Trade Agreements

he uncertainty unleashed by Donald Trump's tariffs has only been aggravated by a spate of recent court rulings. On May 28, the US Court of International Trade struck down Trump's "Liberation Day" tariffs, saying that the emergency law (International Emergency Economic Powers Act) does not give the President the power to impose broad tariffs. However, a day later, a federal appeals court temporarily reinstated the tariffs. The case is now likely to work its way through the US legal system. The uncertainty is likely to linger on as the 90-day pause on the Liberation Day tariffs ends in the second week of July. The Trump administration may have hoped that some trade deals would be quickly negotiated. And while the US and the UK have reached an agreement - the deal was announced on May 8th - progress with other major trading nations/blocks remains a protracted process. Take the case of China. A few days ago, US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent is reported to have said that trade talks between the US and China "are a bit stalled". Last Friday, Trump said that China has "totally violated" its agreement with the US, a charge that China has rejected. The US President is expected to speak to Chinese President Xi Jinping this week to iron out their differences. In the case of Japan, several rounds of talks have taken place, and another is expected before the G7 summit. But last Friday, the legal challenges to his tariffs notwithstanding, Trump also raised the tariffs on steel and aluminium to 50 per cent, potentially impacting countries such as Canada, Mexico and South Korea, which account for a sizeable share of US steel imports. A day later, the European Union, which had agreed to "accelerate talks" on a US trade deal, has also responded firmly, saying it is prepared to impose "countermeasures" against the US. It noted that such moves to increase tariffs "undermine ongoing efforts to reach a negotiated solution". The new tariffs are effective from June 4.

These latest tariff moves come at a time when India and the US are negotiating a bilateral trade deal. A US team is expected to visit India over the coming few days. On Monday, US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick, speaking in Washington at the US-India Strategic Partnership Forum's leadership summit, said that a deal between the US and India could happen in the "not too distant future". The India-EU trade deal also appears to be on course. As per a report, the two sides have agreed on several chapters, and the pact could be concluded before the end of the year. Coming after the finalisation of the India-UK agreement, the successful culmination of these deals would increase the country's attractiveness as an investment destination.

As the world finds itself increasingly drawn into the quagmire of global politics, India too recalibrates its diplomatic stance in response to rapidly evolving circumstances. This shift is not merely a strategic adjustment, but a necessity-India aspires to become the third-largest economy by 2030 and must align its foreign and defense policies accordingly. With its rising economic and military strength, India is no longer a passive participant in world affairs but a key player asserting its national interests with confidence. Yet, India's rise has not been welcomed uniformly. The United States, China, and several Western powers are visibly uneasy with Delhi's growing assertiveness. While the U.S. publicly promotes strategic cooperation with India, it quietly advances ties with Pakistan and Turkey, nations that either sponsor or support terrorism. Quite a lot of developments are taking place on the global landscape, and India stands firm in the middle of this shifting terrain. The recent conflict between India and Pakistan has once again revealed the contradictions in American diplomacy. The U.S. seeks India as a proxy to counterbalance China's dominance in Asia, yet continues to extend military and financial support to Pakistan, a country that has long provided a haven to terrorist organizations. History is replete with examples where, under the pretext of pursuing national interest, deepstate actors have supported terrorist networks. America's decades-long alliance with

Pakistan is a prime example.

appears to be a carefully devised strategy to keep India in check. He wants India to do trade with both India and Pakistan. Despite India's repeated demands for international action against Pakistan-sponsored terrorism, Washington's actions tell a different story. Even during the recent Indo-Pak conflict, Pakistan managed to secure a \$100 billion IMF bailout-allegedly with U.S. influence. While the IMF imposed eleven stringent conditions, including investments in human development and capping defense spending below 12% of the national budget, analysts doubt Pakistan's ability to comply. Trump's praise of Pakistan's leadership-placing it on par with India's-has further strained bilateral ties. His approval of missile sales to Turkey, a vocal backer of Pakistan, underlines a dangerous principle in modern diplomacy: "Everything is fair in the national interest," thus reinforcing the Machiavellian notion that the end justifies the means. It is an irony that Turkey, a state that openly supports Pakistan, a hub of terrorism, is still a key NATO member. The West remains conspicuously silent on this paradox. Trump's recent meeting with Syria's president, formerly associated with al-Qaeda and once carrying a \$10 million U.S. bounty, and the subsequent lifting of sanctions on Syria further proves that in diplomacy, national interest is the sole guiding principle, and no one remains untouchable. Meanwhile, European nations' lukewarm response to India's fight against cross-border terrorism is equally disheartening, thus amounting to hypocrisy. Their reluctance to openly support India suggests a self-centered approach to foreign relations-one that prioritizes convenience over principle. In this geopolitical environment, India's growing military prowess stands as a pillar of strength. Its air defense superiority, bolstered by the



and BrahMos missiles in Operation Sindoor, has drawn the attention of global defense analysts. The precision strikes on Pakistan's major air bases have redefined India's strategic posture and demonstrated its advanced capabilities. The superior striking capabilities of these missiles are not just deterrents-they are messages. They signify India's refusal to be bullied into passive diplomacy. In a world where perception shapes power, India's military achievements are now shifting global narratives in its favor. India's air defense advancements are expected to result in a substantial rise in its defense exports. What especially unsettles Washington is India's drive for strategic autonomy-its determination to indigenize the defence ecosystem and reduce dependency on Western arms suppliers. India is no longer content with being a junior partner in a global alliance; it is now pursuing an independent, nationfirst policy. India has maintained that any trade deal should be mutually beneficial, thus signalling India's stance. In recent developments, Trump's imposition of a 100% tariff on Indian exports and his pressure on Apple to reconsider its investment in India reflect attempts to curb India's economic rise. Our external Minister has stated that any trade deal has to be mutually beneficial.

During Trump's second term, America has resumed supplying parts for Pakistan's F-16s and even offered to mediate the

Kashmir issue-something India firmly rejects. India's refusal to accept third-party mediation has once again demonstrated its diplomatic strength. India asserted that any bilateral talks with Pakistan should be related to terrorism and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. India also defied the West's economic sanctions against Russia and Iran, thus maintaining its independent diplomatic assertiveness. This was evident in India's bold decision to continue importing oil from Russia and Iran, despite Western sanctions. India, like America, is putting its national interest first. It abstained multiple times from voting on UN resolutions condemning Russia's aggression in Ukraine, signaling its desire to preserve a long-standing partnership with Moscow, a reliable supplier of defense equipment, unrefined oil, and diplomatic support. The narrative war has become just as important as conventional military strategy. A major section of Western and U.S. media has long been adopting a biased approach that attempts to pull down the image of India which is, the world's largest democracy, 5th largest economy and the fourth largest military power, But India has not remained silent. It has been unmasking these media biases, confronting them with facts, and promoting its version of events to global audiences. India has launched an international outreach following Operation Sindoor. The government has formed seven

to visit strategic regions across the globe. Their mission is to apprise foreign governments about India's firm stance on Pakistansponsored terrorism and the decision to pause the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT)-a symbolic and strategic move. India's outreach efforts are designed to counter Western and Pakistani narratives and build a global consensus around its security concerns. It is also in talks with the Taliban regime in Afghanistan to diplomatically isolate Pakistan, while simultaneously applying economic pressure on Turkey and Bangladesh for their indirect support of anti-India elements.

India's foreign policy has matured into a bold doctrine of assertive realism. It now follows a "tit for tat" approach-supplying arms and ammunition to enemies of its adversaries, aligning economic interests with political goals, and engaging with both East and West on its terms. Its recent free trade agreements with the European Union, the Middle East, Latin American, and African nations are part of a calculated effort to diversify alliances and reduce vulnerability to geopolitical coercion. Zero tolerance for terrorism is now India's new normal. It has made it clear that any provocation from Pakistan will be met with decisive retaliation. The government's readiness to strike backdiplomatically, economically, and militarily-marks a new era in India's global positioning. India's consistent GDP growth, robust space and technological advancements, and a dynamic young workforce position it as a power to reckon with. No longer content with the moral high ground alone, New Delhi now operates from a position of hard power and strategic clarity.

This decade belongs to India. A new India is rising-strong, selfreliant, and capable of navigating a complex global order with both economic and military strength. In the evolving world of diplomacy and defense, India is now poised to script its own story on its terms.

The main duty of the tattvikas, spiritual teachers, is to promote education that aims at collective welfare. High ideals have been preached many times in many countries, no doubt, but to what extent has it helped in establishing satya? Most preachers were adept in the art of preaching. There was no paucity of experienced hands in Prachara Vijnana still, after the expiry of momentary charms. When people



realised that they had not been served with what is satya, they tried to wipe out those preachers' names from history, with disregard and aversion. Teachers need to explain to people whatever is done, with reasons thereof. Also, make it clear to them what they want to do and why they want to do. The result of this highly helpful teaching is that inferiority complex disappears from people. They are encouraged when someone like them, so inspired with such a high ideal. The third outcome of this is that they will get rid of wrong notions that may have crept into them via propaganda made by persons with vested interests. Teachers need to win hearts with satya without abusing anyone. As a teacher, when a

person behaves with you badly or uses harsh words,

don't behave with him in like manner. You shall explain to him his duties gently. In case anyone has a wrong impression, show him the right path without abusing him. Make it clear to him if possible with practical demonstration how harmful may be the effect of such habits. In such cases your behaviour must be like that of a friend, and never like that of an instructor. Your only object will be to get your advice accepted by him. The idea that he is a fool and you are wise is not desirable to any party. Keep your focus on propagation of satya. While preaching, you will always keep this in view that the person whom you are preaching to has the ability to understand it in the way you are making it clear.

One year after in power, BJP on slow track in Bargarh

Bargarh,(Trilochan Sahu) With Odisha BJP gearing up to celebrate one year of governance in the State in a grand manner, the saffron party remains on the backfoot in local bodies across the district. Out of 12 panchayat samitis and five urban local bodies (ULBs) in Bargarh, the BJP is yet to significantly influence the politics. The regional outfit BJD's dominance continues unabated in council meetings and in policymaking of the local bodies. While the BJP Government's initiatives are being rolled out at the block level, a lack of engagement and dialogue with local representatives affects the implementation of the welfare schemes. Even though the BJP gained ground in Western Odisha, the BJD strongholds, in the 2024 elections, the saffron party leaders



have failed to capitalise on the

winning spirit and create booth-

level party workers to strengthen

the party base at the grassroots.

Lack of coordination between

MLAs and block presidents has

marred several developmental

programmes. Barring Bijepur, the

remaining 11 panchayat samitis

face a leadership crisis in

mobilising the decisions in favour

of the party. Recently, the Bijepur

block chairperson was ousted in a no-confidence vote. Local MLA Sanat Gartia has proved his leadership abilities in the block during the no-confidence motion. On May 29, all BJD PS members boycotted the Panchayat Samiti meeting, expressing concerns that the BJP government is diminishing the Panchayat Samiti's autonomy. The members voiced their desire for improved

communication governmental activities and emphasised the importance of considering their input in decision-making. But the BJD has shown confidence in Sohela and Bhatli blocks, where the regional outfit displays a more measured approach. Sources said the Sohela PS meeting faced challenges due to the absence of local MLA Irasis Acharya. Former minister and ex-MLA for Bhatli constituency Sushant Singh, who had a strong organisational presence, has stepped back from political engagements due to health issues. However, the BJP has failed to take advantage of strengthening its party base in the Bhatli, Ambabhona, and Sohella blocks. Sources added that there are indications that if Sushant's health improves, he may consider re-entering the political arena, potentially reshaping dynamics in the Bhatli constituency. Another senior political leader criticised the BJP government's move to increase MLA LAD funds from Rs 3 crore to Rs 5 crore. "It's the BJD that will benefit, not the BJP. With 51 MLAs and dominance in panchayats, the BJD stands to gain more. The government

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Former BJD MP Pinaki Misra (65) has tied the knot with Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra in a private ceremony abroad recently. A photo, reportedly, from the wedding surfaced showing Moitra and Misra hands while holding smiling."However, neither of the two MPs nor their parties have issued any official statement confirming or denying the development."The ceremony took place in Germany and remained undisclosed until now. Even senior leaders from both the Trinamool Congress and the BJD have claimed they were unaware of the event. sharp criticism of the ruling party. Her speeches in Parliament have regularly drawn attention for their directness and assertive tone. During her first term as MP, she was disqualified over "cashfor-query" allegations. "This is Mahua Moitra's second marriage. She was earlier married to Danish financier Lars Brorson.

Later, she was in a public relationship with lawyer Jai Anant Dehadrai, which ended in a legal dispute. During the controversy, which led to her suspension from Parliament in late 2023, Moitra described Dehadrai as a "jilted ex". "Pinaki Misra is a four-time Member of Parliament from Puri, Odisha. He began his parliamentary journey in 1996 by defeating former Union Minister Braja Kishore Tripathy. A Senior Advocate in the Supreme Court, Misra has served on multiple committees, including the Standing Committee on Finance and the Business Advisory Committee. His style of debate in Parliament is known for being calm and measured. In January 1984, Misra married Sangita Misra, but they later got divorced, and they had two children together.

Odisha to enforce Covid protocols in schools after vacation

Bhubaneswar ,(DMC): The Odisha government will enforce safety protocols in schools once they reopen after the summer break to protect students and staff amid a gradual uptick in Covid-19 cases. "All students and teachers have to adhere to COVID-19 safety measures when schools resume. Given the increasing cases, everyone must stay vigilant. Health and safety are our top priorities," School and Mass Education Minister NityanandaGond told reporters on Thursday. He further stated that students and teachers would be required to remain cautious. "Students with symptoms like a cold will be asked to wear masks at school, while those with more serious symptoms will be advised to stay home and isolate. We will strictly comply with all Health Department COVID-19 guidelines," he added. Meanwhile, the Covid-19 tally in Odisha for this season has



touched 23 with eight people testing positive for the virus over the last two days. Five new cases have been reported from twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack. "Four among the patients have recovered from the infection and the rest 19 are under treatment at home," Director of Public Health Dr. Nilakantha Mishra informed. The health official further stated that the situation is under control with no reason for alarm. "There has been no major surge in COVID infections in Odisha so far. We are monitoring the

sub-variants "is very low" and urged those with severe respiratory or flulike symptoms to seek medical advice for possible testing. "We're maintaining stringent verification protocols, confirming all positive cases through RTPCR testing," he added. According to an official statement, 546 samples were tested in the last one week. The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has advised people with serious diseases and comorbidities to remain cautious and follow basic

20 lakh ration cards set for cancellation

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare on Wednesday announced that nearly 20 lakh ration cardholders face removal from the beneficiary list for failing to complete the mandatory e-KYC verification. Speaking at a press conference, Patra emphasized that beneficiaries must finish the e-KYC process within June to continue receiving ration entitlements. "About 95% of existing beneficiaries have already completed e-KYC.

Those who fail to comply within the deadline will be deemed Minister Krushna Chandra Patra ineligible," he stated. Targeting previous BJD-led the administration the Minister alleged that no new ration cards had been issued in the past 13 years. He contrasted this with current BJP-led government's approach, which he said prioritizes accessibility and inclusiveness in welfare schemes. "Since coming to power, the government has received over 17 lakh new applications for ration cards.

Distribution of around 6 lakh ration cards is already underway, and approval has been granted for the issuance of another 15 lakh " Patra informed. He urged citizens to use Jana SevaKendras for e-KYC updates and new applications instead of visiting block offices, calling it a faster and more efficient method. The move is part of the government's broader push to streamline welfare delivery and ensure that only verified and deserving individuals receive subsidized

Similipal to become eco-sensitive zone: Minister

Bhubaneswar, (DMC): In a significant move to protect the biodiversity of Similipal, the Odisha government has decided to declare the area an eco-sensitive zone. Department not investigating the total river embankment properly. Detection of venerable points and repair works continued through out year but in a routine work. Tender process and repair work start at the approch of rainy season. Political people & Irrigation department jointly monitor the work in pen & paper. But at the time of high flood sand packet & wooden beams become main busyness. Out of 206 Km rier embankment of Kathjodi, Bilua khai & Devi river undr Jagatsinghpur Irrigation Divn and 121 Km embankment of Mohanadi and Paika under Mohanadi south divisor are always panic for district. Bengaluru Stampede; Overcrowding, free passes among causes for victory parade chaos: Police



Bengaluru, (HS): Confusion over the victory parade, free passes, overcrowding and limited seats at the Chinnaswamy Stadium are said to be some of the major reasons that led to stampede that left at least 11 people dead and over 30 injured. The initial chaos that later turned into a stampede began as several cricket enthusiasts who did not have entry tickets to the stadium tried to swarm into the premises along with those who had valid tickets, sources in the police said.

During the chaos, some people fell

on the ground, some got injured while trying to scale huge gates to gain entry into the stadium. Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said that 11 people died and 33 were injured following the stampede near the stadium. Most of the deceased were youths, including men and women, with several of them being students. Noting that the stadium has a capacity for 35,000 people, but 2-3 lakh people had come, he said, "The match happened last evening (Tuesday) and today this event was organised by the cricket

association, so no one had expected that so many people would come. The expectation was the equivalent number of people for the stadium's capacity or slightly more than that may gather."

Explaining what exactly led to the chaos and stampede, the chief minister said, "There are small gates. The people entered through the gates. They have broken the gates also, so a stampede has taken place. Nobody had expected so much of a crowd to come. Prima facie looks like that. I'm not saying nothing has happened. The



Tatkal Ticket Booking: New rule mandates e-Aadhar

policy shift, the Indian Railways will soon make e-Aadhaar authentication mandatory for booking Tatkal tickets on its IRCTC platform. As per reports, the move is expected to be rolled out later this month as part of a broader strategy to crack down on fraudulent bookings and ensure fair access for genuine passengers. A Gazette notification dated May 27, 2025, said, "The Ministry of Railways, Railway Board, hereby notifies that the Centre for Railway Information System (CRIS) be allowed to perform Aadhaar authentication, on a voluntary basis, to establish the identity of ticketchecking staff, crew members and passengers, using Yes/No or eKYC authentication facility." This move is soon expected to be mandatorily applied to all Tatkal ticket bookings.

Passengers booking tickets under the Tatkal quota will now be required to verify their identity using e-Aadhaar at the time of purchase. Only users with Aadhaar-linked IRCTC accounts will be allowed to book tickets in the critical



first 10 minutes of the booking window, effectively barring even authorised agents during that period. The Ministry also issued a press statement in which it said that currently, there are more than 130 million active subscribers on the IRCTC website, of which only 12 million are Aadhaar-verified. Notably, this change follows a massive clean-up operation by IRCTC, which deactivated over 2.5 crore suspicious user IDs found to be exploiting the booking system. An internal probe revealed that around 2.9 lakh questionable PNRs were generated within just five minutes of booking windows opening, most of them for general and Tatkal tickets.

Between January and May 2025, IRCTC flagged over 6,800 disposable email domains, placed 20 lakh more accounts under review, and filed 134 complaints with the National Cyber

Crime portal. Despite technical upgrades and increased transparency claims, passengers continue to raise concerns. While IRCTC reports that the attempt-to-booking ratio has improved, from 43.1% in October 2024 to 62.2% in May 2025, many feel that third-party platforms still gain an unfair advantage, and ordinary users remain at a disadvantage. The upcoming Aadhaarlinked booking system is the latest in a series of measures to rebuild trust and restore fairness in one of the world's busiest railway networks.

Delhi court extends custody of 2 accused of spying for Pakistan

New Delhi, (HS): A Delhi court on Thursday extended by seven days the police custody of two persons arrested for allegedly spying for Pakistan. Chief Judicial Magistrate ShriyaAgrawal extended the custody of Qasim and Haseen after they were produced before court on expiry of their custody granted earlier. The judge directed the police to produce the accused before the court on June 12.

He passed the order after police said that further custody was required to unearth an "espionage network" and probe the technical evidence and trail of transactions in their bank accounts. The Delhi Police counsel said the accused obtained phone numbers from India and sent it to Pakistan where it was being used for espionage. He said the accused clicked photos of sensitive locations, including Army camps, and received money in their bank accounts from Pakistan.

Indian MBBS Student Dies in Vietnam Accident

Hyderabad, (HS): A 21-year-old Indian student pursuing an MBBS course in Vietnam has died in a freak accident in Can Tho city. Arshid Ashrith was a third-year MBBS student. He is from Telangana's Kumuram Bheem Asifabad district, and his parents Arshid Arjun and Pratima are cloth merchants. Arshid was speeding on a bike yesterday when he lost control and the two-wheeler crashed into a wall. His friend, who was riding pillion, has suffered serious injuries. A CCTV camera captured the chilling visuals of the crash. The clip shows a calm neighbourhood. Then, a speeding bike crashes straight into a wall. The disturbing visuals show the

riders flung into the air, indicating how hard the impact was. Local media reported that MLA Dr P Harish Babu visited Ashrith's home and expressed condolences to his heartbroken parents. The MLA also spoke to Union Minister G Kishan Reddy over the phone and urged him to facilitate the repatriation of the body to India, reports have said.

Russian strike kills five, including one-year old in **Northern Ukraine**



KYIV, (HS): At least five people, including a one-year-old child, were killed in a Russian drone strike on the northern Ukrainian city of Pryluky overnight, regional governor Viacheslav Chaus said Thursday. The attack came just hours after Donald Trump spoke with Russian President Vladimir Putin. According to Trump, Putin "very strongly" said that Russia will retaliate for Ukraine's weekend drone attacks on Russian military airfields. Six more people were wounded in the attack and have been hospitalized, Chaus said. According to him, six Shahed-type drones struck residential areas of Pryluky early Thursday morning, causing severe damage to residential buildings. Hours later, seventeen people were wounded in a Russian drone strike on the eastern Ukrainian city of Kharkiv early Thursday, including children, a pregnant woman, and a 93-year-old woman, regional head Oleh Syniehubov wrote on Telegram. At around 1:05 a.m., Shahed-type drones struck two apartment buildings in the city's Slobidskyi district, causing fires and destroying several private vehicles."By launching attacks while people sleep in their homes, the enemy once again confirms its tactic of insidious terror," Syniehubov wrote on Telegram. According to a video published by the Russian Federal Security Service on the same day, a detained suspect of the Crimean city admitted that he had made a bomb to commit a terrorist attack on orders from Kyiv. The blast caused damage to the bridge's underwater support pillars.

Indian Students Pause American Dream Amid Visa Troubles

United Kingdom, (HS): Distressed students, panicked parents have been calling Subash Devatwal, who runs an education consultancy in Ahmedabad. They all have one question - whether studying in the US is still possible. Last year there were 330,000 Indians enrolled at American universities, more than any other nationality, even surpassing Chinese students for the first time in years. Families in India invest their entire life savings to get their children enrolled in US universities, as for most, it is the ultimate symbol of success.

However, now that Trump's administration has targeted international students, the numbers have weakened. Devatwal's organisation used to send more than 100 students in previous vears, but it has now dropped to about 10. The Trump administration has implemented social media vetting, for all foreign students, and then paused all student visa interviews globally, which has left many students in a state of uncertainty. "The students are in shock.



Most of them spend several years preparing to study in the US," Devatwal told The Guardian. He added that now his clients are unsure if they should pursue a US degree because of the turmoil associated with the Trump administration. Indian students can expect to pay between \$40,000 to \$80,000 (£29,500 to £59,000) a year on tuition alone to study in the US.He said that now students are looking at the UK and other European countries. Brijesh Patel, a textile trader in Surat said that he had saved up money for a decade. sold his wife's jewellery and borrowed money from relatives, just to make sure his son could go to a US university. He said, "We simply can't take that risk. If our son goes now and something goes wrong, we won't be able to save that

Patel had already paid 700,000 rupees (£6,000) to consultancies who helped with the applications. He said that they will wait a year, and hope that things improve by then. "It's not just my son who will be living the American dream, it's all of us: my wife, our relatives and our neighbours. I've struggled my whole life - I don't want my son to face the same struggles here in India", he added. Piyush Bhartiya, a co-founder of the educational technology company AdmitKard, said that many parents were rethinking if the US should be the study destination for their children. He said that a student had been admitted to New York University for the coming year but was planning to go to London School of Economics when US visa interviews were paused. He stated that the US was the main destination for students to study Stem subjects - science, technology, engineering and maths, however, now

Edmund White, groundbreaking gay author, dies at 85



NEW YORK, (HS): Edmund White, the groundbreaking man of letters who documented and imagined the gay revolution through journalism, essays, plays and such novels as "A Boy's Own Story" and "The Beautiful Room is Empty," has died. He was 85.

White's death was confirmed Wednesday by his agent, Bill Clegg, who did not immediately provide additional details. Along with Larry Kramer, Armistead Maupin and others, White was among a generation of gay writers who in the 1970s became bards for a community no longer afraid to declare its existence. He was present at the Stonewall raids of 1969, when arrests at a club in Greenwich Village led to the birth of the modern gay movement, and for decades was a participant and observer through the tragedy of AIDS, the advance of gay rights and culture and the backlash of recent years. A resident of New York and Paris for much of his adult life, he was a novelist, journalist, biographer, playwright, activist, teacher and memoirist. "A Boy's Own Story" was a bestseller and classic coming-of-age novel that demonstrated gay literature's commercial appeal. He wrote a prizewinning biography of playwright Jean Genet and books on Marcel Proust and Arthur Rimbaud. He was a professor of creative writing at Princeton University, where colleagues included Toni Morrison and his close friend,

Trump Signs Proclamation Banning Travel from 12 Nations

Washington, (HS): US President Donald Trump has signed a proclamation imposing a travel ban on 12 countries and restricting the entry of seven others to the US, citing national security concerns. According to the proclamation, the 12 countries that were banned include Afghanistan, Burma, Chad, Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, and Yemen. Additionally, the order partially restricts and limits the entry of nationals of the following seven countries - Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo, Turkmenistan, and Venezuela

The announcement of the ban followed a recent violent terror attack in Boulder, Colorado, on participants of a peaceful rally calling for the safe return of Israeli hostages from Hamas captivity. "The recent terror attack in



Boulder, Colorado, has underscored the extreme dangers posed to our country by the entry of foreign nationals who are not properly vetted, as well as those who come here as temporary visitors and overstay their visas. We

don't want them," Trump said in a video statement released by the White House on Wednesday night. Meanwhile, US Homeland Security officials said that the terror attack perpetrator Colorado, Mohammed Sabry Solima, was allowed entry into the country under the former Administration and

overstayed his visa. The White House Deputy Press Secretary Abigail Jackson took to social media stating that President Trump is protecting Americans from foreign actors who pose security threats to the country.

"President Trump is fulfilling his promise to protect Americans from dangerous foreign actors that want to come to our country and cause us These commonsense restrictions are country-specific and include places that lack proper vetting, exhibit high visa overstay rates, or fail to share identity and threat information. President Trump will always act in the best of interest of the American people and their safety," Abigail Jackson said on X. The recent proclamation echoed a series of travel bans issued during the first term of Trump's administration to seven majority-Muslim nations from coming to the US. It included Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, and Yemen. The move witnessed legal challenges before President Joe Biden repealed it after he assumed office in 2021.

China's Xi held phone call with Trump: Xinhua news agency



BEIJING, (HS): Chinese leader Xi Jinping held a phone call with US President Donald Trump on Thursday, state media reported, as the world's top two economies clash over trade. The call follows officials in Beijing and Washington accusing each other of jeopardising a trade war truce agreed last month in Geneva.

It took place at Trump's request, the Xinhua news agency said without elaborating, and came after the US president appeared to dampen hopes for a quick resolution to their trade battle. "I like President XI of China, always have, and always will, but he is VERY TOUGH, AND EXTREMELY HARD TO MAKE A DEAL WITH!!!" he posted

Wednesday on his Truth Social platform. The White House did not immediately comment on the reported phone call, but had earlier suggested Trump would speak to Xi. Until Thursday, the two leaders had not had any confirmed contact more than five months since the Republican returned to power, despite frequent claims by the US president that such a call was imminent.

Trump said in a Time Magazine interview in April that Xi had called him -- but Beijing insisted that there had been no call recently. Although Beijing and Washington agreed in Geneva to slash staggeringly high tariffs on each other's goods for 90 days, the two sides have since traded blame for derailing the deal. Trump argued Friday that China had "totally violated" the agreement, without providing further details. China's commerce ministry hit back this week, saying the Trump administration had since introduced "discriminatory restrictive measures", including revoking Chinese student visas in the United States. Washington has targeted Chinese nationals who entered the United States both legally and illegally, with the president vowing to aggressively revoke Chinese student visas. The US leader introduced in April sweeping worldwide tariffs that targeted China most heavily of all, accusing other countries of "ripping off" the United States and running trade imbalances.

South Korea: PPP Floor Leader Announces Resignation after Election Defeat

Seoul, (HS): The floor leader of the South Korean People Power Party (PPP) announced his resignation on Thursday, as the conservative party is reeling from a defeat in the presidential election earlier this week. Rep. Kweon Seong-dong told a meeting of party lawmakers at the National Assembly that he is resigning to take responsibility for PPP presidential candidate Kim Moon-soo's defeat in Tuesday's election.

"We must start from scratch to said. "I will start by stepping down as floor leader." He stressed that the election defeat is "not merely a referendum on the martial law imposition or the impeachment of the president" but a "stern reprimand" over the internal divisions within the PPP. "As floor leader, I carry a significant share of the blame," he said. "I have no intention of avoiding it or making

Later in the day, members of the PPP's emergency leadership committee also offered to resign en masse. The PPP's floor spokesperson, Rep. Seo Ji-young, announced the decision, saying members such as Rep. Lim Yi-ja and Kim Sang-hoon, the PPP's top policy chief, tendered their resignations at a general meeting of lawmakers at the National Assembly. Kim Yong-tae, the PPP's interim leader, however, did not clarify whether he intends to resign. The PPP plans to hold a general meeting next Monday to discuss Kim Yong-tae's status and broader plans for party reform, Yonhap news agency reported. President Lee Jaemyung took office on Wednesday after he won the election on Tuesday with 49.42 per cent of the vote against Kim's 41.15 per cent.

Sindh's Unrest over **Indus Canal Project Turns Violent**

Islamabad/New Delhi, (HS): Despite Pakistan achieving a tenuous peace with India following military escalations along the border after the deadly Pahalgam massacre, the regime simultaneously faces multiple internal challenges. The escalation of activities by insurgent groups such as Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) in the provinces of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan has already undermined the military establishment's popularity, legitimacy, and morale. Meanwhile, popular protests in Sindh, ongoing for several months in opposition to the federal government's proposed Indus canals project, have escalated into violence. Rather than addressing the grievances politically, the regime opted for a harsh crackdown, resulting in the deaths of two activists, which further incited protestors to set fire to the residence of Sindh's Interior Minister, Ziaul Hassan Lanjar. The province of Sindh has long been a simmering cauldron of discontent, spanning several decades. It has consistently voiced grievances over federal discrimination and political marginalisation, which have benefited the politically and economically dominant Punjab. Central

to the inter-provincial conflict between

Sindh and Punjab is the issue of water,

particularly the Indus River.

UNITED STATE, (HS): Members of the World Health Organization

adopted the world's first pandemic agreement, following three years of "intensive negotiations launched by governments in response to the devastating impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic." The U.S., however, did not participate, in part because of its intention to withdraw from the WHO. Global health experts are hailing the agreement as a historic moment. What does the agreement mean for

the world, and how can it make everyone safer and more prepared for the next pandemic? The Conversation asked Nicole Hassoun, a professor at Binghamton University and executive director of Global Health Impact, to explain the pandemic accord, its prospects for advancing global health, and the significance of the U.S.'s absence from it. The accord will bolster pandemic preparation within individual countries and around the world. Countries signing onto the agreement are committing to improve their disease surveillance and grow their heath care workforces, strengthen their regulatory systems and invest in research and development. It encourages countries to strengthen their health regulations and infrastructure, improve communication with the public about pandemics and increase funding for preparation and response efforts. It also includes new mechanisms for



producing and distributing vaccines and other essential countermeasures. Finally, it encourages countries to coordinate their responses and share information about infectious diseases and intellectual property so that vaccines and other essential countermeasures can be made available more quickly.

The agreement will take effect once enough countries ratify it, which may take several years. The Biden administration was broadly supportive of a pandemic agreement and was an active participant in negotiations. Prior to Donald Trump's reelection, however, Republican governors had signed a letter opposing the treaty, echoing a conservative think tank's concerns about U.S. sovereignty. The U.S. withdrew from negotiations when President Trump signed an executive order to withdraw from the WHO on the day he was inaugurated for his second term. Why could the lack of US involvement be beneficial for the world? The lack of U.S. involvement likely resulted in a much more equitable treaty, and it is not clear that countries could have reached an agreement had the U.S. continued to object to key provisions. It was only once the U.S. withdrew from the negotiations that an agreement was reached. The U.S. and several other wealthy countries were concerned with protecting their pharmaceutical industry's profits and resisted efforts aimed at convincing pharmaceutical companies to share the knowledge, data and intellectual property needed for producing new vaccines and other essential countermeasures.

Other negotiators sought greater access to vaccines and other treatments during a pandemic for poorer countries. which often rely on patented technologies from global pharmaceutical companies. While most people in wealthy countries had access to COVID-19 vaccines as early as 2021, many people in developing countries had to wait years for vaccines. One of the contentious issues in the pandemic agreement has to do with how many vaccines manufacturers in each country must share in exchange for access to genetic sequences to emerging infectious diseases. Countries are still negotiating a system for sharing the genetic information on pathogens in return for access to vaccines themselves. It is important that researchers can get these sequences to make vaccines. And, of course, people need access to the vaccines once they are developed. Still, there are many more promising aspects of the agreement for which no further negotiations are necessary. For instance, the agreement will increase global vaccine supply by increasing manufacturing around the world. The agreement also specifies that countries and the WHO should work together to create a mechanism for fairly sharing the intellectual property, data and knowledge needed to produce vaccines

and other essential health products. If financing for new innovation requires equitable access to the new technologies that are developed, many people in poor countries may get access to vaccines much more quickly in the next pandemic. The agreement also encourages individual countries to offer sufficient incentives for pharmaceutical companies to extend access to developing countries. If countries implement these changes, that will benefit people in rich countries as well as poor ones. A more equitable distribution of vaccines can contain the spread of disease, saving millions of lives. In my view, the best way to protect public health moving forward is for countries to sign on to the agreement and devote more resources to global health initiatives. This is particularly important given declining investment and participation in the WHO and the contraction of other international health initiatives, such as USAID

Without international coordination, it will become harder to catch and address problems early enough to prevent epidemics from becoming pandemics. It will also be imperative for member countries to provide funding to support the agreement's goals and secure the innovation and access to new technologies. This requires building the basic health infrastructure to ensure shots can get into people's arms.

India, Kyrgyzstan Ratify Bilateral Investment Treaty



New Delhi, (HS): Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and the Kyrgyz Republic's Minister of Foreign Zheenbek Affairs Kulubaev Moldokanovich signed the protocol and exchanged the instrument of ratification of the India-Kyrgyzstan Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT) here on Thursday. The Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT) signed on June 14, 2019, in Bishkek, between the Government of India and the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic, enters into force with effect from 5th June 2025. This new BIT replaces the earlier agreement enforced on 12th May 2000, ensuring continuity in the protection of investments between the two nations, according to an official statement.

The India-Kyrgyz BIT marks a significant milestone in strengthening bilateral economic relations and fostering a secure and predictable investment environment. The BIT aims to promote and protect the interests of investors of either country in the territory of the other country. The key features of the treaty include an enterprise-based definition of assets with an indicative inclusion list and a specific exclusion list of assets which also clarifies the characteristics of

Bajaj Finserv promoters to sell 1.58% stake in 4,750 crore block deal

New Delhi, (HS): Bajaj Holdings & Investment and Jamnalal Sons, promoters of Bajaj Finsery, plan to sell 1.58 per cent of their stake in the nonbanking financial company (NBFC) via a block deal worth 4,750 crore, Moneycontrol reported on Thursday, citing sources. The transaction involves offloading 25.3 million shares in the secondary market at a floor price of 1,880 per share-a 3.3 per cent discount to Bajaj Finserv's Thursday closing price of 1,943.5, according to a term sheet. "The block deal for the sale of the part stake of the promoters has been launched. There is also an upsize option of around 1,080 crore, which if exercised will take the combined block deal size to around 5,830 crore," a source told Moneycontrol. The move follows Bajaj Finserv's March 2025 announcement that it had signed share purchase agreements (SPAs) with Allianz SE to acquire a 26 per cent stake in its two insurance joint ventures-Bajaj Allianz General Insurance Company (BAGIC) and Bajaj Allianz Life Insurance Company (BALIC)-for 24,180 crore. For the quarter ending March 2025, Bajaj Finserv reported a 14 per cent rise in consolidated net profit, reaching 2,417 crore, up from 2,119 crore in the same quarter last fiscal. Total consolidated income for the quarter increased to 35,596 crore, compared to 32,042 crore during the corresponding period.

High-Level US Team Arrives in Delhi for Talks on Bilateral Trade Pact

Piyush Goyal Meets Top Italian CEOs, Highlights 'India Opportunity'



New Delhi, (HS): Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Wednesday met several Italian CEOs and discussed how best they can leverage India's innovation ecosystem for sustained growth.

Goyal commenced his two-day official visit to Italy after completing his engagements in France focused on strengthening India-France economic cooperation. "Met Michele Poggipolini, CEO of Poggipolini S.p.A., an engineering and manufacturing tech company. Engaged in productive discussions on technology, innovation, and manufacturing opportunities for the company in India, given the country's growing role in global supply chains," the Union Minister posted on X. He also met Daniele Forni, General Director, SOL Group, an Italian multinational leader in the area of production, applied research, and marketing of technical and medical gases, and discussed how the group can further expand its presence in India across key sectors. "Good to meet Tomaso Carraro, Vice Chairman of the Carraro Group, a global manufacturer of axles & transmission systems with a strong presence in India. Discussed Carraro India's ongoing progress and future investment plans. Also, exchanged views on strengthening their manufacturing base and leveraging India's innovation ecosystem for sustained growth," Goyal further posted.

New Delhi, (HS): A high-level US trade delegation has arrived in the national capital to move ahead on the negotiations for a Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) with India. The negotiators are aiming to finalise an interim trade deal ahead of the July 9

deadline that has been fixed by US President Donald Trump for the 90-day pause on new tariffs that were to be levied on Indian products. Negotiations are expected to continue after that for a broader trade deal to be signed in September-October.

The visit of the US team comes against the backdrop of Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal's recent trip to Washington for the trade talks. India has proposed significant tariff reductions, potentially lowering average duties from 13 per cent to 4 per cent, in exchange for exemptions from US tariff hikes imposed during the Trump administration. These concessions are on the same lines as those offered in the recent bilateral free trade agreement that India has signed with the United Kingdom. India is seeking market access for its industrial products such as steel, aluminium, auto components and pharmaceutical goods. Recently, the US doubled safeguard duties on steel and aluminium imports to 50 per cent, which has adversely impacted India's exports. Although India has moved the WTO on the issue, it is hoping to settle the issue through the bilateral trade agreement. The US is also seeking broader market access for its agricultural and dairy products, but for India, the livelihood issue of the country's small farmers is paramount, and hence,

this is considered a sensitive area.

India may allow the import of select agricultural products, such as almonds, as these are already flowing into the country. However, as a quid pro quo, India is likely to press for improved access to the US market for seafood products like shrimp and fish, as well as spices, coffee, and rubber - segments where Indian exporters are globally competitive but face tariff competition in the American market. Trade between India and the US touched the \$129 billion mark in 2024, with New Delhi recording a trade surplus of \$45.7 billion. In February, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Trump launched 'Mission 500', an initiative aiming to double bilateral trade to \$500 billion by 2030. The joint decision was announced during PM Modi's visit to Washington. US Secretary of Commerce Howard Lutnick also announced this week that a trade deal between India and the United States is likely to be finalised shortly. He made the assertion in his address at the US-India Strategic Partnership Forum Annual Leadership Summit in Washington.

34% growth in eco-friendly coal transport



NEW DELHI, (HS): State-owned Coal India Limited (CIL) recorded a 34% year-on-year growth in environmentally friendly coal transportation in FY 2025, moving 102.5 million tonnes (MT) through 20 First Mile Connectivity (FMC) projects linked to the Indian Railways network. In comparison, 76.5 MT was transported in FY 2024 through 17 such projects. In the current financial year, up to the end of May, CIL registered a 36.7% increase in coal dispatch via FMC projects, compared to 15 MT during the same period last year. CIL, India's largest coal miner, also plans to commission 19 additional FMC projects with a combined capacity of nearly 150 million tonnes per year (MT/Y) during FY 2026. FMC is an automated coal evacuation system that enables

environment-friendly coal transportation from the pithead to loading points using piped conveyor belts.

"We expect to transport an additional 20 million tonnes through FMC projects in the ongoing financial year," said a senior CIL official. The increased use of FMC systems has led to a 5% reduction in underloading charges in FY25 compared to FY24. Another benefit has been improved grade conformity, as higher-quality coal is being transported more efficiently and with reduced contamination through mechanized systems. Coal India also announced plans to commission 92 FMC projects with a combined capacity of 994 million tonnes per year (MT/Y) by the end of FY29. With a target of producing 1 billion tonnes of coal annually by FY29, the company is scaling up its infrastructure to enable nearly all of this to be transported in an environmentally sustainable manner. Coal India accounts for over 80% of the country's total coal production."FMC projects are a win-win for CIL, its customers and the railways," the official added.

FMC infrastructure includes mechanized coal handling plants with coal crushers to size the coal and rapid loading systems that ensure precise quantities of quality coal are loaded into railway wagons-avoiding overloading or underloading. FMC replaces traditional truck-based transportation to railway sidings and eliminates manual loading by pay loaders. This transition reduces dust, noise, and vehicular emissions, eases road congestion, enhances safety, and improves wagon turnaround time.

Walmart's Flipkart secures RBI approval for direct lending in India

New Delhi, (HS): Walmart's Flipkart has secured a lending licence from the Indian central bank and banking regulator, enabling it to offer loans directly to customers and sellers on its platform, according to documents reviewed by Reuters and a source. This is the first time the Reserve Bank of India has granted a large e-commerce

player in India a non-bank finance company (NBFC) licence, allowing it to lend but not take deposits. Most ecommerce platforms currently offer loans in tie-ups with banks and NBFCs, but a lending licence will enable Flipkart - India's largest e-commerce firm - to lend directly, a more lucrative model for the group. The central bank issued its



certificate of registration - a document that officially recognises a company as an NBFC - to Flipkart Finance Private Limited on March 13. Reuters has reviewed a copy of both the certificate of registration and the approval letter also dated March 13. The approval has not been previously reported.

Flipkart, in which US retail

behemoth Walmart holds a more than 80 per cent stake, applied for the licence in 2022, according to the central bank's approval letter. Neither Flipkart nor the Reserve Bank of India immediately responded to Reuters' request for comments. The e-commerce giant may commence its lending operation "in a few months", according to a source aware of the matter who declined to be identified as the talks are private. A final decision on the launch will be subject to the completion of various internal processes such as the appointment of key management personnel and board members and the finalisation of business plans, the source said. Flipkart plans to lend directly to its customers on its popular e-commerce platform and through its fintech app super.money, the source said. It may also offer financing

to sellers on the platform, they added. At present, the e-commerce giant offers personal loans to customers through tie-ups with lenders such as Axis Bank, IDFC Bank and Credit Saison. Flipkart, last valued at \$37 billion in 2024 when it raised \$1 billion in a funding round led by Walmart, is shifting its holding company from Singapore to India. Walmart also aims to take the 17-year-old company public. Walmart bought a controlling stake in Flipkart in 2018, which also gave it ownership of PhonePe, a fintech firm also preparing for an IPO. Earlier this year Flipkart's rival Amazon acquired a Bengalurubased non-bank lender Axio, but the deal is yet to be cleared by the central bank.

Vedanta shares close higher on positive debt reduction and renewable energy targets

CHENNAI, (HS): Shares of mining major Vedanta Limited closed higher after an initial dip in early trading. The stock gained attention following two key developments: reports that the company plans to utilise Rs 5,000 crore raised through unsecured non-convertible debentures (NCDs) to retire high-cost debt, and its announcement that its renewable energy capacity has reached 1.03 GW. The shares closed at Rs 440.10 a unit, up 0.74% on Thursday. Vedanta said today that its renewable energy capacity is progressing steadily toward its goal of achieving 2.5 GW of green energy by 2030. This milestone was achieved by scaling up its round-theclock renewable power capacity through power supply agreements.

Meanwhile media reports on Thursday said that Vedanta will save an estimated Rs 350 crore in interest outgo quoting sources once the high cost debts are retired. Vedanta will also use a part of the proceeds to fund its growth capex, said various reports. The company had



last week said that the committee of directors has approved raising up to Rs 5,000 crore via issuance of debentures. News agency reported on Thursday that

the mining major plans to deploy funds from the Rs 5,000 crore raised through its unsecured NCD issue to pay down a highcost private credit facility of Rs 3,400 crore, potentially reducing its annual interest burden by at least Rs 350 crore, quoting sources. The remaining funds will likely be used for ongoing capex requirements, general corporate purposes, and repayment or prepayment of existing debts, sources added. The company's NCD offering, which closed on Wednesday, was oversubscribed with bids worth Rs 6,555 crore, indicating a 60 per cent oversubscription over its base issue size of Rs 4,100 crore. This prompted the company to exercise its greenshoe option of Rs 900 crore, raising a total of Rs 5,000 crore. The issuance attracted heavy demand from all categories of investors, including mutual funds, insurance companies, infrastructure finance companies, corporates, NBFCs.Among the key investors who were ICICI Prudential MF, Aditya Birla Sun Life MF, Kotak Mahindra MF, HSBC MF, Axis MF, Star Health Insurance, Reliance Insurance, Aseem Infrastructure Finance, Alpha Alternatives and Larsen and Toubro among others,

sources said, adding that the unsecured NCDs have a coupon rate of 9.31 per cent for the 2.5 years series, 9.45 per cent for the 3 year series and 8.95 per cent for the 2 year series.

This is the second unsecured NCD issuance by the company in 2025. In February, the company raised Rs 2,600 crore via unsecured non-convertible debentures at a 9.40-9.50 per cent coupon rate, attracting institutional investors, including ICICI Prudential, Kotak, Nippon, Aditya Birla Sun Life, and Axis. The company's net debt stood at Rs 53,251 crore as on March 31, 2025. Vedanta Group one of the world's leading natural resources, critical minerals, energy and technology companies spanning across India, South Africa, Namibia, Liberia, UAE, Saudi Arabia, Korea, Taiwan and Japan with significant operations in oil and gas, zinc, lead, silver, copper, iron ore, steel, nickel, aluminium, power and glass substrate and foraying into electronics and display glass manufacturing.


Gambhir Slams RCB's IPL Title Celebration Road Show

New Delhi, (HS): Gautam Gambhir, Indian cricket team head coach, has said that Royal Challengers Bengaluru's IPL 2025 title celebration victory parade should never have taken place. He added that such events must take place in a closed-door environment. Royal Challengers Bengaluru's joy of winning a first IPL title in 18 years turned tragic as 11 people lost their lives in stampede at a planned victory parade on Wednesday. The RCB team members, including Virat Kohli and Rajat Patidar, were felicitated at the Vidhan Soudha by Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah at around 5 PM IST after which there was a planned open bus parade. Lakhs of people gathered around the area where it was supposed to take place. It turned tragic as 11 died and close to 50 people got injured in the event.

"I was never a believer that we need to have roadshows. Never. When I was playing, I had the same statement, even after winning the 2007 T20 World Cup that we should not have road shows. The lives of people are far more important and I will continue to say that. In future we can be little bit aware about

Earlier, BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia talked and admitted 'some lapses' were there

on the part of the organisers. "I am not in a fault finding mission at this moment without knowing the complete fact. Whenever these kinds of events are being organised, if you take the example of how BCCI organised such victory celebration after India won the T20 World Cup in West Indies last year, there was a thorough planning with local cricket association - that is the Mumbai Cricket Association - as well as the Mumbai authorities, which includes the police, the fire brigade, the disaster management authorities. When planning that magnitude of celebration in Mumbai, when there was a sea of humanity, where so many people gathered, everything happened smoothly. Not a single untoward incident occurred because all the protocols were duly followed," Saikia told. "That kind of planning takes time. It cannot be done in a hastily manner. I think some lapses definitely took place. I am sure the authorities having this responsibility in Bengaluru, they will do some soul searching to find out. Definitely, nobody should be allowed to go scot-free for any lapses on their part."

England announces 14-member squad for series opener against India

New Delhi, (HS): The England Men's selection panel has announced a 14-player squad for the first Test match against India at Headingley, which begins on Friday, 20 June 2025, according to the ECB website. The series will take place from June to August 2025, with matches at Headingley (Leeds), Edgbaston (Birmingham), Lord's (London), Old Trafford (Manchester), and The Oval (London). This will be India's first bilateral series since both Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli announced their retirement from Test cricket earlier this month.

Jamie Overton has been handed a surprise recall to England's squad for the first Test against India after his Surrey team-mate Gus Atkinson was ruled out with a hamstring strain injury. Jacob Bethell has returned to the squad, while Chris Woakes and Brydon Carse are both back after missing England's win over Zimbabwe with niggles. England's squad has changed significantly since their 4-1 series defeat in India last year. James Anderson retired shortly after that tour, while Jonny Bairstow, Ben Foakes and Ollie Robinson have also been discarded. India have also undergone a transition, with R Ashwin, Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma all retiring and Shubman Gill taking on the captaincy for the first time. India, who have not won a Test series in England since 2007, have sent several members of their squad ahead to play for India A against the



Lions, and the rest of their touring party will arrive in the UK on Friday. Prior to the series, there will also be three India 'A' matches against the England Lions. The first unofficial test ended in a draw. The second unofficial test will be played on Friday, June 6, at County Ground, Northampton.
