

SC Junks Mughal Ruler's **Descendant's** "Give Me Red Fort Or..." Plea



New Delhi, (HS): The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed a plea to hand over the Red Fort - the 17th century Mughal red sandstone fortress that is one of Delhi's most iconic historical monuments - to the 'widow of the great-grandson of the last Mughal emperor, Bahadur Shah Zafar II'.

Faced with a plea from a Sultana Begum, Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna retorted, "Why only Red Fort? Why not Fatehpur Sikri (the capital of the Mughal empire during Akbar's reign in the late 16th century), Taj Mahal (famously commissioned by Shah Jahan in the 17th)?" "You want to argue this..." a bemused Chief Justice said as he junked the 'misconceived' plea. Sultana Begum, who lives in Howrah near Kolkata, had demanded possession of the Red Fort on grounds she is a direct descendant of the original owners, i.e., the Mughal emperors. The Red Fort had been taken away from the Mughals by the British administration after the First War of Independence in 1857, after which Bahadur Shah Zafar II, who had supported the first rebellions against the colonial rulers, was exiled and his lands and properties confiscated. Alternatively, she demanded financial assistance from the government to give up her claim. This is not the first time she has made this plea. Then Sultana Begum had pointed out that in 1960 the government had confirmed the claim of her (now deceased) husband, Bedar Bakht as the descendant and heir of Bahadur Shah Zafar II.

Putin's "Full Support" to PM as Pak Seeks Russia Role in Pahalgam Probe

New Delhi, (HS): Russian President Vladimir Putin dialled Prime Minister Narendra Modi today and strongly condemned the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, where 25 tourists and a Kashmiri were shot dead in cold blood. This is significant because it comes shortly after voices in the Pakistani establishment had batted for the involvement of Russia and China in the investigation into the terror strike. The Kremlin also said President Putin has accepted an invitation from Prime Minister Modi to visit India and that the two leaders had emphasised that relations between Russia and India were not affected by external influence and are developing dynamically.

The Russian President conveyed his deepest condolences and stressed that those involved and behind the attack must be brought to justice. "President Putin @KremlinRussia_E called PM @narendramodi and strongly condemned the terror attack in Pahalgam, India. He conveyed deepest condolences on the loss of innocent lives and expressed full



against terrorism. He emphasised that the perpetrators of the heinous attack and their supporters must be brought to justice," Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X. The two leaders reiterated their commitment to further deepen strategic ties. "PM conveyed greetings to President Putin on the celebration of the 80th anniversary of Victory Day and invited him for the Annual Summit to be held in India later in the year," the MEA spokesperson added. The Russian President's call to Prime Minister Modi comes days

after Pakistani Defence Minister Khawaja Asif said in an interview that Russia, China or Western countries can play a very positive role in the crisis. In the interview to Russian government-run RIA Novosti news agency, the Pakistani Minister said, "I think Russia or China or even Western countries can play a very, very positive role in this crisis and they can even set up an investigation team that should be assigned this job to investigate whether India or Modi is lying or he is telling the truth. Let an international team find out." The minister said Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was also in favour of an

international investigation. "Let's find out who is the culprit and the perpetrator of this incident in India, in Kashmir, talk or empty statements have no effect. There must be some evidence that Pakistan is involved or that these people were supported by Pakistan. These are just statements, empty statements and nothing more," he was quoted as saying. Gajapati Maharaja Says Digha Temple Cannot Be Called 'Jagannath Dham'

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Amid a growing controversy over the naming of a new Jagannath temple in West Bengal, Gajapati Maharaja Dibya Singha Deb of Puri on Monday issued a statement clarifying that the recently inaugurated temple in Digha cannot be called Jagannath Dham. In a press release, the Gajapati Maharaja asserted that the original and only Peetha (sacred seat) of Lord Shree Jagannath Mahaprabhu is Purushottama Kshetra, also known as Shree Kshetra, located in Puri, Odisha. "We came to know from various media reports that the newly constructed Shri Jagannath Temple in Digha, East Medinipur, West Bengal, has been named as 'Jagannath Dham' or 'Jagannath Dham Cultural Centre'," the Gajapati said. He further stated that the matter was referred to the Mukti Mandap Pandit Sabha, the apex religious advisory body in Puri, through a letter dated May 3, 2025. A formal response was received on May 4.In its reply, the Mukti Mandap Pandit Sabha reiterated that while deities of the Chaturdha Murti (the four principal deities of Jagannath tradition) may be consecrated elsewhere, no place other than Puri can be designated as Jagannath Dham, Shree Purushottama Kshetra, Shree Kshetra, or Neelachal Dham.

Thunderstorms, Gusty Wind & Humid **Conditions Likely in Odisha: IMD**

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a seven-day weather forecast for Odisha, warning of rain, thunderstorms, gusty winds, and hot and humid conditions in several districts between May 5 and May 12. On May 5, light to moderate rain or thundershowers are likely in the afternoon or evening in parts of Coastal Odisha, along with districts like Nuapada, Bolangir, Sonepur, Bargarh, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Sambalpur, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Rayagada, Koraput, Malkangiri, and Nawarangapur. The IMD has issued a Yellow Warning for thunderstorms with lightning and wind speeds reaching 30 to 40 kmph in Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar, Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Bargarh, Nawarangapur, Koraput, Malkangiri, and Sambalpur. Between May 6 and 7, similar weather is expected across Odisha. Thunderstorms with lightning and stronger winds of 40 to 50 kmph are likely in Koraput, Malkangiri, Rayagada, Gajapati, Ganjam, Mayurbhanj, and Keonjhar. Another Yellow Warning is in place for thunderstorms with winds reaching 30 to 40 kmph in Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Nawarangapur, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Angul, Dhenkanal, Deogarh, and Sundargarh. From May 7 to 10, light to moderate rain or thundershowers are likely at one or two places mainly in southern Odisha including Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati, Nawarangapur, Ganjam, and Kalahandi.

Pak-Based Cyber Groups Target India Again, Multiple Defence Websites Hacked

New Delhi, (HS): Amid rising tensions in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, Pakistani hackers are targeting Indian defence websites. According to sources in the defence establishment, the cyber attacks may have compromised sensitive information about defence personnel, including their login credentials.

A handle on X, Pakistan Cyber Force, has claimed that hackers gained access to sensitive data of the Military Engineer Services and the Manohar Parrikar Institute of Defence Studies and Analyses. The group, sources said, has also tried to deface the website of Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited, a Public

Sector Undertaking under the Ministry of Defence. The sources said the website of Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited has been taken offline for a thorough audit to assess the extent of any potential damage caused by the hacking attempt. Cybersecurity experts, the sources said, are actively monitoring cyberspace to detect any additional attacks, particularly those that may be sponsored by threat actors linked to Pakistan. Also, appropriate measures are being taken to strengthen the security infrastructure to guard against further intrusion attempts. The Pakistan Cyber Force handle, now withheld in India, had posted images of a webpage from

Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited. In the image, an Indian tank had been replaced by a Pakistani tank. Another post had a list of names, ostensibly of Indian defence personnel, with a message: "Hacked. Your security is illusion. MES data owned.' The handle claimed that it had accessed more than 10 GB data of 1,600 users on the Manohar Parrikar Institute of Defence Studies and Analyses website.

Ties between India and Pakistan have touched rock bottom in the wake of the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, where 25 tourists and a Kashmiri were shot dead in cold blood. The Resistance Front, a proxy of the Pakistan-based

Lashkar-e-Taiba, has claimed responsibility for the heinous attack. India has vowed an exemplary response as the investigation into the terror strike points to a Pakistani hand, like several other attacks on Indian soil in the past. India has launched a series of diplomatic moves against Pakistan, including the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty and visa services to Pakistani nationals. Marathon meetings between Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah and top officials in the defence establishment suggest that a bigger action is imminent. Pakistan, on the other hand, has gone back to its playbook of

denying any role in the attacks and asking for evidence. Following terror strikes in the past, including the 26/11 attacks in Mumbai, Indian authorities shared information and evidence with Pakistan, but the latter has never done enough to bring the perpetrators to justice. After India suspended the Indus Waters Treaty, Pakistan said any move to stop water flowing into the country would be seen as an act of power and threatened to suspend all bilateral pacts, including the Simla Agreement that validates the Line of Control.

It is against this backdrop that Pakistani hackers are targeting Indian defence websites.

Caste Census

The Narendra Modi government's decision to hold a caste census with the next population Census is a turning point and a milestone. In a sense, the state is catching up with the lived socioeconomic and political reality. Caste shapes hierarchy and discrimination, culture and belonging. It plays a role in structuring opportunity and social mobility. It influences choices and trajectories, from education to employment, and rituals of birth, death and marriage. Political parties have long recognised the power of caste as a mobilisational tool and category. And in 1990, with the acceptance of the recommendations of the Mandal Commission Report, the central government acknowledged and affirmed what different state governments across the country had already responded to - the upsurge of the middle castes or Other Backward Classes, and their demand for a more equitable participation and representation. The Mandal moment made job and education quotas the centrepiece of affirmative action policies for OBCs at the Centre, but at the same time, it also inaugurated a long period of dissonance - after all, the government was framing caste-based policy without the empirical data on caste that is necessary for evidence-driven policy. That this glaring gap is now set to be filled is much-needed and enormously welcome. The demand for the caste census has been central to the agenda of Congress, and more specifically Rahul Gandhi, for at least two years now. It was first heard prominently in the Karnataka assembly election in 2023, and it dominated the Lok Sabha poll campaign the following year. The Modi government's Wednesday announcement can, therefore, be read as a vindication of its main opponent's plank, and as a bid to wrest it. It is also a turnaround for a party whose leader said only recently that he recognises only four castes - women, the poor, youth and farmers. By all accounts, ever since Mandal became a political force in the 1990s, rearranging the national political lexicon and giving rise to new caste-based parties, the politics of Mandir was seen as the political counter to it. The project of Hindutva consolidation, went the argument, was threatened by the caste-centric framework. It soon became apparent, though, that the lines were shifting, and that the binary was not tidy. Over the years, even as the original votaries of "social justice" let their political platform become faded and frayed - Congress, a late convert, has sounded more insistent than credible in its demands for the caste census - the BJP has proved to be agile in crisscrossing the political-ideological fence, and in planting its flag on the other side. Its decision on the caste census now puts its imprimatur on a politics that it opposed to begin with, was awkward with for some time, and then purposefully worked to make its own. There is work to be done after the caste census announcement.

The design of the questionnaire will be consequential, and there will be the task of connecting the dots between the data and government policy. The caste census will also pave the way for the delimitation exercise - the OBC numbers and the gaps they point to may blunt the north-south faultline - and the implementation of women's reservation in Parliament. It may lead to demands for extending quotas, and for removing the Supreme Court-mandated cap of 50 per cent reservation. There are challenges ahead, but the fact that caste will finally be counted provides a robust, data-driven basis for policy and politics.

Asthma Day




 \mathbf{W} orld Asthma Day is observed on the first Tuesday of May every year. This year it falls on May 6. The annual event is observed to spread awareness about people suffering from asthma. It is organized by the Global Initiative for Asthma (GINA) in collaboration with health care groups and asthma educators. Asthma is a prevalent problem worldwide. Do you know that approximately 25 million Americans have asthma? Asthma is a chronic disease of the airway. Inflammation occurs in the airways that lead to the lungs causing blockage and breathing difficulties.

Asthma is a common concern, and according to WHO, 262 million people had asthma in 2019, and it caused over 460,000 deaths. The death rate from asthma has nearly doubled since the 1980s, but the condition is not new. There is mention of asthma in scriptures from China in 2600 B.C., and Ancient Egypt also mentions the symptoms of breathlessness and respiratory issues. Hippocrates (460 to 370 B.C) was the first to describe the condition found in Ancient Greece. Hippocrates was the first to link asthma symptoms to environmental triggers and specific trades and professions. Around 100 B.C. Aretaeus of Cappadocia composed a detailed definition of asthma. It is similar to how we today understand the development of the disease. The ancient Romans also explored the condition. In 50 A.D., Pliny the Elder discovered links between pollen and breathing difficulties. He was one of the first to recommend a predecessor of epinephrine, a

quick-relief form of asthma treatment. In the 19th century, doctor Henry H. Salter made accurate descriptions and medical drawings of what happens in the lungs during asthma attacks. In 1892, one of the co-founders of the Johns Hopkins Medical School, William Osler, noted similarities between asthma and allergic conditions. These include hay fever, as well as the genetic nature of the disease. He also noted specific triggers of asthma such as climate, extreme emotion, and diet. The 1980s saw better comprehension of asthma as an inflammatory condition. It focused on the importance of the immune system. Doctors realized the need to manage asthma even if the symptoms do not occur.


Changing thinking on Nature and Woman

Language is the most important medium of showing the structure and ideology of any society. It would not only be a means of dialogue but also reflect power relations, social structures, and cultural perceptions. In the early days of the development of civilization, man lived lovingly with nature, then the language of humans was the language of love, in which every person was a sense of concern for the object, nature in that period nature was seen as an organism or woman. In ancient myths and religious texts of different cultures nature is represented as feminine, a symbol of creation, fertility and rearing. In Santhali language 'earth' is called 'earth', 'forest' in Gondi language, the river in 'life' Korku language is called 'mother', which shows respect for nature. On the other hand huge, hard and shocking mountains from height, roaring sea and springs were given pulling form. With knowing nature understanding scientific revolution

nurtured nature weakened. Due to the increasing influence of science and rationalism during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, nature was no longer seen as a power to reconcile, but it began to be seen as an object that can be controlled. In this process, the feminine image of nature also became blurred and replaced by a mechanical approach. It's a great pleasure to have you. This new thinking saw nature as a power that had to be won, not as a power that should be revered and respected. As a result, the language became offensive, authoritarian and resource-centric. In this new approach, nature was considered a power on which man had to conquer. Now the language of this logical man began to be aggressive, disobedient and violent. One thing more noteworthy is that scientists technically considered abiotic of most of the elements of nature, for example soil, water, sun, air were not considered all living factors. Because of this, emotional engagement with them also became difficult. At the same time, the language of agriculture was like ploughing, cropping and trample. Increased tendency to control and use both nature and woman, thereby attempting to legalize exploitation and subjugation of woman and nature through the language symbols created environmental imbalances and social inequalities. Historically, the feminine and nature were presented equally vulnerable,



gentle and controlled. In patriarchal society, the language has been used to promote a particular approach towards women and nature. However, along with this another image of nature was created. A dialectical depiction of natural calamities such as a storm of uncontrolled and violent power, rain, drought and earthquake, on one hand, sees it as an exploitable humble power and on the other hand portraying it as destructive power, reflects the vision historically adopted towards women in patriarchal societies. Today unlimited development and human exploitation of natural resources are being considered as normal and natural. We not only consider oil, energy, water, air and trees, etc. as resources, but also use myriad noun words for these, indicating that these resources are unlimited. Also in the pair of contradiction words, the word

'development' is always considered neutral, as from: always this is what happens, how fast is the car (not how slow), how wide is the road, how high is the building (not how low), how high is its income (not how low). Nowadays, it is also a great practice to act at a fast pace. While both woman and nature were linked to nutrition balance. and industrialization, both began to be seen as a power that was required to be captured. For example, natural resources are also described as 'exploitable' in scientific and technical language, such as 'exploitation of land, 'consuming energy' These terminology indicates that nature is made for human consumption only, not in a vibrant and self-sufficient unit form, when the role of women is described, they are usually presented as a symbol of tolerance, service and sacrifice. Redefining language from the

is not limited to merely changing words, but it provides a way of thinking. It is considered that there is such use of language and symbols, denoting equality and mutual respect. For example, women are often denoted as earth, river, moon or tree. Earth is given the form of 'Mother', which is considered to be tolerant and nurturing. Similarly, women are also seen as an idol of tolerance and sacrifice, but this approach makes women's rights and their personalities secondary. Women are often compared to the river- 'Woman's life is like a river'. This metaphor shows their variable and flowing nature, which in one way limits their existence to adapt to others. The work of binding the life of both the woman and the river with this metaphor was deeply penetrated in our conduct starting language in the society. Strians started living within one in the house, then dams began to be built by stopping the continuous flow of rivers. Idioms like 'Chand Sa Mukhda' in the language connect the beauty of women to the moon, but it also externally reveals the excessive inclination of the society towards beauty. Their role and position are controlled by comparing them with other words for women in the language. This comparison is ever positive, so ever abusive. India's Strategic Gambit in the US-China Economic Crossfire

The global economic landscape is undergoing a seismic shift as former President Donald Trump's latest tariff offensive against China sends shockwaves through international markets. With surgical precision, the new measures impose crippling 100% duties on Chinese electric vehicles and target \$18 billion worth of advanced manufacturing importsa move that transcends mere protectionism and enters the realm of economic warfare. This dramatic escalation, coming at a pivotal political moment, not only undermines China's technological ambitions but also reshuffles the deck for emerging economies like India that find themselves caught in the crossfire of this great-power confrontation. What makes this development

particularly consequential is its timing and specificity. Unlike the broad-based tariffs of Trump's first term, these measures represent a carefully calibrated strike at China's most strategic industries. The astronomical hike in EV tariffs, soaring from 25% to 100%, effectively slams the door on Chinese automakers like BYD just as they were preparing to enter the American market. Meanwhile, lithium-ion battery duties have more than tripled, dealing a direct blow to China's green energy dominance. The ripple effects are already being felt across global supply chains, with Shanghai's semiconductor stocks plunging 7% within hours of the announcementa telling indicator of the markets' jittery response to what analysts are calling the most aggressive trade maneuver since the Smoot-Hawley tariffs of 1930. For India, this economic upheaval presents both unprecedented opportunities and sobering challenges. On one hand, the sudden vacuum in the American market creates a golden chance for Indian manufacturers to step in. Battery makers like Amara Raja and Exide could potentially



capture significant market share as U.S. importers scramble for alternatives to Chinese suppliers. Similarly, India's pharmaceutical and IT sectors stand to benefit as American businesses diversify their supply chains away from China. Yet these potential windfalls come shadowed by considerable risks-chief among them being the very real possibility that China might redirect its export machine toward Indian markets, flooding them with subsidized goods that could undercut domestic producers. Already, there are troubling signs that Chinese lithium batteries and solar panels might soon appear in Indian markets at prices 30-40% below local manufacturing costs, threatening to derail India's carefully cultivated "Make in India" initiative.

Complicating matters further is India's delicate trade balancing act. While the country enjoys a comfortable \$35.3 billion surplus with the United States, its \$85.1 billion deficit with China reveals a dangerous dependency that leaves key industries vulnerable to supply shocks. This asymmetry becomes particularly concerning when considering potential Chinese

countermeasures-history shows that Beijing typically responds to trade pressure with asymmetric retaliation, often through strategic controls on critical exports. A repeat of China's 2010 rare earth metals embargo, for instance, could cripple India's burgeoning

electronics and defense sectors overnight. Meanwhile, the specter of Trump's mercurial trade policies looms large, with his past branding of India as the "biggest tariff abuser" serving as a stark reminder that New Delhi's export advantages could vanish with a single presidential tweet. Navigating this complex terrain will require statesmanship of the highest order from Indian policymakers. The path forward demands immediate safeguards against predatory Chinese dumping, accelerated incentives for domestic manufacturing, and most crucially, deft diplomacy to secure India's position in the rapidly reorganizing global economic order. As the trade war enters this dangerous new phase, one thing becomes increasingly clear: in this high-stakes game of economic chess, India must play its pieces with both boldness and precision-for the consequences of missteps in this new era of tradeas-warfare could resonate for

generations to come. The coming months will test whether India can transform this crisis into opportunity, or whether it will become collateral damage in a conflict where the rules are being rewritten by the day. What remains certain is that the old paradigms of global trade have been irrevocably shatteredand in this new reality, only the most agile and strategic players will emerge victorious.

DC-cum-ACS R eviews Anandapur Barrage Project Progress in **Keonjhar Emphasizes Timely Completion to Boost Irrigation**

Bhubaneswar/Keonjhar, (DMC): During the second day of her two-day visit to Keonjhar district, the Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Department of Water Resources (DoWR) Smt. Anu Garg, IAS inspected works of two ongoing main canal systemsof the Anandapur Barrage Project.

Accompanied by the Engineer-in-Chief, Chief Construction Engineer of the project, ADM Keonjhar, and Sub-Collector Anandapur, the DC-cum-ACS reviewed implementation status and assessed progress on ground with schedule for completion. The Anandapur Barrage Project is a flagship irrigation initiative with



aimed at irrigating 60,000 hectares of cultivated land across Hatadihi, Anandapur and Ghasipura blocks in Keonjhar district and Oupada, Nilagiri, Bahanaga, BalasoreSadar, Remuna, and Soro in Balasore district. While all 17 main canal work packages are in progress,

significant progress has been found in 56.923 km long Salandi Left Main Canal (SLMC). Work of the Baitarani Right Bank Canal (BRBC) in 03 packages are currently underway.Irrigation to 12803 ha. of cultivable land has been provided through SLMC. Agreement to provide irrigation to

3450 ha. through Under Ground Pipeline (UGPL) under BLBC and BRBC is going to be drawn shortly. During the review, the DCcum-ACS emphasized timely completion of the remaining main canal and the Underground Pipeline (UGPL) distribution system work packages to ensure intended benefits to reach the farmers by June, 2027, aligning with the Odisha Vision 2036 goals.

She also directed district officials to expedite resolution of land acquisition issues and provisioning of minor mineral for the project to avoid further delays. This high-level visit underscores continued commitment of State Government to strengthen irrigation infrastructure and ensuring water security for Odisha's agricultural communities.

BMC to set up effluent treatment plant at Gadakana garbage hill to curb pollution

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): In a significant step towards improving environmental safety and sanitation, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) has announced plans to install a 30-kilolitre-per-day (KLD) Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) at the Gadakana Garbage Hill, one of the city's major solid waste dump sites.

The initiative aims to tackle the growing concern of leachate, i.e. a highly toxic liquid that seeps out of waste piles and contaminates surrounding soil and groundwater. The proposed ETP will be designed specifically to collect, treat, and discharge leachate in a controlled and environmentally safe manner. Officials state that the move is



pollution and eliminate foul odours in the nearby areas."This project is a key component of our larger strategy for sustainable waste management.

It aligns with the national Swachh Bharat Mission and reinforces our commitment to environmental protection," said a BMC official. Baitarani river drying, People urge water State Development Commissioner visits Kanpur Dam, reviewed the work progress & heard the local people's grievance

Keonjhar, (DMC): Odisha's second river embankment project under construction in Joda block of Kendujhar district, Kanpur Dam is facing technical problems due to which the stream is cut off. The lower reaches of the Baitarani river have dried up.

There was a sense of urgency at the administrative level in this regard. In this regard, on Sunday, a high-level technical team including the Development Commissioner of Odisha, Additional Chief Secretary of the Water Resources Planning and Development Department of the Government of Odisha, Anu Garg visited visited the site and reviewed various parts of the dam.On this a review meeting was held at the Kanpur project Conference hall. The engineers were informed about the dam through the projector. Among the incomplete works of the Kanpur



project are the depletion sluice, 12 numbers Radial gates, concrete work of spillway, which is currently being constructed. "Due to the depletion sluice work being in progress, water cannot be drained into the Baitarani River. Due to this water problem seen downstream. The work will start soon", said the project construction engineer Prasad Ranjan Panda. While interacting with the media persons, the

commissioner said that "the ongoing work of Kanpur Dam project has been reviewed. The dam construction work will be completed by next July. Out of the total irrigation area of 29 thousand hectares, 13 thousand hectares of land will be irrigated this year. The target has been set. He said that there is sufficient infrastructure". Apart from this, she also said that " I will supervise the projects

implemented at the expense of the district mineral foundation fund and review the development work of tribal dominated areas". Regarding the provision of water to the farmers, she said that due to the installation of disluis, the river will be released at a slow rate, which will be useful for agriculture.

On the other hand, she said

that the displaced families have fulfilled their dream of building a dam by giving their land. Nine out of eight villages have been built for the rehabilitation of the displaced. She directed the officials in the review meeting to understand the problems of such facilities there. In response to the question that industrial companies are using water in the lean period from the reservoir, Commissioner Garg said that "after the drinking water project, water will be arranged for

industries" .Since the downstream end of the dam is not flowing, the villagers of about 10 villages have asked Commissioner Garg to solve it soon. Hundreds of villagers gathered before Commissioner Garg to express their grievances after some officials of the dam prevented them from meeting the commissioner and submitted a complaint.

You just make allegations without any evidence. The prosecution won't stand before the court in this manner," the bench said. During the hearing, Additional Solicitor General S V Raju alleged that Singh had earned Rs 40 crore in collusion with another man named Vikas Agarwal. When the court asked, if Agarwal had been made an accused, Raju replied that he was absconding. The bench said, "You have made a specific allegation that he (Singh) earned Rs 40 crore. "Investigation will go on at its own speed. It will go on till eternity. Three chargesheets have been filed. You are virtually penalising the person by keeping him in custody. You have made the process a punishment. This is not some case of terrorist or triple murder," the bench had remarked orally. The state had opposed the bail pleas and submitted that the accused

need to be confronted with the other accused in the case. Appearing for the accused, senior advocate Siddharth Agarwal had argued that three chargesheets have been filed in the case and charges are yet to be framed.

The top court allowed Arvind Singh and Amit Singh, to be confronted with former excise minister Kawasi Lakhma and posted the matter for May 9. The Enforcement Directorate has alleged that the scam was perpetrated by a syndicate of high-level state government officials, private persons and political executives that generated more than Rs 2,000 crore in tainted money in 2019-22. The money laundering case stems from a 2022 income tax department chargesheet filed in a court in Delhi. The ED alleged that bribes were collected from distillers in the state on a per liquor case basis procured from the CSMCL (state body for purchase and sale of liquor) and country liquor was being sold off-the-books. According to the federal probe agency, bribes were taken from distillers to allow them to form a cartel and have a fixed market share.

Amid India-Pak tensions, China says 'always support' Islamabad to 'secure peace & stability

New Delhi, (HS): A mid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan after the Pahalgam terror attack, China on Monday vowed to support Islamabad "to secure peace and stability in South Asia."The statement was made by Chinese Ambassador Jiang Zaidong, who met President Asif Ali Zardari amid the highly charged atmosphere following the diplomatic showdown between



Islamabad and New Delhi. Jiang called on President Zardari and exchanged views on different issues, including the tensions between Pakistan and India, state-run Radio Pakistan reported. During the meeting, President Zardari expressed concern over the recent measures by India following the deadly Pahalgam terror attack, saying that such actions threaten regional peace and stability, it reported. India last week imposed a ban on the import of goods coming from or transiting through Pakistan and also the entry of Pakistani ships into its ports even as Prime Minister Narendra Modi said New Delhi is committed to taking "firm and decisive" action against terrorists and their backers. The fresh moves came nearly two weeks after India announced a raft of punitive measures against Pakistan including suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty, shutting down of the only operation land border crossing at Attari and the downgrading of diplomatic ties following the terror attack. "The Chinese Ambassador reaffirmed the enduring and time-tested friendship between China and Pakistan, describing the relationship as one of ironclad brothers who have always supported each other in challenging times,' Radio Pakistan reported. He thanked President Zardari for sharing Pakistan's perspective and emphasised that "China would always support Pakistan to achieve the common desire of both countries to secure peace and stability in South Asia." On Thursday, the Chinese envoy called on Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, who thanked China for endorsing his offer to conduct a neutral probe into the Pahalgam attack. Meanwhile, Russian President Vladimir Putin on Monday vowed to support India in its fight against terrorism and stated that the perpetrators of the Pahalgam terror attack must be brought to justice. In a telephonic conversation with PM Modi, Putin condemned the attack as "barbaric" and expressed "full support" to India in the fight against terrorism, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a social media post. Putin was among the first world leaders to condemn the April 22 terror attack that killed 25 tourists and a local Kashmiri when suspected militants opened fire at tourists in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam.

Three-judge inquiry panel submits report to CJI on cash recovery at Justice Varma's home

Digha: In a major step towards the partial conclusion of the Digha Jagannath Temple controversy, West Bengal government has relented and removed the term 'Dham from the name of the temple. According to reports, the government of West Bengal has said that it shall remove the term 'dham' from the name of the newly inaugurated Jagannath Temple in Digha. A lot of protests were seen in Odisha following the Digha temple being called Digha Jagannath Dham. Many people argued that there are only four religious 'dhams' of Hindus that is: Badrinath, Dwarka, Puri and Rameswaram. So it is prima facie wrong to name the new Jagannath Temple at Digha as 'Dham'. The in-charge of BJP's National Information and Technology Department Co-incharge West Bengal Amit Malviya, shared a post on the recent development on his X handle and wrote, "After strong protests

NEW DELHI: The three-judge inquiry committee appointed by the Supreme Court to probe the cash recovery at Justice Yashwant Varma's residence on March 14 submitted its report to Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna on May 4. After 40 days of setting up of the panel by the top court, the committee submitted its report, after making due diligence on the probe in the cash recovery issue. The SC had on March

25 constituted the three-member inquiry committee, consisting of Justice Sheel Nagu, Chief Justice of the High Court of Punjab and Haryana, Justice G.S. Sandhawalia, Chief Justice of the High Court of Himachal Pradesh and Justice Anu Sivaraman, Judge of the High Court of Karnataka. The top court directed the committee to conduct a detailed inquiry into the allegations against Justice Varma, a sitting Judge at Allahabad High Court at present. The three-member inquiry committee, during its probe, visited Justice Varma's official residence at 30 Tughlak Crescent in Delhi and conducted an investigation.



In his defence, Justice Varma has vehemently denied all the allegations levelled against him. He has claimed that the room which caught fire and where cash was allegedly found was an outhouse and not the main building where the judge and family resides. "I state unequivocally that no cash was ever placed in that storeroom either by me or any of my family members and strongly denounce

the suggestion that the alleged cash belonged to us. The very idea or suggestion that this cash was kept or stored by us is totally preposterous. The suggestion that one would store cash in an open, freely accessible and commonly used storeroom near the staff quarters or in an outhouse verges on the incredible and incredulous," Justice Varma, said, in his reply. It is a room which is completely disassociated from my living areas and a boundary wall demarcates my living area from that outhouse. I only wish that the media had conducted some enquiry before I came to be indicted and defamed in the press," the reply further read.

Pak-Based Cyber Groups Target India Again, Multiple Defence Websites Hacked

New Delhi, (HS): Amid rising tensions in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, Pakistani hackers are targeting Indian defence websites. According to sources in the defence establishment, the cyber attacks may have compromised sensitive information about defence personnel, including their login credentials. A handle on X, Pakistan Cyber Force, has claimed that hackers gained access to sensitive data of the Military Engineer Services and the Manohar Parrikar Institute of Defence Studies and Analyses. The group, sources said, has also tried to deface the website of Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited, a Public Sector Undertaking under the Ministry of Defence. The sources said the website of Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited has been taken offline for a thorough audit to assess the extent of any potential damage caused by the hacking attempt.

Sonu breaks silence on Bengaluru concert issue, police summons



BENGALURU, (HS): Singer Sonu Nigam broke silence about a recent video of him during his Karnataka performance that got him in trouble. After allegedly refusing to perform in Kannada upon a fan's request, he even brought up the Pahalgam attack, and received flak for it. He posted a clarification on Monday to explain what happened. Sonu wrote in his note that he has given 'unprecedented love' to language, culture, music and musicians of not just Karnataka but 'anywhere in the world'. He also claimed that he 'revered' his Kannada songs more than even Hindi. Sonu stated that he has more than an hour of

Kannada songs that he prepares whenever he is in Karnataka. However, he claimed that a fan 'humiliated' him at the concert and was 'threatened' by someone his son's age. He wrote, "I am not a young lad to take humiliation from anyone. I am 51 years old, in the second half of my life and am entitled to take offence for someone as young as my son threatening me directly in front of thousands in the name of language that too Kannada which is my second language when it comes to my work. That too after my first song of the concert! He provoked a few more. Their own people were embarrassed and were asking them to shut up."

Sonu claimed that he told them 'politely and lovingly' that the concert has just begun and that he will not 'let them down'. However, he says, they were 'hell bent on creating ruckus' and threatening him 'wildly'. "Tell me who is at fault?" he questioned, adding, "Being a patriot that I am, I loathe anyone trying to create hate in the name of language, caste or religion especially after what transpired in Pahalgam." He said 'thousands of students and teachers cheered' him when he schooled them and that eventually, he did perform Kannada songs. After the incident, the Bengaluru District Police took cognisance of the FIR filed against him on May 3 for 'making hurtful remarks about the Kannadiga community.' They issued a notice to Sonu, asking him to appear before the investigation officer within a week.

Reservoir Flushing, 6 New Projects: India Acts After Indus Treaty Suspension

New Delhi, (HS): A week after India suspended the Indus Waters Treaty with Pakistan - in the first round of retaliatory measures for the Pahalgam terror attack - the government has begun increasing reservoir storage capacities at two hydroelectric projects in Kashmir, sources told.

Specifically, 'reservoir flushing' - i.e., removing of sediment - was carried out at the Salal and Baglihar projects by the state-run National Hydroelectric Power Corporation last week. The government is also expected to accelerate construction of six stalled projects in the region - a 1,856 MW project in Sawalkot, the Kirthai I and I facilities that will generate a combined 1,320 MW, and a 1,000 MW facility in Pakal Dul, as well as three others making a total of 2,224 MW. Once these six are completed, Jammu and Kashmir could generate up to 10,000 MW of electricity, and there could be more water for irrigation and domestic consumption in the plains. All of this is significant because if the Indus Waters Treaty, or IWT, were still operational, India would have had to give Pakistan six months' notice before starting construction, during which time Islamabad would have mounted multiple legal challenges to



delay or cancel the projects. The flushing of the reservoirs was key for the same reason; India had not been able to clean them since they were built in 1987 and 2009 as it had been prohibited by the IWT.Flushing had been banned as downstream countries, in this case Pak, may face flooding and destruction of property from the force of the released water. It also leads to wastage. However, sources told Reuters that finally being able to carry out the

flushing exercise would "help in more efficient power generation and prevent damage to the turbines". It was pointed out that the 690 MW Salal and the 900 MW Baglihar plants had been operating well below capacity. With regard to construction starting on the six projects, a major meeting is likely to be held this week between Home Minister Amit Shah, Water Resources Minister CR Patil, Power Minister ML Khattar, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Chouhan,

and senior officials from each ministry. Two meetings - between Mr Shah, Mr Patil, and their ministry officials - have already taken place, in which other possible activities, including initiating of new projects along the Chenab (allotted to India under the IWT) and Jhelum (to Pakistan) rivers and reviving the Wular Lake.

India suspended the IWT with Pakistan on April 24, vowing not one drop of water would cross the border. The IWT is a critical agreement for Pak; it divides the Indus River and its five major tributaries between India and itself, and supplies nearly 80 per cent of that country's farms. Pakistan, in turn, threatened legal action as it denied any role in the Pahalgam attack, warning, "Any attempt to stop or divert water belonging to Pakistan ... will be 'an act of war". Since India suspended the IWT there has been talk about how India might effectively stop flow of water to Pakistan, as Delhi seeks to put nonmilitary pressure on Islamabad to stop state-sponsored terrorist cross-border activity. The general opinion is that India cannot stop water flow immediately - for the simple reason that it does not have reservoirs to store the

Murshidabad riots: Bengal Governor files report to MHA; says 'radicalisation' posing challenge to Bengal

KOLKATA, (HS): West Bengal Governor C V Ananda Bose has submitted a report on the recent riots in Murshidabad district to the Ministry of Home Affairs, stating that the "twin spectre of radicalisation and militancy" poses a serious challenge to the state. In the report, he suggested a few measures, including setting up an inquiry commission and outposts of central forces or the BSF in districts bordering Bangladesh, besides writing, "needless to add, the provisions under Article 356 of the Constitution also remain".

The imposition of Art 356 refers to the President's rule in a state. Asked about this, an official told, "The governor has not proposed implementation of Art 356. He meant that the provisions of Art 356 are open to the Centre if the situation in the state further deteriorates." The TMC described the report as politically motivated while the BJP hailed it. Apprehending a "spillover" of the Murshidabad violence to other districts, Bose said the Centre might consider

"constitutional options to put a check on the current situation besides generating confidence of people in the rule of law". He also claimed that the riots appeared "premeditated" and the state government was "aware of the imminent build-up of a threat to law and order". "The twin spectre of radicalisation and militancy poses a serious challenge for West Bengal, especially in two of the several districts sharing an international border with Bangladesh, viz., Murshidabad and Malda. In both these districts, there is an adverse demographic composition with Hindus being minorities. Another district, viz., Uttar Dinajpur, has a plurality," Bose mentioned in his report. The governor suggested several measures in the aftermath of Murshidabad violence that left three people dead. The riot occurred amid anti-Waqf Act protests. The report mentioned "formulating an overarching legislation to empower the Union Government to maintain law and order when the state machinery fails to act



effectively." It also said about appointing a commission of inquiry to look into the "reported acts of omission and commission and to suggest measures to prevent such incidents in future and needless to add, the provisions under Article 356 of the Constitution also remain." Of late, there are indications of radicalisation and polarisation, the report said. "The divisions are so deep that even in the face of escalation of violence, the chief minister's repeated undertaking that she would protect minority interests, and that the Act would not be implemented in the state, have done little to assuage the Muslim community or stem the tide. It is imperative that the rule of law must be firmly established, and the police must prevent violence," Bose wrote in the report. Going by the state's history of political clashes, there is a possibility that the Murshidabad violence would spill over to other districts, he said.

After the Waqf (Amendment) Act was notified on April 8, conflagration unfolded in Murshidabad district and continued for several days, Bose said adding that the authorities suspended internet services on the same day. "Thus, the state government was aware of the imminent build-up of threat to law and order in Murshidabad,"

he alleged. "The sequence of events shows woeful lack of coordination among administration and law enforcement agencies that were either too feeble to rise to the challenge or were reluctant to do so," he said. Referring to his trip to the district, Bose said that the atrocities inflicted "appear to be systematic and reek of an intention to destroy the identity of a particular group". Such a "grave violation of human rights causing immense suffering and loss has very few parallels in recent history," he said. Bose also stated that "intensifying political rivalry between the ruling party and the Opp osition has led to both parties increasingly leveraging religious identity to consolidate their voter bases.. The narrative is now religion-driven. "The TMC has positioned itself as a protector of Muslims who constitute over 30 per cent of the state's electorate and holds sway in roughly 125-130 of the 294 Assembly seats," he said. Bose alleged there was a marked rise in law and order issues ahead of the 2026 assembly polls. In the "surcharged" political spectrum,

parties are vocal at highlighting the fault lines and communal fissures leading to tension and violence, he said. Bose observed that the police were ineffective and central forces are needed to bring back normalcy. Hitting out at Bose, TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh said, "This is the report of his political assignment. He knows the situation is under control and that is why he mentioned that if the situation deteriorates, the provision of Art 356 is open. The governor should have mentioned the role of BSF, the jurisdiction was increased to 50 km from the border." (H.S): Russian President Vladimir Putin called Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday and "strongly condemned" the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam, offering "full support" to India in its ongoing fight against terrorism."He conveyed deepest condolences on the loss of innocent lives and expressed full support to India in the fight against terrorism. He emphasised that the perpetrators of the heinous attack and their supporters must be brought to justice,"

Jaiswal, spokesperson for the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), stated after the call."Both leaders reiterated their commitment to further deepen India-Russia Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership. PM Modi conveyed greetings to President Putin on the celebration of the 80th anniversary of Victory Day and invited him for the Annual Summit to be held in India later in the year," Jaiswal added. The brutal assault on April 22, which resulted in the death of 26 innocent tourists and left several



others critically injured, unfolded in the Baisaran Valley near Pahalgam when four heavily armed terrorists, two of them from Pakistan, emerged from the surrounding dense forests and opened indiscriminate fire on

The attack has been described as one of the most horrific in the region in recent memory. Monday's call between the two leaders took place before the Russian President hosts Chinese President Xi Jinping, who will be on an official visit to the Russian Federation from May 7-10 and take part in the ceremonial events dedicated to the 80th anniversary of Victory in the

Great Patriotic War.PM Modi, who had also been invited by Putin for the participation in the Victory Day celebrations, will however not be travelling to Russia. The Russian President had earlier extended his condolences to President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Modi over the tragic consequences of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam."

Kindly accept the sincere condolences over the tragic consequences of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam whose victims were civilians - citizens of various countries. This brutal crime has no justification whatsoever. We expect that its organisers and perpetrators will face a deserved

punishment. I would like to reiterate our commitment to further increasing cooperation with Indian partners in fighting terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. Please convey words of sincere sympathy and support to the near and dear ones of the deceased as well as wishes for a speedy recovery of all injured," Putin wrote on April 22.

On May 2, Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov had dialled External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar do discuss topical issues of the Russian-Indian cooperation, as well as the "aggravation of Indian-Pakistani relations" following the terrorist attack near Pahalgam.Lavrov called for the settlement of disagreements between New Delhi and Islamabad by political and diplomatic means on a bilateral basis in accordance with the provisions of the Simla Agreement of 1972 and the Lahore Declaration of 1999." Discussed the Pahalgam terrorist attack with FM Lavrov of Russia yesterday. Its perpetrators, backers and planners must be brought to justice. Also spoke

about our bilateral cooperation activities," Jaishankar posted on X after the phone call.Putin had earlier invited Prime Minister Modi to attend the celebrations to mark the 75th anniversary of Victory in the Great Patriotic War in Moscow in May 2020.Earlier, Kremlin aide Yury Ushakov had confirmed that the Russian President is expected to visit India in early 2025 following an invitation from Prime Minister Modi.

The visit is being planned as part of the ongoing commitment to annual meetings between the two leaders." Our leaders have an agreement to meet once a year. The last visit by the Russian President to India took place on December 6, 2021, during the 21st India-Russia Annual Summit in New Delhi. Meanwhile, PM Modi held two high-profile visits to Russia last year, attending the 22nd Russia-India Summit in July and later participated in the BRICS Summit held in Kazan in October.

Iran Vows Retaliation If Attacked, Cites Missile Readiness



Tehran, (H.S): Iranian Defence Minister Aziz Nasirzadeh warned that Iran would strike US and Israeli interests, bases, and troops "wherever and whenever deemed necessary" if either country initiates a war against the Islamic Republic.He made the remarks in an interview with Iran's IRIB news agency published on Sunday, responding to a recent threat made by US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth, who warned that Iran would "pay the consequence" for its "support to the Houthis." The defence minister stated that Iran maintains a large arsenal of missiles in its bases and would not hesitate to use them against regional targets if war is imposed on the country, Xinhua news agency reported."

Should such a war be from the United States or Israel, the Islamic Republic of Iran will target their interests, bases, and troops wherever they are and whenever it deems necessary," Nasirzadeh said.He further criticised what he described as a contradiction in US behavior - claiming to be open to negotiations while simultaneously threatening Iran through various channels. Nasirzadeh said Yemen is an independent country and makes its own decisions, advising the United States to refrain from creating crises in the West Asia region.Earlier on Sunday Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu vowed to retaliate against Houthi forces in Yemen and their ally, Iran, after a missile launched by the group struck Israel's international airport.Writing on the social media platform X, the official account of the Prime Minister's Office stated that "attacks by the Houthis emanate from Iran." It added that Israel "will respond to the Houthi attack against our main airport and, at a time and place of our choosing, to their Iranian terror masters."

Threat To National Security: Trump Imposes 100 Pc Tariff on Films Produced Outside US

Washington, (H.S): US President Donald Trump on Monday (Indian time) announced a new 100 per cent tariff on foreign films, stating that the movie industry in America is "dying a very fast death," which, according to him, is posing a national security threat.He accused other countries of offering all sorts of incentives and drawing filmmakers and studios away from the US."

Industry in America is dying a very fast death. Other countries are offering all sorts of the movie incentives to draw our filmmakers and studios away from the United States. Hollywood and many other areas within the USA are being devastated. This is a concerted effort by other nations and, therefore, a national security threat," he posted on his social media platform, Truth Social."It is, in addition to everything



else, messaging and propaganda! Therefore, I am authorising the Department of Commerce and the United States Trade Representative to immediately begin the process of instituting a 100 per cent tariff on any and all movies coming into our country that are produced in foreign lands.

We want movies made in America again," the post added. Addressing reporters at the White House on Sunday, Trump had blamed California Governor Gavin Newsom for the decline in film production in Hollywood, specifically over the last several years.He said that other nations have been "stealing" the movies and moviemaking capabilities from the US."

If they're not willing to make a movie inside the United States, we should have a tariff when movies come in," Trump added.Reports suggest that production has declined in California following budget cuts and more generous tax incentives outside. Additionally, the American film industry reportedly suffered a series of economic setbacks in recent years, including the Hollywood labour strikes and the Covid pandemic.In January, Trump appointed three film stars - Jon Voight, Mel Gibson and Sylvester Stallone - as special ambassadors tasked with promoting business opportunities in Hollywood, calling the industry a "great but very troubled place."

Trump said their job is to bring business back to Hollywood, saying that it "has lost much business over the last four years to foreign countries." "They will serve as special envoys to me for the purpose of bringing Hollywood, which has lost much business over the last four years to foreign countries, back - bigger, better and stronger than ever before!" Trump posted during that time.

Nine Dead After Tourist Boats Carrying Over 80 Capsize In China

Beijing, (H.S): Nine people died, one was missing, and 70 were injured after four tourist boats capsized due to sudden gales on a river in Qianxi, southwest China's Guizhou province, according to state media. A total of 84 people fell into the water following the accident on Sunday afternoon, and the search for the last missing person continues.

Speaking to Chinese media Red Star News, tourists who were on-site during the accident said that there was a sudden rainstorm accompanied by hail, thunder and strong winds. According to reports, the local meteorological authority issued a yellow alert on Sunday, stating that thunderstorms would occur in multiple places. Chinese President Xi Jinping on Sunday urged all-out efforts to search for those who fell into the water and treat the injured after the boats capsized. The Chinese provincial authorities have deployed nearly 500 emergency responders,



medical personnel, to coordinate rescue efforts, Xinhua News Agency reported. The other passengers on the boat reported a sudden shift in the weather, featuring intense rainfall and a fog hovering over the water's surface.

In December also, eight people died after a boat capsized in Guizhou province. Meanwhile, on Friday, a helicopter crashed in the Wuzhong district of Suzhou, Jiangsu province, resulting in one death and four injuries due to bad weather, as confirmed by the Chinese local emergency management bureau. According to the bureau's statement, the

of about 10 meters above the ground while returning to Wuzhong airspace. The victim, one person on the ground, was killed, while four personnel on board were injured.

Earlier this year, eleven people died, and five went missing after a passenger boat collided with an oil waste recovery vessel in central China's Hunan Province, according to the local authorities. The incident occurred on the Yuanshui River in Qinglang Township, Yuanling County, causing 19 people to fall overboard, of whom three were rescued.

Iran revises port blast death toll to 57, arrests two over safety failures

Tehran, (H.S): Iran revised the death toll from a major explosion at its main commercial port late last month down to 57 from 70, while state television reported two arrests in connection with the blast. The semi-official Tasnim news agency quoted Hormozgan province's Chief Justice Mojtaba Qahremani as saying the updated figure for the April 26 blast at Shahid Rajaee Port includes 46

recovered and identified bodies and 11 people still missing. Qahremani explained that the initial count was lowered after forensic examinations determined that some body parts collected separately belonged to the same individuals. A special working group has been established to follow up on the missing, he added. State television reported separately on Sunday that two

people, including a government official, had been arrested over the explosion. The blast and ensuing fire injured more than 1,200 people, according to the Iranian Red Crescent Society, which said search and rescue efforts at the site ended on Sunday, Xinhua news agency reported. Authorities have pointed to safety failures as contributing to the incident. A provincial crisis management

statement cited failures in observing safety and passive defence measures, while Interior Minister Eskandar Momeni referred to "certain negligence" last Monday. Shahid Rajaee Port, located in the southern Hormozgan province, is Iran's largest maritime hub, handling the vast majority of the country's container traffic and more than half of its total trade.

Ottawa, (H.S): The Hindu Canadian Foundation (HCF) on Monday strongly condemned the call by Khalistani extremists on Monday to send back 800,000 Hindus to India.An anti-Hindu parade took place during the Malton and Etobicoke Nagar Kirtan at the Malton Gurdwara in Toronto, Canada.A video capturing the event is circulating widely on social media, featuring a large truck displaying a replica of a jail that included effigies of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar.

The HCF said that such statements foster division and spread hate against Hindu Canadians."The silence of many political leaders in response to such hateful remarks must be recognised as implicit consent. It is the duty of all Members of Parliament and Members of Provincial Parliament, across party lines, to take a stand against this divisiveness and reaffirm Canada's commitment to religious harmony and inclusivity," the HCF said in a statement." A civilised society cannot tolerate hate-mongering



and attempts to fracture our diverse communities. We urge Canadians to hold politicians accountable - asking them what legacy they wish to leave for future generations," the statement added. The foundation further stated that the Nagar Kirtan is "meant to unite people of all faiths, reflecting the teachings of Sikh Gurus, and should never be misused for political provocation or exclusionary rhetoric."

Meanwhile, the Canadian Hindu Chamber of Commerce also slammed the incident, demanding that Hindus leave Canada."There are 800,000 Hindus and over 1.86 million Indo-Canadians in Canada. The call at today's Nagar Kirtans in Malton & Etobicoke clearly

targeted Hindus. History teaches us that calls for mass expulsion lead to unthinkable acts. This dangerous rhetoric must be denounced by all leaders," it said in a statement. The Khalistani extremism, especially against the Hindus, has been on the rise in Canada, with repeated cases of Hindu temple desecrations and vandalism.

Last month, the Lakshmi Narayan Temple in Surrey was defaced with pro-Khalistan graffiti, marking it as the third reported act of vandalism at the same site. Former Canadian MP Chandra Arya, addressed the incident strongly, in a post on X."The attacks on Hindu temples that began several years ago continue unabated today this latest graffiti on the Hindu

temple is yet another chilling reminder of the growing influence of Khalistani extremism," he posted. Arya warned of a larger, coordinated effort behind such acts: "Well-organised, wellfunded, and backed by significant political clout, Khalistani elements are brazenly asserting their dominance and successfully silencing Hindu voices across Canada."He also referenced the targeting of the Khalsa Diwan Society's Ross Street Gurdwara in Vancouver, which was defaced with slogans like "Khalistan Zindabad.' Gurdwara

management condemned the actions, calling them part of an "ongoing campaign by extremist forces that seek to instil fear and division within the Canadian Sikh community." It is time for the Hindu Canadians jointly with the vast majority of our Sikh-Canadian brothers and sisters to rise with urgency and demand immediate, decisive action from authorities at all levels of government. Silence is no longer an option," Arya concluded, calling for urgent action following the incident last month.

Israeli Cabinet Approves Plan To Capture "All of Gaza"



Tel Aviv, (H.S): Israel's security cabinet has approved a plan to capture the entire Gaza Strip and remain there for an unspecified amount of time, Associated Press reported, quoting two officials. If implemented, the plan could vastly expand Israel's operations in the Palestinian territory, which would likely exacerbate an already dire humanitarian crisis. Israeli Cabinet ministers approved the plan in an early morning vote on Monday, hours after the Israeli military chief said the army was calling up tens of thousands of reserve soldiers.

The move is part of the Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu-led government's efforts to elevate pressure on Hamas to free hostages and negotiate a ceasefire on Israel's terms. Officials told AP that the new plan is meant to help Israel achieve its war aims of defeating Hamas. It would also push hundreds of thousands of Palestinians to southern Gaza. Since a US-brokered truce deal between Israel and Hamas

collapsed in mid-March, the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) have unleashed fierce strikes on the Palestinian territory, killing hundreds of people and capturing large swathes of land. Per reports, Israel now roughly controls 50 per cent of Gaza. Even before the ceasefire agreement fell apart, Israel had halted all humanitarian aid into Gaza, including food, fuel and water, setting off what is believed to be the worst humanitarian crisis in nearly 19 months of war.

According to Israeli officials, the plan included the "capturing of the strip and the holding of territories." It would also seek to prevent the Hamas group from distributing humanitarian aid, which Israel says strengthens the group's rule in Gaza. Israel has also accused Hamas of keeping the aid for itself to bolster its capabilities."The plan also included powerful strikes against Hamas targets," the officials said. One of the officials said the plan would be implemented gradually. The report said Israel was in

touch with several countries about President Donald Trump's plan to take over Gaza and relocate its population, under what Israel has termed "voluntary emigration". However, the plan sparked condemnations from Israel's allies in Europe and the Arab world. For weeks, Israel has been trying to ratchet up pressure on Hamas and prompt it to show more flexibility in ceasefire negotiations.

But international mediators trying to bring the sides toward a new deal have struggled to do so. Israel's measures do not appear to have moved Hamas away from its negotiating positions. The previous ceasefire was meant to lead the sides to negotiate an end to the war, but that goal has been a repeated sticking point in talks between Israel and Hamas. Israel says it won't agree to end the war until Hamas is defeated. Hamas, meanwhile, has demanded an agreement that winds down the war.



India's Mineral Production Surges To All-Time High In 2024-25

New Delhi, (H.S): The production of key minerals such as iron ore, manganese ore, bauxite and lead in the country have recorded a robust growth in financial year 2024-25 after reaching record production levels in FY 2023-24, according to a statement issued by the Ministry of Mines on Monday.

The output of iron ore, which accounts for 70 per cent of the total mineral production by value, increased to 289 million metric tonnes (MMT) in FY 2024-25, breaking the earlier production record of 277 MMT achieved in FY 2023-24, registering a 4.3 per cent growth.Similarly, the production of manganese ore has also surpassed the production record of 3.4 MMT achieved in FY 2023-24, with an 11.8 per cent jump to 3.8 MMT in FY 2024-25. The production of bauxite has risen by 2.9 per cent to 24.7 MMT in FY 2024-25 from 24 MMT in FY 2023-24. During the same period, lead



concentrate production rose from 381 thousand tonnes (THT) to 393 THT, with a 3.1 per cent growth.In the non-ferrous metal sector, primary aluminum production in FY 2024-25 has also broken the production record of FY 2023-24. Primary aluminium production increased from 41.6 lakh ton (LT) in FY 2023-24 to 42 LT during FY 2024-25. Besides, refined copper production saw a robust growth of 12.6 per cent, increasing from 5.09 LT in FY 2023-24 to 5.73 LT in FY 2024-25. India is the second largest Aluminium

producer in the world, among the top-10 producers of refined copper and the fourth largest iron ore producer in the world. Continued growth in production of iron ore in the current financial year reflects the robust demand conditions in steel which is the user industry for these metals.Coupled with growth in aluminium and copper, these growth trends point towards continued strong economic activity in user sectors such as infrastructure. energy, construction, automotive and machinery, the statement added.

Solar PV component market in India to exceed \$7 billion by 2029

New Delhi, (H.S): India's solar photovoltaic (PV) balance of system (BoS) market is on a robust growth trajectory and is projected to grow from approximately \$3 billion in 2024 to around \$7 billion by 2029, registering a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 16 per cent, a report showed on Monday.

Several factors are driving this growth, including India's national target of 500 GW non-fossil fuel capacity by 2030 and the commitment to generate 50 per cent of its electricity from renewable sources, according to 1Lattice's latest industry report. Enabling schemes like PM-KUSUM, the Grid Connected Rooftop Solar Programme, and the Delhi Solar Energy Policy are helping to democratize solar adoption across rural and urban areas, bringing new opportunities



for innovation, manufacturing, and investment in the BoS space. The report provides a deep analysis of the BoS segment, which includes all supporting components of solar PV installations other than the panels, such as inverters, mounting structures, trackers, wiring, combiner boxes, circuit protection devices, monitoring systems, charge controllers, and batteries."As the world races toward decarbonisation, the focus must go beyond solar panels to the infrastructure that supports them. Our latest report underscores the pivotal role of the balance of system components in making solar truly scalable and sustainable," said Abhishek Maiti, Director-Industrial Goods and Services, 1Lattice.With India set to witness a BoS boom, now is the time for manufacturers, investors and policymakers to align strategies and investments, he added.

The global BoS market is also expected to experience significant expansion, growing from an estimated \$60 billion in 2024 to approximately \$100 billion by 2029 at a CAGR of 10 per cent, driven by robust clean energy commitments and incentives across key regions. As India accelerates its shift toward renewable energy, the BoS segment is emerging as a critical enabler in the country's energy transition journey.

Current Indicators Show India's Economy Is Doing Well: CEA Nageswaran

New Delhi, (H.S): Chief Economic Advisor (CEA) V. Anantha Nageswaran has highlighted that current indicators show the Indian economy is continuing on a high growth path despite the global challenges. Speaking at an event at Ashoka University, Nageswaran said, "India's economy is in good shape despite challenging global environment.

While the final number for FY25 will be available in May, current indicators suggest we are progressing well."The country's Chief Economic Advisor listed energy affordability and energy transition employment generation with the rise in manufacturing and small and medium enterprises as priority areas for the country. Besides, artificial intelligence, education and skilling of the country's workforce would drive



growth, he added. He emphasised on the need to maintain macroeconomic stability, which entails keeping inflation in check, while targeting inclusive growth as the country moves ahead. NITI Aayog Vice Chairman Suman Bery, in his address at the event,

emphasised India's long-term vision of becoming a developed, high-income country by 2047." Over the last three decades, India has achieved a consistent annual growth rate of 6.5 per cent, and I think it's an impressive

achievement. It showcases both institutional agility and a certain institutional maturity in India," he said. Bery stated that the global turmoil could throw up opportunities for India.

He highlighted the potential for India to leverage its demographic dividend, technology and geopolitical shifts to spur economic growth.India continues to remain the world's fastest growing major economy and the only country expected to clock over 6 per cent growth in

the next two years, according to an IMF report released last month.IMF chief economist Gita Gopinath said, "Our April 2025 World Economic Outlook projects significantly weaker global growth at 2.8 per cent for 2025 with growth downgrades for 127 countries making up 86 per cent of world GDP."

However, the outlook report pegged the Indian economy to grow at 6.2 per cent in 2025 and 6.3 per cent in 2026 which is over 2 percentage points above second ranking China's economic growth forecast at 4 per cent for 2025 and 4.6 per cent in 2026. The US, which has triggered the tariff turmoil across the globe, is expected to see its GDP growth slowing to 1.8 per cent this year, which will is expected to decline further to 1.7 per cent in 2026, according to the IMF report.

New Delhi, (H.S): A high-level Indian delegation is set to present its transformative SVAMITVA Scheme and Gram Manchitra platform at the World Bank Land Conference 2025, taking place from May 5 to 8 at the World Bank headquarters in Washington, according to an official statement issued on Sunday.

Morgan Stanley states that these very conditions present a compelling case for India, "supported by its robust domestic fundamentals and relative insulation from global volatility".India offers a mix of macro stability, earnings growth,

and a reliable domestic demand base that positions it as a relative safe haven in a bear market. Morgan Stanley also favours domestic cyclicals over defensives and globally exposed sectors. The firm holds an overweight view on financials, consumer discretionary and industrials, backed by improving credit growth, private investment recovery, and rising consumer demand. In its another report last month, Morgan Stanley said that India is one of their preferred equity markets where macro conditions are resilient or sufficiently buffered by

relatively resilient outlook for financials earnings, with capital ratios and the asset quality outlook in a strong position across most of its coverage. "India is not just a market of the future - it is a collaborator of trust."The talks, held on Friday, follow the visit of Princess Astrid of Belgium to India, in March this year, where her meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi underscored the shared ambition to unlock new avenues for collaboration in trade, technology, defence, agriculture, life sciences, innovation, skilling and academic exchanges. The over



300-member Belgian Economic Mission, led by Princess Astrid, infused fresh momentum into this dynamic bilateral relationship. Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to building on this momentum to forge resilient, future-focused ties that enhance mutual growth and contribute to a more integrated global economic framework.

The discussions highlighted growing economic synergies and focused on scaling bilateral trade, fostering industrial collaboration, and deepening investments in strategic sectors such as semiconductors, clean energy, defence production, and pharmaceuticals. The Flanders region, recognised as Belgium's

economic engine, was highlighted as a critical partner with its advanced manufacturing ecosystem, R&D infrastructure, and its strategic role as a European gateway.

With India already the world's fastest-growing major economy and widely expected to remain so over the next two decades ahead - driven by a young, aspirational population and a dynamic reform-oriented environment, the growth story presents an unprecedented opportunity for India and Belgium. During Commerce Minister Goyal's visit to Brussels, the two countries reaffirmed their shared vision of mutual prosperity and resilient

economic cooperation amidst evolving global challenges. Goyal reflected on India's transformative economic journey over the past decade, emphasising reforms that have empowered citizens and entrepreneurs alike. "The last eleven years have not only been about economic upliftment, but about enabling aspirations," he stated.Belgium remains one of India's most significant economic partners in Europe.

It is India's 5th largest trading partner within the EU, with bilateral trade reaching \$15.07 billion in 2023-24. Belgian FDI in India has totalled \$3.94 billion from April 2000 to September 2024, including a remarkable 39 per cent growth - \$1.1 billion - in the past year alone.

Bilateral cooperation spans a wide array of sectors, including defence manufacturing, green hydrogen, nano-electronics, nuclear medicine, and pharmaceutical R&D, reflecting the expanding depth and strategic nature of the Indo-Belgian economic relationship. Both sides agreed to strengthen high-level engagements and facilitate regular visits by business delegations to accelerate trade and investment outcomes.

Govt Moving Ahead With IDBI Bank Disinvestment Plan In Current Fiscal

New Delhi, (H.S): The government's disinvestment plan for IDBI Bank, as part of the broader strategy to monetise assets through stake sales during the current financial year, is progressing in accordance with the normal schedule, the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management Secretary Arunish Chawla has said." The focus remains on steady execution and long-term value creation, even as global economic conditions remain uncertain," Chawla told NDTV Profit in an exclusive interview. The

Centre and the Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) plan to jointly offload a 60.72 per cent stake in IDBI Bank, which comprises 30.48 per cent held by the government and a 30.24 per cent share by the insurance giant. Chawla said that the government aims to meet regulatory norms through structured divestments in public sector banks and central public sector enterprises.He also said efforts to monetise land and infrastructure assets of MTNL were continuing and confirmed that a flexible approach was being adopted

to meet minimum public shareholding targets. Chawla said that asset sales will be carried out in a phased and market-sensitive manner. He noted that multiple bids have already come in for key transactions, including public sector bank stake sales, and that due diligence is progressing on the IDBI Bank transaction. The government has also extended deadlines for some companies, that have been lined up for disinvestment, to comply with the Securities and Exchange Board of India's public float rules, he said.

Ban on Rabada for using prohibited drug lifted, Return



New Delhi, (HS): South African speedster Kagiso Rabada served a one-month ban, reduced from three months, for using a recreational drug during the SA20, held earlier this year, according to ESPNcricinfo. In a statement issued by the South African Institute for Drug Free Sports (SAIDS) confirmed, Rabada, who was representing MI Cape Town, had failed a doping test on January 2 following their fixture against Durban Super Giants. The 29year-old quick was notified of the decision on April 1 when he represented the Gujarat Titans in the 18th edition of the cash-rich Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025. At that time, GT released a statement stating that Rabada flew back to South Africa "to deal with an important personal matter" without offering a time frame for his return. According to ESPNcricinfo, SAIDS confirmed Rabada has since participated in an education and awareness programme to prevent further substance abuse. He is expected to resume playing immediately and could return to on-field action as soon as Wednesday, when GT takes on five-time champions Mumbai Indians (MI). There have been instances when players have been handed long-term suspensions, which depend on the individual cricket boards. Last year, the Zimbabwe Cricket Board banned Wessly Madhevere and Brandon Mavuta for four months each and fined 50 per cent of their salaries for

India are now 21 points behind ranking leaders Australia. In the ODI lists, India's dominance in recent ODI events has seen them win 15 matches with only a singular loss, albeit in the biggest match of the set in the World Cup final. Sri Lanka are surprise gainers, up to fourth place despite their noninvolvement in the Champions Trophy, overtaking both Pakistan and South Africa. Overall, India have enjoyed a 23-1 record in ICC events since the 2023 ODI World Cup, a terrific tournament performance that has helped them maintain their grip on the two limited overs formats

"Sunday is expected to be another strong day, placing #Raid2 among the top-performing opening weekends in the post-pandemic era. As mentioned earlier, a 70 cr+ *extended opening weekend* is now well within reach. #Raid2 [Week 1] Thu 19.71 cr, Fri 13.05 cr, Sat 18.55 cr. Total: 51.31 cr," he added.

Apart from Ajay Devgn, Raid 2 features Vaani Kapoor, Riteish Deshmukh, Rajat Kapoor, Saurabh Shukla, Supriya Pathak and Amit Sial in key roles. The film is a sequel to the 2018 movie Raid. Ileana D'Cruz played Ajay's on-screen wife in the original film. However, she was replaced by Vaani Kapoor in Raid 2. Aamir in talks for an Indo-Chinese film with a star from each country

Two of his films - Dangal and Secret Superstar - have been big hits in the country, breaking all box office records for Indian films. Speaking at the WAVES Summit on Friday, Aamir talked about the next step in leveraging China's soft power - a joint Indo-Chinese film production.


At the inaugural World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit (WAVES), Aamir spoke about how the audience in China reacts to an Indian film in the same manner that the Indian audience does. "I feel that the audience in China, their cultural flavours, and the emotions of people there are very similar to the emotions of Indians. So, the Chinese audience reacts in a very similar way to content like

people do here. That's what my experience was when I was watching a couple of my films on the big screen in China. The way the audience was reacting to Dangal. There was absolutely no difference between an Indian audience and the Chinese audience reacting to the film. It was almost identical." Aamir's Dangal made a record \$192 million (1231 crore) in China, and an additional \$10 million (64 crore) in Taiwan and Hong Kong. It remains the highest-grossing foreign film in China. His Secret Superstar also broke the bank in the Chinese markets, bringing in a combined \$122 million (763 crore) from China and Hong Kong.

Aamir was participating in a session titled 'Studios of the Future: Putting India on World Studio Map' at WAVES 2025 on Friday morning. On stage, the actor also spoke about how he is in talks with Chinese friends for a possible collaboration

"I think collaboration with China is a win-wincreatively, from a business perspective, and on an emotional level. In fact, over the years, I have been in discussions with my friends in China and we have often explored the possibility. Now, with WAVES coming in, it will give a further drive towards there. If you look at an Indo-Chinese film - a star from China and a star from India, that's roughly half of the population of earth. So, you have a huge audience already for it," he said.
