 102% rise in irrigation potential utilised (IPU); doubling of average household-level irrigated land from 0.9 acre to 1.8 Acre; average paddy yields increasing

by 18% with income rising by 84% etc. The study further noted positive impacts on cropping intensity, farmer engagement through Pani Panchayats, and socio-economic upliftment, while also recommending enhancements in field channel construction standards, maintenance protocols, and water governance reforms.

Garg lauded the progress and reaffirmed the State's commitment to inclusive, technology-driven, and farmer-centric irrigation reform. She emphasized the need for timely execution, robust monitoring, and convergence with digital platforms.



mark in his body' said Dr. P Satyam, Medical Incharge. IIC, Telkoi Police Station Anjan Kumar Patra said that " It is a very sad incident. An autopsy was performed. The mother and son are under treatment". Rise in snake bite incidents mostly in hilly surrounding tribal areas became a concern among the people.

Due to lack of concrete houses many are living in cutcha and mud houses and frequently falling prey to wild animals and reptiles. Hence social activists urge the administration to provide concrete houses to houseless. Similarly they urge to spread awareness among the tribal people to take the snake bite patients to medical immediately without talking to black magicians.



Three soldiers killed as army vehicle falls into gorge

RAMBAN, (HS): A tragic accident on Sunday claimed the lives of three Army personnel when their vehicle skidded off the road and plunged into a 700-feet deep gorge in the Ramban district of Jammu and Kashmir. The army truck was part of a convoy moving from Jammu to Srinagar along national highway 44 when the accident occurred near Battery Chashma at around 11.30 am, the officials said. A joint rescue operation was immediately launched by the Army, police, State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), and local volunteers. The bodies of the three soldiers were recovered from the crash site. The deceased were identified as Sepoys Amit Kumar, Sujeet Kumar, and Man Bahadur. Officials said the vehicle was completely destroyed in the fall, reduced to a mangled heap of metal.

Pakistan shuts ports for Indian ships after New Delhi bans imports from Islamabad

banned Indian-flagged ships from entering its ports with immediate effect after New Delhi imposed fresh punitive measures, including a ban on the import of goods and entry of Pakistani vessels into its ports, against Islamabad amid heightened tensions following the Pahalgam terror attack. India on Saturday imposed a ban on the import of goods coming from or transiting through Pakistan and also the entry of Pakistani ships into its ports even as Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the country is committed to taking "firm and decisive" action against terrorists and their backers. In retaliation, Pakistan late Saturday ordered that any Indian flag carriers would not be allowed to visit any Pakistani port and also barred Pakistani ships from docking at any Indian port. The Ministry of Maritime



Affairs, in a notification, said that it took the step of banning the Indian ships in the context of the current situation, keeping in mind maritime sovereignty, economic interests and national security. Indian-flagged ships will not be allowed to reach any Pakistani port. Similarly, Pakistani-flagged ships will not visit any Indian port, the ministry said. It said that the following steps will be taken immediately. Ties between the two neighbouring countries plummeted following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, mostly tourists. In fresh punitive measures against Pakistan that came into effect immediately amid heightened Indo-Pak tensions in the wake of the deadly suspended the exchange of mails and parcels from the neighbouring country via air and surface routes. Besides banning the entry of Pakistani ships into Indian ports, India also barred Indian ships from visiting Pakistani ports, according to the Directorate General of Shipping (DGS). The restrictions were put into place with immediate effect, officials said. According to an Indian government order, the complete ban on imports of all goods from Pakistan was imposed on the grounds of national security and public policy. Though the 200 per cent import duty imposed on Pakistani goods in 2019 after the Pulwama attack had effectively halted direct imports, the latest decision also prohibits the entry of Pakistani goods routed through third countries.

Air India Suspends Tel Aviv Flights Till May 6 After Houthi Missile Strike

New Delhi, (HS): Air India has suspended flights to Israel's capital Tel Aviv for the next two days following the Houthi rebels' missile attack at the Ben Gurion airport this morning. Air India has also assured that those with valid tickets will be offered a waiver or an option to reschedule. The decision, Air India said, has been taken to ensure the safety of passengers and staff.

"Air India flight AI139 from Delhi to Tel Aviv of 4 May 2025 was diverted to Abu Dhabi after an incident at Ben Gurion airport this morning. The flight has landed normally in Abu Dhabi and will soon return to Delhi. Consequently, our operations to and from Tel Aviv will remain suspended with immediate effect

till 6 May 2025, to ensure the safety of our customers and staff. Our staff on ground is assisting customers and helping them with alternative arrangements," the airline said in a statement. "Customers booked on our

Four people were injured after a missile fired from Yemen landed near the main terminal of Ben Gurion airport. The missile strike briefly halted operations at the airport. Authorities later said the operations had resumed.

Europe should show greater sensitivity for deeper ties with India: Jaishankar

NEW DELHI, (HS): External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar called on Europe to show greater sensitivity and mutuality of interest if it wants deeper ties with India. He also said that New Delhi is looking for "partners, not preachers." Speaking at the 'Arctic Circle India Forum', Jaishankar highlighted India's long-standing advocacy of 'Russia realism', pointing at the 'important fit' and 'complementarity' between the two countries. He described Russia as a resource provider and India as a resource consumer. He also criticised past Western efforts to resolve the Russia-Ukraine conflict without even involving Russia. He called such attempts a challenge to 'the basics of realism.' "Just like I am an advocate of Russian realism, I am also an advocate of American realism," Jaishankar said. "I think the best way to engage today's America is also through finding mutuality of interests rather than putting ideological differences upfront and then allowing it to cloud the possibilities of working together," he added. Responding to a question on India's expectations from Europe, the minister said Europe must move beyond preaching and act based on shared interests. "When we look out at the world, we look for partners; we do not look for preachers, particularly preachers who do not practise at home but preach abroad," he said. "I think parts of Europe are still struggling with that problem. Parts of them have changed," he noted, suggesting that Europe has entered "a certain zone of reality check." "Now, whether they can step up to it or not, it is something we will have to see," he added.

Houthi Missile Strike

Tel Aviv, (HS): A ballistic missile fired by Yemen's Houthi rebels towards Israel on Sunday landed just 75 meters from Terminal 3 of Ben Gurion Airport outside Tel Aviv-- the country's biggest international airport. The missile reportedly bypassed four layers of air defence and hit a grove adjacent to an access road within the airport's perimeter--one of the country's most sensitive zones-- creating a 25-metre deep crater. Israel Defence Forces (IDF) said their several attempts to intercept the missile failed before it landed near the airport, sending a plume of smoke into the air. However, a direct hit on terminal infrastructure was averted, yet it caused anic among passengers in the terminal building. At least eight people were injured in the attack, Magen David Adom (MDA), Israel's national emergency service, said. The military released a video of the aftermath of the strike showing officers standing at the edge of a crater in an orchard, with the airport's control tower visible in the distance. Yair Hezroni, the police's central district chief, can be heard saying in the video that "you can see the area just behind us: a crater was formed here, several dozen metres (yards) wide and several dozen metres deep". Meanwhile, authorities have also launched a full-scale investigation into the breach of Israel's air defence and the

missile's impact site near one of the

country's most sensitive zones.

Sikh Man Questions Rahul on Operation Blue Star, 1984



New Delhi, (HS): Responding to a sharp question on the Congress's role in the 1984 anti-Sikh riots, senior party leader Rahul Gandhi said a lot of these "mistakes" happened when "I was not there", but added that he was happy to take responsibility for "everything the Congress party has ever done wrong in its history". Mr Gandhi was at the Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs at Brown University in the US two weeks ago for an interaction. During a Q&A session, a Sikh man referred to Rahul Gandhi's earlier statement that "the fight in India is about whether a Sikh is going to be allowed to wear a turban, whether a Sikh will be allowed to wear a kada or go to the Gurudwara." "You create a fear among Sikhs about what BJP would look like, you talked about how politics should be fearless, we don't just want to wear kadas, we don't just want to tie turbans, we want freedom of expression, which has not been allowed under the Congress Party in the past," the Sikh youngster told Mr Gandhi. He said the Anandpur Sahib Resolution talks about Dalit rights and mentions nothing of separatism, but the then Congress labelled it a separatist document. "This is something your party has done, your party seems to lack the maturity to accept the mistakes it has made," he said. The Sikh man referred to former Congress leader Sajjan Kumar, who has been convicted of murder linked to the 1984 riots, and said, "Many more Sajjan Kumars are sitting in Congress Party." "You tell us to fear what the 'BJP India' would look like, but you haven't tried to reconcile with the Sikhs. What attempts are you making, because if you continue like this, BJP is also going to make its way into Punjab," he asked. In his response, Mr Gandhi said he doesn't think anything scares the Sikhs. "The statement I made was that do we want an India where people are uncomfortable to express their religion? As far as mistakes of Congress Party are concerned, a lot of those happened when I was not there, but I am more than happy to take responsibility for everything the Congress party has ever done wrong in its history," he said. "I have publicly stated that what happened in the 80s was wrong, I have been to the Golden Temple multiple times, I have extremely good relationships with the Sikh community in India," said the Leader of the Opposition, Lok Sabha.

Manipur: Manhunt on to Nab Armed Cadres for Giving 'Gun Salute' to People Killed in Violence

Imphal, (HS): Manipur Police and other security forces have launched a massive manhunt to nab the gunmen responsible for giving a reported 'gun salute' by some armed cadres as part of the tribute to those killed in ethnic violence in Kangpokpi district, officials said on Sunday. A police official said that the police have registered an FIR in connection with the gun salute incident at Saikul in Kangpokpi district on Saturday (May 3). He said that local leaders and elders were summoned to the police station and gathered information about the armed cadres who accorded the 'gun salute'.

"Raids have been conducted in different areas to arrest the gunmen. Five single-barrel guns and camouflage uniforms have been seized. Raids would continue to arrest the miscreants and seize the firearms. Organisers of the programme would be dealt with as per law," a police statement said. The official said that, as per law, except for security personnel, no one can display guns in any event or can not accord a gun salute to deceased persons. "The police continue to urge the public to return the looted and illegally held arms, ammunition and explosives to the police or nearest security forces immediately," the official said. Both the Meitei and Kuki-Zo-Hmar community organisations organised separate programmes on Saturday to mark the second anniversary of the outbreak of

State-Sponsored Sabotage: How Pakistan Became A Factory for Global Terror

New Delhi, (HS): For over three decades, India has faced the brunt of a proxy war - one waged not from across the world, but across the border. When the demand is made to "show evidence," it rings hollow. After all, how much proof is needed when the venom of terrorism seeps consistently from the same snake pit? Who arms and trains the terrorists that have repeatedly struck at the heart of India? Who provides them safe havens and ideological indoctrination? The answer remains unchanged: Pakistan.

From the bloodshed in Kashmir to the devastating 2008 Mumbai attacks, the fingerprints point clearly towards Pakistan's deep-state nexus of intelligence, military, and jihadi outfits. Lashkar-e-Taiba operative Tahawwur Rana - now extradited from the United States to India - was a key conspirator in the Mumbai massacre. Meanwhile, Hafiz Saeed walks freely in Pakistan, his terror empire untouched. Salahuddin, the Hizbul Mujahideen chief designated a global terrorist by the United States, lives openly in Pakistan. Dawood Ibrahim, the mastermind behind the 1993 Mumbai blasts and linked to later



attacks, including the Mumbai train bombings, has been sheltered for decades in Karachi. These aren't allegations - these are acknowledged facts. Pakistan's record isn't limited to Islamic extremism alone. It has given shelter to known Sikh separatist elements and allowed them to incite violence against India from afar. Osama bin Laden, the most wanted terrorist in the world, was found hiding in Abbottabad - a stone's throw from a major Pakistani military academy. Coincidence? Let's not forget the Taliban - born from Pakistan's madrassas, armed and guided by its establishment, and eventually used to bring Kabul to its knees. In the process, they also killed American soldiers. So the damage wasn't limited to India; the world paid the price for Pakistan's duplicity.

The truth becomes even clearer when Pakistan's own former leaders admit to this strategy. A former army chief who seized power in a coup once proudly stated that terrorism was a "low-cost option" against India. A former Prime Minister was forced to terror. Pakistan army chief General Asim Munir recently described Kashmir as Pakistan's "jugular vein" and praised the religious divide fuelling violence - a stark admission of strategic intent. The strategy is sinister: arm, train, and infiltrate terrorists across the LoC under the guise of local Kashmiri "freedom fighters." Sophisticated communication gear, near-military level training, and logistical support - these are not tools of grassroots rebellion, but of crossborder sabotage. Pakistan has also consistently resisted the international designation of its nationals involved in terrorism - often with the help of China - further shielding these actors from global accountability. The narrative is clear. This isn't only about Kashmir. It's also about a decades-long state policy of destabilising India through terror. The facts are undeniable. The casualties are real. The threat is ongoing. To ask for "evidence" after years of bombings, massacres, and buried bodies is to ignore the obvious. Pakistan's long-standing record as the world's foremost state sponsor of terrorism speaks louder than any dossier.

In Mandalay, major roads affected by the earthquake have been cleared of debris to prevent obstacles and ensure the safety of commuters, stateowned daily The Global New Light of Myanmar reported, citing the Myanmar Fire Headquarters.

Meanwhile, in Sagaing, cleanup operations continue with the use of heavy machinery to remove debris from large structures, including Buddhist learning centres and religious buildings located on higher ground, reports Xinhua news agency, citing The Global New Light of Myanmar. These efforts have so far resulted in a 50 per cent completion rate, the

As of Tuesday, 52 people have been rescued, and 103 bodies have been recovered from the collapsed Sky Villa condo in Mandalay region, local

media had reported.The Myanmar Rescue Team, Mandalay Region Fire Services Department, and the Mandalay Region government personnel have been carrying out rescue and clearance operations since March 28 at the collapsed site of Sky Villa, it added. The earthquake has caused the deaths of 3,759 people and injuries to 5,107 others, with 114 individuals still reported missing nationwide as of Tuesday, according to Global New Light of Myanmar. Meanwhile, atotal of 653 survivors have been rescued by emergency teams following the 7.7-magnitude earthquake, the state-owned daily Myanma Alinn reported on Friday.

Both local and international rescue teams carried out search and rescue operations. They were also able to retrieve 779 bodies as of Thursday, the report added. Myanmar has experienced a total of 157 aftershocks following the devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake on March 28.The aftershocks ranged from magnitude 2.8 to 7.5, the department said.

New Delhi, (H.S): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will not likely attend Russia's Victory Day parade to be held in Moscow on May 9 to mark the 80th anniversary of the Soviet Union's win over Germany in World War II, amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, sources said. Singh's Deputy, the Minister of State for Defence Sanjay Seth, may represent India at the event in Moscow, the officials said on Saturday. The decision comes amid

rising tensions between India and Pakistan following the recent terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir. While no official reason has been cited for Singh's absence, sources within the Ministry of Defence suggested that the security situation arising from the Pahalgam attack played a significant role in the decision. The development came on a day the Pakistan Army fired at Indian posts along the Line of Control (LoC) in sectors including Kupwara, Uri and Akhnoor, violating the ceasefire agreement



for the ninth straight day after the April 22 terror strike that killed 26 people. The Indian Army's counter-fire was measured but effective. Initially, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was invited by Russian President Vladimir Putin to attend the Victory Day parade.

However, due to the evolving security concerns and the escalating situation with Pakistan, it was decided that Rajnath Singh would attend in his place. Sources further mentioned that Prime Minister Modi's absence from the parade has sparked diplomatic discussions, with speculation linking the decision to the recent developments in Pahalgam. Russian President Vladimir Putin had extended invitations to leaders of several nations, including China's President Xi Jinping, for the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of the Soviet victory in World War II.

This year's Victory Day parade in Moscow will host leaders from nearly 20 countries. Victory Day on May 9 is a significant event in Russia, commemorating the Soviet Union's victory over Nazi Germany in 1945. The parade at Red Square is one of the most important ceremonies in Russia, drawing attention from world leaders and military officials. Prime Minister Modi visited Russia twice in 2024-once for an annual summit with President Putin and again for the BRICS

Summit held in Kazan. The upcoming Victory Day event is set to be a crucial part of Russia's diplomatic calendar, with President Putin planning a visit to India later this year for an annual summit. The decision to send Sanjay Seth instead of the Defence Minister highlights the sensitivity of India's security concerns following the Pahalgam attack. The attack, which claimed

the lives of several security personnel, has intensified the security situation in Kashmir and strained relations between India and Pakistan."While the invitation to the Victory Day parade was extended to both PM Modi and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, the growing concerns regarding the security situation have prompted this change in representation," a diplomatic source said. As tensions remain high, India's decision to send a lower-profile representative underscores the ongoing security challenges and the careful diplomatic balancing act the government is navigating.

According to the organisers, the event also aimed to raise international awareness about the illegal detention and continuous physical and psychological torture of key leaders from the Baloch Yakjehti Committee (BYC) including Mahrang Baloch, Shah Jee Baloch, Beebo Baloch, Bibagar Baloch, and Gulzadi Baloch. The protest saw participation from BNM members, supporters, and human rights activists, who gathered in large numbers holding banners and placards bearing slogans such as 'Stop Baloch Genocide, 'Enforced

Disappearances Are Unacceptable,' and 'Free BYC Leaders'. A photo exhibition was also held at the venue, capturing the dire situation in Balochistan through images of cultural identity. the sacrifices of 'martyrs', and portraits of enforced disappeared individuals. The display sought to convey the pain and suffering endured by the Baloch people over decades of repression. The BNM activists spoke about the Pakistan Army's alleged violence in the region and called for urgent global action to address the crisis. The protest highlighted the Netherlands chapter's resolve to raise the Baloch issue at international forums and press the global community into taking meaningful action." This protest and exhibition reflected BNM Netherlands' unwavering resolve to raise the voice of the Baloch nation on every global platform and to shake the conscience of the international community into taking effective action against the ongoing state atrocities in Balochistan," the statement concluded. Canberra, (H.S): Prime Minister Anthony Albanese's centre-left Labor Party has won a second term in power in Australia's federal election.Labor Party on Saturday night retained power in a landslide election victory that is set to deliver the party its most seats in the lower house of the federal parliament, where the government is formed, in history, according to projections from the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC).It makes Albanese the first leader of either major party to win consecutive elections since 2004, Xinhua news agency reported.

Delivering his victory speech at a Labor event in his native Sydney, Albanese described serving as Prime Minister as the "greatest honour" of his life." Australians have chosen to face global challenges the Australian way, looking after each other while building for the future," he said. Albanese pledged to "govern for all Australians" and said that the re-elected government would spend "every day" of the next three years repaying voters' trust."We take out this task with new hope, new confidence and new determination. Together we



are turning a corner and together we will make our way forward," he said."This is a time of profound opportunity for our nation. We have everything we need to seize this moment and make it our own, but we must do it together." As of 10:45 p.m. local time, the ABC projected that Labor Party was likely to win at least 87 of the 150 seats in the lower house of the 48th Parliament,

surpassing the party's recordhigh of the 86 seats it won in the 1986 election. The official count conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission put Labor ahead of the conservative Coalition of the Liberal and National Parties 56.4-43.6 on a two-party basis as of Saturday night, with voters swinging towards the government across

the country. Among the seats won by Labor was that of Dickson in Brisbane's north, which had been held by Opposition leader Peter Dutton since 2001.It makes Dutton the first Opposition leader to lose his seat at a federal election in Australian history.

The ABC said that the opposition Coalition was likely to win at least 39 lower house seats, with 12 going to minor parties and Independents and the remaining 12 still in doubt. Addressing supporters at an election night event in Brisbane earlier, Dutton said that he had called Albanese to concede defeat."We didn't do well enough during this campaign, that much is obvious tonight, and I accept full responsibility," he added. Dutton's defeat in Dickson means that members of the Liberal Party,

will have to elect a new party leader to serve as the Opposition leader in the 48th Parliament.On Saturday, polls opened at more than 7,000 locations across Australia, with voters set to decide if Albanese's centre-left Labor Party will govern for a second term or if the conservative Coalition of the Liberal and National Parties, led by Dutton, will win power.

Voting in the election is mandatory for all Australian citizens aged 18 years and over who are registered on the electoral roll maintained by the Australian Electoral Commission, with those who fail to do so facing small administrative fines. When Australians vote in federal elections, they fill in two ballot papers, one for the lower house of the federal parliament, the House of Representatives, and one for the upper house, the Senate. All 150 seats in the lower house will be filled at the election, as well as 40 out of 76 seats in the Senate. Each lower house seat represents an electorate, geographic divisions that each contain nearly the same number of voters, while Senators represent their state or territory.

Pakistan ISPR's Web Of Lies Exposed; Used Chinese Drones, Fabricated Chats, Invented Stories To Blame India

New Delhi, (H.S): Days after Pakistan's Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) along with its Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar shifted blamed on India for the terror incidents of its soil,

it has emerged that the rouge nation and its state machinery invented a series of lies, to deflect blame for Pahalgam terror attack and also to hold India accountable for the chaos and turmoil in its own territory. A series of damning disclosures by

an X user, in response to ISPR's charges, points to various machinations and stratagems by Pakistani agency ISPR in pushing an anti-India propaganda.Finding itself on the backfoot post Pahalgam attack,

Pakistan and its agencies resorted to an array of forgery, fabricated screenshots, fake audio, invented stories and laughable theatrics in building an anti-India narrative, it said. Notably, Pak's DGP ISPR Lt.



Gen. Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry held a press conference on April 29 and alleged India's role in terror attacks on Pakistani soil. The accusations were reiterated a day later by Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar.

He not only echoed ISPR's baseless claims but also publicly invited independent experts to analyse and verify the claims. The X user spotlights multiple flaws in Pakistan's forensic exercise and

also goes to rebut 'every piece of evidence', as claimed by Pakistan's ISPR and foreign minister."Basic rule of digital forensics is use of cloned, non-active devices to preserve data integrity.

ISPR's 'forensic investigation' was conducted on a live, active phone with dual SIMs. This alone should have disqualified the entire exercise. Live device = dead forensic," the user said. The user further tears apart its claims and charges in broadly five



There are two aspects behind it - Given education level of the terrorist, it is impossible that he knew to install specific apps for WhatsApp voice/ call recordings. Alternately, the ISPR might have planted malware in terrorist's phone since beginning," it said.

Consumption of Diesel, Petrol Rises In April As Economic Activity Picks Up

New Delhi, (H.S): India's consumption of petroleum products such as diesel, petrol and LPG recorded a significant increase in April this year, reflecting the rising level of economic activity in the country. India's diesel consumption rose to 8.24 million tonnes in April, which is the second highest monthly consumption ever, as demand from the agricultural and transport sectors grew during the month, according to data compiled by the Petroleum Planning & Analysis Cell

The 4 per cent year-on-year growth came on the back of a high base in April 2024, when diesel consumption had surged by double digits due to the electoral campaigning for the Lok Sabha polls. The high growth in the consumption of diesel, which constitutes close to 40 per cent of fuel sales,



reflects the higher economic activity in both the farm and logistics sectors of the economy. The fuel is also consumed in the industrial and mining sectors, which also account for part of the growth. Similarly, petrol consumption registered a growth of 4.6 per cent to 3.44 million tonnes in April. Petrol consumption last year had soared by 19 per cent due to hectic campaigning carried out by various political parties in the Lok Sabha elections. The growth

comes on a high base as vehicle sales have been on the rise in a economy.LPG growing consumption also recorded a significant 6.7 per cent growth during the month to 2.62 million tonnes, as the Centre's Ujjwala scheme brought the fuel within the reach of poor families. Besides. commercial consumption of the fuel in hotels and restaurants has also gone up. The figures also show that the consumption of aviation turbine fuel (ATF) by commercial 7,66,000 tonnes during the month, which represents a 3.25 per cent increase over the same month of the previous year. Meanwhile, the public sector oil companies on Thursday slashed the price of commercial LPG by Rs 14.50 per 19-kg cylinder while the price of jet fuel for airlines was cut by 4.4 per cent.

The price of ATF was reduced by around Rs 3 954 38

airlines in April was registered at

reduced by around Rs 3,954.38 per kilolitre (1,000 litres) to Rs 85,486.80 per kl, which will come as a shot in the arm for commercial airlines such as Air India and IndiGo as fuel accounts for around 30 per cent of their operational costs. The reduction in fuel prices comes against the backdrop of crude oil prices having fallen to a four-year low in the global market, with the benchmark Brent crude hovering at around \$63 a barrel, the lowest since April 2021.

Warren Buffett Shares Views on Tariffs, AI, Dollar Depreciation & Berkshire Hathaway's Cash Reserves At Annual Meeting

New Delhi, (H.S): Renowned investor Warren Buffett, at Berkshire Hathaway's annual meeting where he announced he would be stepping down at the end of the year, shared his opinion on a wide range of important topics, including tariffs, artificial intelligence (AI), currency depreciation, the company's vast cash reserves, and investments in real estate. The 94-year-old investing legend criticised tariffs, calling them a "big mistake" and warned that trade should never be used as a weapon.

Buffett emphasised the importance of global trade, stating that the United States has risen from humble beginnings to become the world's most significant country. He pointed out that America should focus on trading with the rest of the world, excelling in areas where it is best, while other nations should do the same in their respective strengths.

Buffett also addressed the issue of currency depreciation, describing it as a natural tendency of governments to gradually devalue currency over time. He called it a "scary" phenomenon and admitted that the US dollar is expected to weaken against foreign currencies in 2025.



However, he made it clear that Berkshire Hathaway is not taking any specific steps to mitigate the impact of currency depreciation on its income."We don't do anything about the impact of currency devaluation on quarterly and annual earnings," Buffett remarked. He added that he could not recall any board meeting where he suggested any action to address this issue.

Buffett further emphasised that Berkshire Hathaway avoids focusing on short-term metrics, as the company does not consider them in its decision-making process. Turning to the company's large cash reserves, which exceed \$300 billion, Buffett defended Berkshire's cautious approach. He reassured stakeholders that the company remains optimistic about the

future. "We don't just emphasise capital investment to show that we are doing something," he said. He mentioned that Berkshire was recently close to making a \$10 billion investment, and when the right opportunity arises, the company would not hesitate to spend "100 billion dollars". Asked about AI, Buffett passed the question to Ajit Jain, Vice Chairman of Berkshire Hathaway's Insurance Operations.

Jain acknowledged that AI is a game-changer, particularly in transforming how the company assesses and prices risks, as well as how it handles claims. However, Jain also stated that Berkshire Hathaway has never been a leader in emerging technologies and, so far, has not found any compelling opportunities in AI to pursue.

New Delhi, (H.S): At India's first World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit (WAVES) in Mumbai earlier this week, the country's creator economy was brought to the centre of the national economic conversation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, addressing thousands of attendees, called on young creators to "drive the nation's Orange Economy forward", crediting their work as fuelling a new wave of creativity. This summit comes months after the Centre's announcement of a \$1 billion fund dedicated to supporting India's growing creator economy.

According to the government, the fund will allow creators to access capital, hone their skills, upgrade production quality, and connect with global markets. In addition to this fund, the government has sanctioned ?391 crore to establish the Indian Institute of Creative Technology (IICT), a new institution aimed at building expertise in digital and creative technologies.

Together, these initiatives suggest a strategic shift in how the government views the creator economy - no longer as an informal or side-hustle driven ecosystem, but potentially as a structured and export-ready industry akin to India's software and MSME sectors. This comes at atime when Indians collectively spent 1.1 lakh crore hours staring at their smartphones in 2024, according to EY, as cheap internet makes platforms from Instagram to Netflix more accessible to the world's most populous nation. A report by the Boston Consulting Group (BCG), titled 'From Content to Commerce: Mapping

India's Creator Economy', estimates that creators already influence over \$350 billion in annual spending in India, a figure that could cross \$1 trillion by 2030. Direct revenues from the ecosystem are also projected to grow from \$20-25 billion today to \$100-125 billion by the end of the decade. Vipin Gupta, managing director and partner at BCG, said that "India's creator economy is poised to play a pivotal role in shaping consumer behaviour", adding that creator-driven spending could make up 25-30% of total consumer expenditure in the country by 2030. He said that what was once seen as a metro and Gen Z-centric phenomenon has now spread across age groups and geographies, particularly smaller cities. "Categories like fashion, beauty, and entertainment are leading the charge, while emerging monetisation modelssuch as live commerce and virtual gifting-are redefining how creators and brands drive value together," Gupta said. India is currently home to an estimated 2 to 2.5 million active digital creators with over

1,000 followers. But only 8-10% are able to monetise their content effectively, pointing to a large unrealised potential. The BCG report suggests that short-form video remains the most dominant format, with YouTube Shorts, Instagram Reels and Moj at the forefront. Popular genres include comedy, films, daily soaps and fashion. BCG said that to fully benefit from this growth, brands must trust creator-led outcomes, streamline internal decision-making, adopt faster content creation processes, and invest in long-term partnerships with creators. It also said that budgets for creator marketing could rise by 1.5 to 3 times in the next two to three years. Gupta said, "To fully leverage this potential, brands must trust creatorled outcomes, streamline decisionmaking, embrace agile content strategies, and invest in long-term creator partnerships." In his inaugural address at WAVES 2025 summit, Modi said that creators whether "musicians from Guwahati, podcasters from Kochi, game designers in Bengaluru, or filmmakers in Punjab" - are fuelling

India's growing creative sector. He compared their potential impact to that of Hindi cinema, citing actor Raj Kapoor's legacy in making India a global soft power. He also said that the creator economy is bringing "new energy" to India's ambition of becoming a \$5 trillion economy.

Alongside WAVES, the

government launched WAVES Bazaar, a global e-marketplace designed to connect Indian content creators with international buyers and collaborators. It allows creators to showcase their work, pitch projects and find commercial opportunities abroad. The platform aims to make India a net exporter of content by simplifying business interactions and providing tailored resources. The push towards formalising the creator economy is supported by recent growth numbers.

A report by Qoruz, an Influencer Marketing Intelligence Platform, shows that the number of influencers in India grew from 962,000 in 2020 to 4.06 million in 2024, a 322% increase in four vears. Aditya Gurwara, cofounder and head of brand alliances at Qoruz, said, "Over the years, we've seen a significant shift in how brands approach their marketing strategies. Influencers have moved beyond product endorsements to becoming strategic partners for brands." He added that brands now seek creators who can produce authentic, contextdriven content. "Categories like Gaming, Travel, and Lifestyle are growing at an exceptional pace, and brands have an incredible opportunity to align with creators who truly understand their audiences," he said.



Vaani's all posts on Abir Gulal, co-star Fawad Khan disappear from Insta

Bollywood actor Vaani Kapoor was all set to star opposite Pakistani actor Fawad Khan in his Bollywood comeback film Abir Gulal. However, after the Pahalgam terror attack in April, the film faced backlash, and government sources told PTI that the movie would not be allowed to release in India. Amid this, all traces of the film's promotional activity were removed from Vaani's Instagram account.

Soon after the Pahalgam

attack, all posts related to Abir Gulal and Fawad Khan vanished from Vaani's Instagram. From posters and teasers to behind-the-scenes moments, the promotional content disappeared from the actor's profile. However, according to Times Now, Vaani herself did not delete the posts. The content was originally shared as Instagram collabs, and the actual deletion was done by the film's production team, not Vaani. As a result, the posts were automatically

removed from her profile as well. This move came after the Instagram accounts of several Pakistani artistes, including Fawad Khan, Hania Aamir, Mahira Khan, Atif Aslam and others, were restricted in India following the Pahalgam terror attack. Anyone attempting to access their profiles from within India is met with a blank page and a message that reads: "Account not available in India. This is because we complied with a legal request to restrict this

ontent."

For the unversed, Abir Gulal, a romantic drama helmed by Aarti S. Bagdi and produced by Vivek Agrawal, was scheduled to release in India on 9 May. However, following the attack in Pahalgam and rising political tension between Pakistan and India, government sources told PTI, "The movie Abir Gulaal, starring Pakistani actor Fawad Khan, will not be allowed to release in India." On 22 April, 26 people, mostly civilians,

were gunned down in a terror attack in South Kashmir's Pahalgam. It has been described as the deadliest attack in the Valley since the Pulwama strike in 2019. Bollywood stars like Shah Rukh Khan, Salman Khan, Alia Bhatt, Priyanka Chopra and others condemned the attack. Pakistani actors such as Hania Aamir and Mahira Khan also expressed sorrow over the lives lost.

Meanwhile, Vaani was most recently seen in the Bollywood film Raid 2. The actor played the role of Ajay Devgn's wife in the film. Directed by Raj Kumar Gupta, the film also starred Saurabh Shukla, Riteish Deshmukh, Rajat Kapoor and Supriya Pathak, among others, in key roles. She will next be seen in Badtameez Gill, which also stars Aparshakti Khurana, Paresh Rawal, Sheeba Chaddha, Richard Bhakti Klein, and Monica Chaudhary in pivotal roles. The release date is yet to be announced.

"I would've worked the same with him as I did with Joe Root and Jonny Bairstow at the start of their careers. Root turned out to be the greatest player of spin England's ever had," he added.
